ITEM 1: District Engineer Report—Jim Windsor

Jim reported there are currently 21 projects under contract. There are 4 local project agencies (LPA) projects, 3 state-funded projects, and 14 federally-funded projects. The 21 projects amount to \$480 million under contract of which \$263 million has been earned to date. Then he gave a brief overview of some of the major projects that are in the East Valley and the West Valley and finished up with the projects that are on the horizon for the Phoenix Construction District.

 The project is 40% complete with 46% of the time used.

ITEM 2: Director's Report—Floyd Roehrich, Jr.

Floyd advised the Board there was not a Director's Report at this time.

*ITEM 3: Consent Agenda

A motion to approve Item 2: Consent Agenda items as presented was made by Steve Christy and seconded by Joe La Rue. In a voice vote, the motion carries.

ITEM 4: Legislative Report—Kevin Biesty

Kevin updated the Board about a Federal issue that impacts the State. In September, the agency was made aware of a provision in MAP-21 by a letter from the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration (NHTSA) whereby they reviewed each state's DUI laws and ignition interlock laws for compliance with federal requirements dealing with repeat DUI offenders. NHTSA found and determined that the DUI laws in Arizona, and some other states, that Arizona was out of compliance with their ignition interlock and DUI-related laws. There is a 2.5% penalty shift provision (\$15.1 million) of Section 164 that will also apply to FY2014 and future years unless legislation is approved that eliminates the employer interlock waiver provision and CAMP.

This federal law requires that each state's repeat DUI offender law either suspend the offender's driver license for at least one year or require the offender to install an interlock in the offender's vehicle for at least one year. Arizona statutes include these requirements but allow for two exceptions in the use of an interlock. NHTSA's preliminary determination of Arizona's noncompliance with Section 164 is due to two provisions in Arizona Revised Statutes (A.R.S.), Title 28. NHTSA's, states must divert an amount equal to 2.5% of specific construction funds to be used for highway safety programs, including DUI programs. For Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2013, the penalty shift for Arizona is \$15,098.988. ADOT and the Governor's Office of Highway Safety (GOHS) have notified NHTSA and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) that \$7.5 million or 50% of the penalty shift will go to GOHS in FFY 2013 for DUI enforcement programs and the remaining 50% will be utilized by ADOT for roadway safety improvements.

The agency has three bills it is pursuing in this session.

1) The Watercraft Survey bill: Back in 1982 and again every three years thereafter, ADOT has conducted a survey of watercraft fuel use to calculate the percentage of motor vehicle fuel taxes due to the State Lake Improvement Fund (SLIF). In the last 14 years, the amount due to the SLIF has averaged 1.6%. The last survey commissioned in June 2012 cost \$171,000. We are asking to discontinue the watercraft fuel use survey and set a fixed percentage of motor vehicle fuel tax to be distributed to the SLIF. 2) Business Relocation Assistance bill: We are asking the Legislature to raise the State's maximum limit from\$10,000 to \$25,000 in relocation assistance for a small business, nonprofit organization, or farm operation to reestablish it at a new site. That is a result from some changes in MAP-21 and this assistance will help ADOT work with businesses that are impacted from its projects and keep ADOT out of condemnation hearings. It will lead to efficiencies, save on administrative costs, and advance project completion. 3) Refinancing Transportation Bonds: We are asking the Legislature to modify a provision that will make is easier for the Board to refinance bonds when the market allows.

Kevin will keep the Board apprised of the legislative bills and updates.

ITEM 5: Financial Report—Lisa Danka

Lisa reported that HURF collections amounted to \$591.8 million, even with the same period last year but 1.5 percent below the estimate. All HURF major revenue categories posed year-over-year growth through December. The Other revenue category in December posted an increase of 15.5 percent over last year with the strength centered in title fees, driver licenses, special plates, and miscellaneous collections.

RARF collections for the first half of FY2013 amounted to \$163.7 million, an increase of 4.9 percent over the same period last year but 0.6 percent below the forecast. December 2012 RARF revenues totaled \$27.5 million, an increase of 5.6 percent above December 2011 but 0.5 percent below the forecast. Through December, all RARF revenue categories posted year-over-year revenue growth.

The Aviation fund forecast performance summary aviation fund collections through December 2012 totaled \$6.8 million, a decrease of 23.9 percent from the same period last year, and 3.5 percent below the estimate. The second quarter of FY2013 amounted to \$4.5 million, a decrease of 37.4 percent from the same quarter in FY2012 and 24.1 percent below the estimate. The lower collections from the Flight Property Tax, which were a result of lower aircraft property tax assessments and aircraft registration revenue categories, were attributable to lower collections from audits and enforcement of aircraft license taxes and registration fees.

ITEM 6: Financing Program—Lisa Danka

Lisa mentioned there is a copy in the board packet of an article from The Bond Buyer dated Tuesday, January 15, 2013. The article stated, the 2013A bond proceeds will provide about \$230 million to fund various highway projects for ADOT's five-year capital program, while the rest of the combined tax-exempt Series 2013A and taxable Series 2013B bonds will refund a portion of senior-lien and subordinate-lien debt into new subordinate-lien bonds. Kristine will report more to the board at a later date.

ITEM 7: Multimodal Planning Division Report—Jennifer Toth

Jennifer stated she would be presenting the planning and programming report in Scott's absence. Jennifer started with the Aviation Report and said there is a copy of The Economic Impacts of Aviation in Arizona brochure at each board member's seat, which was released this week. The summary expands on the last study from 2002 by including all aspects of aviation and aerospace activity in Arizona; not just those occurring on an airport. Highlights are more than 185,000 people are directly employed in the aviation industry generating nearly \$32 billion in economic activity in Arizona. The indirect employment and economic activity is estimated at \$58 billion. The aviation component is a strong piece of the Arizona economy.

The Passenger Rail Study had a public comment period that occurred last fall to seek input on the idea of a passenger rail and presented 7 potential alternatives to provide a system between Tucson and the Phoenix area. The comment period ended on December 15, 2012. The team received approximately 3600 completed surveys and more than seven hundred comments. The study team was very pleased with the amount of the participation in the public comment period. This spring, the study team will be analyzing those comments and comparing the alternatives that will help with the decision to narrow them down to two or three for further study. The rail study is expected to be completed in late 2013.

The Arizona and Nevada DOTs are working together on the two-year I-11 and Intermountain West Corridor Study. In January and February, the study will be hosting several focus groups to garner insights from technical experts and interested professionals on the purpose and need for a high capacity corridor within the intermountain West. Each focus group will be held simultaneously in three locations in Nevada, Arizona, and also online. The first focus group meeting was held on January 8th in Phoenix, Las Vegas, and Carson City, which concentrated on energy and utilities; and the other topics are economic development, freight users, environment and sustainability, land use and community development, corridor operations and alternative delivery and financing. Those meetings will be taking place throughout January and February.
