Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director.

In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route of a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects.

With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction.

The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion.

In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

ORDER DEFERRAL AND ACCELERATIONS OF AGENDA ITEMS, VOTE WITHOUT DISCUSSION.



With respect to all agenda items not accelerated, i.e., those items upon which action has been deferred until later in the meeting, the Chairman will entertain a single motion and a single second to that motion and will call for a single vote of the members without any discussion of any agenda items so grouped together and so singly acted upon. REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Intermodal Transportation Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the establishment and improvement of a portion of State Route 82 within the above referenced project.

This portion was previously established as a state route and state highway by Arizona Highway Commission Resolution dated September 9, 1927, page 26 of the Official Minutes; thereafter, various Resolutions established additional right of way for improvements thereof.

This project involves improvements in and around the existing right of way for State Route 82. A temporary construction easement outside the existing right of way is needed for the access and staging of a scour retrofit project. Accordingly, it is now necessary to establish and acquire the temporary construction easement needed.

The area of temporary construction easements required for this improvement is depicted in Appendix "A" and delineated on maps and plans on file in the office of the State Engineer, Intermodal Transportation Division, Phoenix, Arizona, entitled "Right of Way Plans, NOGALES - TOMBSTONE Highway."

In the interest of public safety, necessity and convenience, I recommend that the temporary construction easement depicted in Appendix "A" be acquired in order to improve this portion of State Route 82.

Subject: Master Lease Agreement for Wireless Communication Sites

Dear Board Member:

The attached information is for your review. It is our intention to present a lease for information and possible action at the March 2010 Board meeting.

ADOT initiated a leasing program in November of 1995 with the passage of Board adopted policy as required by ARS §28-7048 (formerly ARS § 1865.01). ARS §28-7048 specifically allows the lease of right-of-way within the highway control of access. Since that time the Department has actively been leasing sites to all of the major cellular providers as well as consummating a few other innovative leasing projects. This program differs from the Right-of-Way Group's leasing program because active highway property (property within the control of access) is under the control of the District Engineer. It is land needed for highway operational purposes and cannot be sold as excess land.

At the March 2010 Board meeting, we will be presenting a Master Lease Agreement received from Clear Wireless, LLC for wireless communications sites. Information is enclosed, along with a copy of the lease agreement, for your review.

MASTER LEASE AGREEMENT FOR LIMITED ACCESS RIGHT OF WAY

LESSEE: CLEAR WIRELESS, LLC

LEASE: XM0017

The State of Arizona, by and through the <u>Arizona Department of Transportation</u>, hereinafter referred to as LESSOR, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein, does hereby lease to <u>Clear Wireless, LLC</u>, hereinafter referred to as LESSEE, the Premises more particularly described herein. LESSEE desires to lease the Premises from LESSOR upon the following terms and conditions. This Master Lease ("Master Lease" or "Lease") is entered into by the parties pursuant to A.R.S. §28-7048.

1. Master Lease

LESSEE may lease several sites ("Sites") from LESSOR for the operation of its Facilities, as herein defined. The lease of each Site shall be pursuant to an Individual Site Agreement, which shall be attached to this Master Lease and incorporated herein. Each Individual Site Agreement shall be subject to and governed by the terms and conditions of this Master Lease, unless otherwise set forth in the Individual Site Agreement.

2. Term

The LESSOR hereby leases to LESSEE the Premises known and described fully in **Exhibit A** attached to the Individual Site Agreements ("Premises") TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all improvements installed by LESSEE, for the initial period of five (5) years and for any applicable renewal period as set forth in each Individual Site Agreement. The term of this Master Lease shall commence ______, 20 ____, and terminate ______, 20 _____ unless sooner terminated as provided herein (the "Initial Term"). This Lease shall automatically renew every five (5) years upon the same terms and conditions of this Lease, unless otherwise agreed upon by both parties, for a total of twenty (20) years. Notwithstanding the expiration of this Lease, the terms and conditions of this Lease shall remain in full force and effect during the term of all Individual Site Agreements. Any change in terms and conditions from those stated in the Master Lease or the Individual Site Agreement shall be attached to and become a part of the original Lease ("Amendment").

3. Rental Rate

The initial rental rate shall be **One Thousand Dollars** (\$1000.00) per month, per Site, paid annually in advance, as hereinafter defined.

