







#### **Unemployment Rate**




**Monthly Passenger Traffic: January 1999 – July 2020**





### **Highway User Revenue Fund: FY2020 Forecast vs Actual**








### Highway User Revenue Fund (HURF): FY2020 Forecast vs Actual by Category







Total vehicle miles traveled on all roads and streets in the U.S. in Q2 of the respective year\*










### Regional Area Road Fund (RARF): FY2020 Forecast vs Actual by Category

**Year over Year Percent Change – Actual FY 2020 vs FY 2019** 











### Forecasting Accuracy: HURF Variance from Previous Forecasts For Fiscal Year 2019






## Forecasting Accuracy: Regional Area Road Fund (RARF) Variance from Previous Forecasts For Fiscal Year 2019



### Risk Analysis Process Results: HURF 2019 vs 2020 Panel


HURF forecasts were reduced by \$500.9M, or 5.8%.





### Risk Analysis Process Results: State Hwy Fund (SHF) Impacts


There are \$206.2M less SHF funds available for ADOTs operating costs & the Highway Construction Program due to reduced HURF forecasts.




#### **Highway & Mass Transit Trust Fund Projections**


### What is the longer-term impact of the COVID-19 virus on the Highway Account?
