Current Planning Activities

- Preparation of 2022-2026 Five Year Transportation Facilities Construction Program
- Upcoming Studies in FY 2021
- State Transportation Board Members 1:1 Meetings

Preparation of 2022-2026 Five Year Program

- Program development is underway, including the review of projects that are in the current program as well as developing scope and budgetary costs for new projects that were prioritized through the P2P process.
- Sub-Programs are also being reviewed to maximize the number of projects that can be identified and included in the program.

Upcoming Studies in 2021

- Corridor Profile Studies, Northwest, North Central and Northeast District studies are currently scheduled to kick-off in the next few months, with the Southern Districts starting up later this year. These are not new Corridor Profile studies but updates to prior studies, with some being more than 10 years old.
- Freight Plan Update, the plan is to be updated through this year with a completion date of FY 2022. The plan has to be updated every five years with the last plan completed in 2017.

Upcoming Studies in 2021 (cont.)

- Long Range Transportation Plan - The plan will be initiating this year with the plan being completed by FY 2023. The plan has to be updated every five years with the last plan completed in 2018.
- Tribal Consultation Matrix - Project to be initiated in FY 2021 with completion in FY 2023. The project will look at accelerating tribal contracts and processes for planning and projects.

- Prior to releasing the tentative 2022-2026 Five Year Transportation Construction Program, ADOT would like to invite each of the STB Members to participate in a 1:1 meeting. The meeting would provide incite to the development of the five year program and the process utilized to prioritize projects as well as the compliance required for federal and state regulations.