In accepting the Lease, the LESSEE agrees to timely pay all taxes and assessments of any kind, which may be levied against the Premises. The initial payment of rent shall be due and payable commencing on the first day of the month following the issuance of ADOT permits. All subsequent payments shall be due and payable annually, on that date, each successive year thereafter. The rent shall be paid by check or cashier's check payable to the Arizona Department of Transportation. The rent shall be subject to adjustment every five (5) years. The rent for each renewal period shall be increased by 20% of the amount of the annual rent payable during the preceding year. LESSOR agrees to notify LESSEE by certified mail sixty (60) days prior to the effective date of any adjustment in the rent. Upon termination of this Lease or the applicable Individual Site agreement by LESSOR, LESSOR will refund, without interest, the unused portion of any pre-paid rent, if any remains owing after deducting appropriate fees and other costs. Prorated rents shall be calculated on a 360-day year basis. LESSEE shall be in default hereunder if rent is not paid within fifteen (15) days after such rent is due. LESSEE shall pay five (5%) percent per day of the current

monthly rental rate as a late charge for each day the rent remains unpaid after the fifteen (15) day period.

4. Security Deposit

Upon execution of each Individual Site Agreement, LESSEE agrees to deposit with LESSOR the sum of **One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00)** per Site, as a guarantee for faithful performance of the terms and conditions of this Lease and the applicable Individual Site Agreement. If at any time Lessee fails to keep and perform any or all of the terms, covenants and conditions of this Lease and the applicable Individual Site Agreement, including without limitation the payment of rent, and any other expenses, fees and costs, LESSOR may, at its sole option, appropriate and apply all or any portion of the security deposit applicable to the Individual Site Agreement to the payment of any such amounts. Upon termination of this Lease or the Individual Site Agreement and LESSEE'S vacating the applicable Premises, LESSOR shall return, without interest, any remaining portion of said deposit.

5. Use of Premises

The LESSEE has the right to use the Premises only for the construction, installation, operation, and maintenance therein of the facility described in **Exhibit B** (the "Facility"), and as shown in the Site Plan set forth on **Exhibit C** (the "Site Plan") both of which are attached to the Individual Site Agreements and are incorporated herein by this reference. The Site Plan shall be approved in advance by LESSOR, which approval shall not be unreasonably delayed or withheld. The LESSEE shall not use the Premises for any other purpose without the specific written prior permission of the LESSOR. Any other use of the Premises shall constitute a material breach and default of this Lease. LESSOR makes no representations as to the status of the Premises, including title, easement, or other restrictions, or its fitness for a particular use. LESSEE shall conduct all investigations necessary to determine if the Premises are fit for the intended use.

LESSEE shall have the right to provide or have provided to the Premises necessary public utility service (electric, gas, water, sewer and telephone service) and such necessary wires, cables, pipes, conduits, lines, ducts and such other equipment as either LESSEE or LESSOR may consider appropriate, the installation and use cost of which public utility services shall be borne by the party requiring same. While the LESSEE is applying for electric service from the local utility company for a Site, it may temporarily, for up to sixty (60) days, use ADOT electricity, where available, and pay to ADOT \$300.00 per month, per Site, or an amount as modified in an Individual Site Agreement, for the electricity consumed. In the event provision of such services to LESSEE requires use of a portion of the contiguous or adjacent right-of-way of the LESSOR other than the Premises, such use shall only be made upon prior written approval of the LESSOR, which shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. LESSOR shall cooperate with LESSEE, at no expense to LESSOR, in LESSEE'S efforts to obtain such public utility services as shown on the applicable Site Plan.

The Facility shall be operated in accordance with prevailing standards and criteria established by the applicable governing agencies and without creating or causing to be created, nuisances or hazards to the public health or safety or interfering with the rights or business activities of other tenants. LESSEE further agrees not to commit, or permit the commission of, any act or thing on the Premises, which is a violation of any local ordinance or of any law of the State of Arizona or the United States. LESSEE shall access the leased Premises from access points as directed or approved by the LESSOR'S District personnel or as shown on the approved Site Plan. Normally, LESSEE shall not be given access to the leased Premises from the highway or interfere with the operations of the highway facility without the express permission from LESSOR. LESSEE shall provide appropriate traffic control approved by LESSOR'S District personnel.

The LESSEE shall develop its Sites in a manner that will facilitate the improvement of wireless communications services and enhance the safety and efficiency of the State's transportation systems and facilities. The LESSOR and the LESSEE agree that the State will benefit from the introduction and enhancement of telecommunications services that may

include, but are not limited to, the possible introduction of general mobile telephone service, 911 or 311 emergency telephone service, vehicle identification service, a surveillance and guidance system, personal communications services, standard paging services and the emergency paging services useful to firefighters and EMS personnel.

Notwithstanding anything herein, LESSEE makes no representation, warranty or covenant concerning the possible enhancement of safety or efficiency to the State's transportation systems and facilities that may arise out of the development and operation of the Sites.

LESSOR covenants that upon LESSEE'S paying rent and performing all of the covenants and conditions set forth in this Lease and the applicable Individual Site Agreement, LESSEE shall peaceably and quietly have, hold and enjoy the Premises unless otherwise provided in this Lease.

6. Maintenance of Premises

LESSEE shall maintain the Premises in good repair and condition during the term of the Lease and the applicable Individual Site Agreement. LESSOR shall have the right to enter the Premises, except for LESSEE'S equipment shelters and cabinets, at reasonable times for the purpose of making necessary inspections, repairs and performing maintenance of LESSOR equipment, if any. LESSEE acknowledges LESSOR shall have no responsibility for LESSEE'S Facility in the event of an emergency or any other condition that may arise. The LESSEE shall provide detailed plans to LESSOR describing how the Facility will be maintained, including a proposed schedule for both routine and emergency maintenance.

LESSOR will not participate in any costs for maintenance of the Premises, unless otherwise stated in writing. In the event that LESSEE, its agents, representatives, employees or invitees, damages any property or facilities owned or maintained by LESSOR, LESSEE shall immediately pay for the costs of repairing or replacing the damaged property or facilities. Should the Facility extend outside the Premises, and be damaged by another entity during excavation and/or maintenance of another Facility LESSEE will be responsible for all costs of repair or replacement of its damaged property. Except under emergency conditions, LESSEE shall give at least forty-eight (48) hours notice of its intent to enter the right of way for installation or maintenance of the Facility. LESSEE shall complete all emergency repairs immediately.

LESSEE shall maintain the Premises in a neat, clean and orderly condition at all times and shall not permit debris to accumulate at any time. LESSEE shall not commit, suffer, or permit any waste of said property or any acts to be committed in violation of any laws or ordinances. LESSEE shall provide adequate weed and dust control on the Premises. LESSEE shall close and lock all gates whenever entering or exiting the Premises.

7. Additional Leases

LESSOR reserves the right to lease any of the Premises subject to this Lease to other entities for installation of additional facilities. LESSEE shall make no claim against LESSOR for damages or for the prevention of such additional leases. Notwithstanding the foregoing, LESSOR shall not permit the installation of any future equipment, which results in radio frequency interference to LESSEE or with LESSEE'S access and operation of the then existing equipment of LESSEE'S Facility.

Additionally, LESSEE shall exercise reasonable effort to co-develop Facilities with qualified, compatible users, or allow collocation on their already constructed Facilities unless collocation will result in interference with the operations, communication systems, microwave antennas or other equipment of the LESSOR, other government agencies or the LESSEE. LESSEE'S standard collocation application process shall be used to determine feasibility and compatibility. The LESSEE may charge a fee for collocation, under written agreements. Copies of the agreements between the LESSEE and the third parties shall be provided to the LESSOR. Any collocation or co-development of Facilities by LESSEE shall not collocate or co-develop a Site unless LESSOR has selected a third party for collocation

pursuant to a competitive bid process. More than one compatible third party may be selected to occupy the Premises. All third party leases shall be subject to the same terms, term, conditions, and renewal periods as the original LESSEE. The Lease amount shall be determined through the bid process.

Notwithstanding anything herein, however, LESSEE shall obtain the prior written consent of LESSOR, and any ADOT permits that may be required, for modification or upgrades that change the size, function, or operation of the Facility, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

8. Lessor Use of the Facility

LESSEE agrees to allow the LESSOR to install equipment, for LESSOR'S use, on LESSEE'S Facility. It is acknowledged by both parties that the LESSOR shall not be required to pay to the LESSEE any rental, license or other fee in exchange for the right to occupy such a Facility. It is also acknowledged by both parties: 1) the LESSOR'S use must be compatible with and not create technical interference problems with the LESSEE'S then existing use; 2) the LESSOR shall obtain LESSEE'S comments regarding equipment compatibility in writing prior to installation of any such equipment, which comments shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. LESSEE reserves the right to review the ADOT list of contractors prequalified to perform the equipment installation; and 3) all costs of all such installations, maintenance and removal will be the sole responsibility of the LESSOR.

The LESSOR may seek to provide the traveling public with wireless telephone access to traveler information lines. If the LESSOR does so, the LESSEE shall make reasonable efforts to provide the traveling public with wireless telephone access to information lines. The LESSEE shall create a cost-free access line identified as 911, 311, or a similar designation.

9. Cancellation Clause

This Lease is subject to cancellation by the Governor pursuant to A.R.S. §38-511.

10. Improvements to Premises

Except as authorized by the Lease, no permanent structures or facilities of any kind shall be erected or moved upon or within the Premises by the LESSEE without the express written prior permission of the LESSOR. Any such structure/facilities erected or moved upon or within the Premises without the express written consent of the LESSOR may be immediately removed by LESSOR at the expense of LESSEE.

LESSOR, at its option, upon termination or expiration of the Lease or an Individual Site Agreement, may require removal of the improvements from the applicable Site. If removal of the improvements damages the Premises, LESSEE, at LESSEE'S expense shall replace or repair any such damage prior to the termination or expiration of this Lease or an Individual Site Agreement. At LESSOR'S option, if LESSEE does not require the removal of the improvements, the improvements, excluding the electronics and other technical equipment, shall become the property of LESSOR upon termination or expiration of this Lease.

11. Performance

LESSEE shall complete the construction of any improvements on a Site within six (6) months after obtaining all necessary permits and authorizations. If LESSEE fails to complete said construction within the six (6) month time period, LESSOR shall have the option of terminating the Lease or the applicable Individual Site Agreement or extending the time frame for construction. If the improvements are not timely completed, LESSEE shall be liable for any damages, which may arise due to such failure to timely complete the Facility.

12. Zoning and Permits Required

If required, LESSEE shall obtain proper zoning clearance and/or building permits from all governmental agencies having jurisdiction over the Premises and the intended use, including ADOT District approval, prior to the start of construction of any Facility. LESSEE shall diligently pursue the issuance of all required permits and approvals pursuant to this Lease.

LESSEE shall obtain all permits and authorizations within ninety (90) days after execution of an Individual Site Agreement unless otherwise agreed to by LESSOR. ADOT District personnel must be notified prior to performing any Facility work on the Premises. LESSEE shall have maintenance plans approved by the LESSOR and make them a part of this Lease, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. ADOT Permits will be issued for each job site upon application by LESSEE and approval by LESSOR'S District personnel.

The LESSEE shall provide construction plans and specifications for each Site or Site type to the LESSOR for approval, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. The LESSEE shall submit "as-built" plans for the Facility to ADOT within six (6) months of its completion.

ADOT may rely exclusively on the as-built plans to locate the Facility in conducting any excavation in the Premises for transportation purposes. The LESSOR and Federal Highways Administration specifically reserve the right to enter the Premises, except for LESSEE'S equipment shelters and cabinets, at any and all reasonable times for survey or preliminary engineering studies.

13. Mechanics Liens

LESSEE shall keep the Premises free from any liens arising from work performed, materials furnished or obligations incurred by LESSEE and shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend LESSOR from any liens and encumbrances arising from any work performed or materials furnished by or at the direction of LESSEE. Upon completion of any construction activity, copies of signed lien waivers shall be supplied to LESSOR.

14. Untenantable Premises Due to Damage

In the event the Premises are partially or completely destroyed by flood, accident or acts of God, LESSOR shall have the option to allow repair or restoration, if reasonably practicable, of said Premises or terminate the applicable Individual Site Agreement by delivering written Notice of Immediate Termination to LESSEE. At LESSOR'S option, and at LESSEE'S sole expense, the LESSEE may relocate the Facility to a new location within close proximity to the original location, provided such relocation does not interfere with any existing or planned use on the Premises.

15. Liability

LESSEE shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the State of Arizona, LESSOR, and their elected or appointed officials, agents, boards, commissions, employees and representatives (collectively "LESSOR") from all lawsuits, including without limitation attorneys' fees and costs of litigation, actions, loss, damage, expense, cost, claims or liability of any character or any nature (including without limitation punitive damages) arising out of or in connection with (i) any act or omission of the LESSEE, its agents, employees, representatives, invitees, successors and assigns (collectively "LESSEE"), and of any subcontractor of LESSEE, its agents and employees, in any way arising out of or resulting from any activity of LESSEE on the leased Premises which results directly or indirectly in the injury to or death of any person or persons or the damage of any property of any person, persons, or entity, or (ii) the failure of the LESSEE or those acting under LESSEE to conform to any statutes, ordinances, regulations, executive orders, laws or court decrees, or this Lease, or (iii) any mechanics', material man's liens and/or liens of a like nature, or any other liens or encumbrances. It is the intent of LESSEE and LESSOR that LESSOR shall, in all

instances, except for loss or damage resulting from the sole active negligence of LESSOR, be indemnified by LESSEE against all liability, losses and damages of any nature whatever for or on account of any injuries to or death of persons or damages to or destruction of property belonging to any person arising out of or in any way connected with LESSEE'S activity on the Premises, or this Lease. LESSEE shall give to LESSOR prompt notice of any claim made or suit instituted which in any way directly or indirectly affects or might affect LESSOR, and LESSOR shall have the right to compromise and defend the same to the extent of its own interest. LESSOR shall have the right, but not the duty, to participate in the defense of any claim or litigation with attorneys of LESSOR'S selection without relieving LESSEE of any obligations hereunder. LESSEE'S obligations hereunder shall survive any termination of this Lease or LESSEE'S activities on the Premises.

16. Insurance

- a. <u>Liability Insurance</u>. Throughout the term and renewal terms of this Lease and the term and renewal terms of each Individual Site Agreement, LESSEE, at its expense, shall provide and maintain general public liability, motor vehicle liability and property damage insurance with limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00).
- b. <u>Insurance Policies</u>. In the event that LESSEE fails to satisfy the insurance requirements set forth in this Lease, LESSOR, at LESSOR'S option, upon ten (10) days advance written notice to LESSEE, shall have the right to secure the required insurance at the expense of LESSEE, or terminate this Lease. LESSEE shall deliver to LESSOR prior to its occupancy of the leased Premises certificates of insurance evidencing the requirements set forth herein. All policies shall be issued from companies authorized to do business in the State of Arizona and in a form acceptable to LESSOR. The policies shall include LESSOR and the State of Arizona as additional insured's.

The insurance policies shall provide that written notice of cancellation or of any material change shall be delivered to LESSOR by the issuing company or companies at least thirty (30) days in advance of the effective date thereof. LESSEE shall increase the aforesaid limits of coverage in the policies upon the written demand of LESSOR, provided that such increases are deemed reasonable and necessary by LESSOR, or required by law. Any enumeration of specific insurance coverage and amounts shall not limit or restrict the comprehensive indemnity covenant set forth in this Lease.

17. Compliance with Environmental Laws

LESSEE shall, at LESSEE'S own expense, comply with all present and hereinafter enacted Environmental Laws, and any amendments thereto, affecting LESSEE'S operation on the Premises. LESSEE shall immediately notify LESSOR should it receive any correspondence or communication from any governmental entity regarding the application of Environmental Laws to the Premises or LESSEE'S operation on the leased Premises. LESSOR shall immediately notify LESSEE should it receive any correspondence or communication from any governmental entity regarding the application of Environmental Laws to the Premises or LESSEE'S operation on the leased Premises. Any environmental assessments, studies, or audits known by LESSOR, may be disclosed to third parties as a result of public disclosure laws, and will be disclosed to other state and federal agencies that are concerned with the enforcement of environmental laws and regulations.

a. "Environmental Laws" mean any one or all of the following as the same may be amended from time to time: The Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act, 42 U.S.C. Section 9601 et seq.; the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, 42 U.S.C. Section 6941 et seq.; the Toxic Substance Control Act, 15 U.S.C. Section 2601 et seq.; the Safe Drinking Water Act, 42 U.S.C. Section 300 h et seq.; the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. Section 1251 et seq.; the Clean Air Act 42 U.S.C. Section 7401 et seq.; the Arizona Environmental Quality Act, A.R.S. Section 49-201 et seq.; the Arizona Underground Storage Tank Regulation statute, A.R.S. Section 49-921 et seq.; and the regulations promulgated under each of the above laws and any other laws, regulations and ordinances (whether enacted by the local, state, or federal government) now in effect or hereinafter enacted that deal with the regulation or protection of the environment, including the ambient air, ground water, surface water, and land use, including substrata land.

18. Environmental Waste Indemnification by Lessee

LESSEE shall indemnify and hold harmless LESSOR, its officials, employees, boards, commission, agents and representatives from and against any and all loss, damage, and expense (including, but not limited to, reasonable investigation, legal fees and costs) including but not limited to any claim or action for injury liability, or damage to persons or property, and any and all claims or actions brought by any person, firm, governmental body, or other entity, alleging or resulting from or arising from or in connection with contamination of or adverse effects on the environment, or violation of an Environmental Law or other statute, ordinance, rule, regulation, judgment, or order of any government or judicial entity, and from and against any damages, liabilities, costs, and penalties which arise or result from LESSEE'S use, activity, omission or operation on the Premises during the term of this Lease. LESSEE'S obligations and liabilities under this paragraph shall continue so long as LESSOR bears any liability or responsibility under the Environmental Laws for any action that occurred on the Premises. LESSEE'S failure to abide by the terms of this paragraph shall be restrainable by injunction. The term "LESSEE" shall include LESSEE'S agents, employees, representatives, invitees, successors and assigns.

19. Sale of Premises by Lessor

In the event LESSOR desires to sell the Premises, LESSEE will make no claim to prevent such sale. The sale shall be subject to the terms and conditions of the Lease, including the applicable Individual Site Agreements. Any transfer of ownership of, or rights in, the Premises by the LESSOR to any other governmental agency shall be subject to this Lease. LESSOR shall advise LESSEE in writing of any such sale.

20. Assignment

LESSEE may assign all of its rights, duties and obligations under this Lease and the applicable Individual Site Agreement, or sublet all or any portion of the Premises: (I) to any entity controlled by, controlling, or under common control with (LESSEE NAME), (ii) to any other entity now or in the future listed in the "(LESSEE NAME)" corporation directories, (iii) to any entity which acquires all or substantially all of LESSEE'S assets in the area of the Premises by reason of a merger, acquisition or other business reorganization, provided, for section (iii) only, that LESSEE obtains LESSOR'S consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld or denied. In the event of any assignment of the Lease by LESSEE, LESSEE shall NOT be relieved of liability under any and all of its covenants and obligations contained in or derived from the Lease.

Additionally, LESSEE may, with the consent of LESSOR, mortgage or grant a security interest in this Lease (including the Individual Site Agreements) and LESSEE'S equipment, and may assign this Lease (including the Individual Site Agreements) and LESSEE'S equipment to any mortgagees, deed of trust beneficiaries, or holders of security interest, including their successors or assigns, (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Mortgagees" and individually as "Mortgagee"), provided such Mortgagees agree to be bound by the terms and provisions of this Sublease and provided that such mortgage or security interest is subordinate to the interests of LESSOR. Prior to consenting to any such mortgage or grant of a security interest, LESSOR shall have the opportunity to review all relevant documentation relating to the proposed transaction. Such review shall be completed within sixty (60) days of LESSOR'S receipt of such documentation. During the course of its review, LESSOR shall have the right to request additional relevant documentation it reasonably believes is necessary to complete its review. In addition, LESSOR agrees that a Mortgagee shall have the same rights and obligations as LESSEE under this Lease to cure any default and, with the consent of LESSOR, to remove any property of LESSEE or Mortgagee located on the Premises.

21. Nondiscrimination Regulations

The Lessee, for itself, its successors in interest and assigns, as a part of the consideration hereof, does hereby covenant and agree, as a covenant running with the land:

- (a) That no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, creed, sex, religion, age, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or be other wise subjected to discrimination in the use of said facilities;
- (b) That in connection with the construction of any improvements on, over or under such land, and the furnishings of any services thereon, no person on the grounds of race, color, creed, sex, age, or national origin shall be excluded from participation, denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination.
- (c) LESSEE shall use the Premises in compliance with all other requirements imposed by or pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation - Effectuation of Title VI of Civil Rights Act of 1964, and as said Regulation may be amended. In the event of breach of any of the above nondiscrimination covenants, LESSOR

shall have the right to terminate this Lease and to reenter and repossess the Premises and remove LESSEE therefrom.

(d) That the Lessee shall use the Premises in compliance with all other requirements imposed pursuant to Title 15, Code of Federal Regulations, Commerce and Foreign Trade, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary of Commerce, part 8 (15 C.F.R., Part B), and as said Regulations may be amended.

22. Default by Lessee; Lessor's Remedies

- a. <u>Default</u>. Each of the following occurrences shall constitute an event of default hereunder ("Default"):
 - 1. LESSEE shall fail to pay any rent, additional charges or any sum within fifteen (15) days after same are due hereunder or under the applicable Individual Site Agreement, unless a different time period is otherwise specified herein or in the applicable Individual Site Agreement.
 - 2. The failure or refusal of LESSEE to observe or perform any of the non-monetary covenants, terms and conditions of this Lease and such failure shall continue for a period of thirty (30) days after delivery by the LESSOR of written notice thereof, unless a different time period is otherwise specified herein, or approved by LESSOR, if LESSEE commences action to cure the Default within such thirty (30) day period and proceeds with due diligence to fully cure the Default.
- b. <u>Remedies</u>. In addition to any other rights and remedies LESSOR may have or has by present or future law or hereunder, LESSOR shall have the following rights and remedies upon any default of LESSEE.
 - 1. LESSOR shall have the right, at its election, to re-enter the Premises or any part thereof, either with or without process of law, and to expel, remove and eject LESSEE and all persons occupying under LESSEE. No re-entry by LESSOR shall be deemed an acceptance of a surrender of this Lease, nor shall it absolve or discharge LESSEE from any liability under this Lease. Upon such re-entry, all rights of LESSEE to occupy or possess the Premises shall cease and terminate at LESSOR'S option.
 - 2. LESSOR shall have the right, at its election, with or without re-entry as provided in subparagraph 1 above, to give written notice to LESSEE stating that this Lease shall terminate on the date specified by such notice. Upon such termination, LESSEE shall quit and peacefully surrender to LESSOR the Premises. This notice need not be given prior to re-entry under subparagraph 1 above.
 - 3. No re-entry or termination shall relieve LESSEE of its liability and obligations under this Lease; and all such liability and obligations shall survive any reentry or termination. In the event of any re-entry, whether or not the Premises, or any part thereof, shall have been re-let. LESSEE shall pay to LESSOR the entire rent and all other charges required to be paid by LESSEE up to the time of such re-entry of this Lease.

23. Return of Premises to Lessor

Upon vacating the Premises, LESSEE agrees to leave the Premises in as good a condition or better than existed on the first day of occupancy, allowing for ordinary and normal usage, and to reimburse LESSOR for any damage done to said Premises caused by LESSEE'S occupation or tenancy, other than due to normal use. LESSEE acknowledges that this tenancy is temporary by reason of the fact that LESSOR has acquired the Premises for transportation purposes. LESSEE, at LESSEE'S expense, shall vacate the Premises within one hundred eighty (180) days after receipt of a notice to vacate or sooner, if necessary in

LESSOR'S discretion. Nothing herein shall be deemed a waiver of LESSOR'S right to demand and obtain possession of the Premises in accordance with the law in the event of a violation on the part of LESSEE of any of the terms or conditions hereof.

This Lease agreement shall not establish prior rights benefits for the LESSEE, or their assigns. Alterations to the Facility shall be at LESSEE'S sole expense. All Leases are subject to cancellation at will by the Department, after reasonable notice, to provide for use of the area for highway purposes. Relocation costs shall be the sole responsibility of the LESSEE.

24. Addenda

Any changes or modifications of this Lease and any applicable Individual Site Agreement shall be made by a written addendum and signed by authorized officials. Any addenda to this Lease and any applicable Individual Site Agreement are by this reference made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein.

25. Subsequent Legislation, Regulations, Procedures

It is foreseeable that additional legislation pertaining to the leasing of right of way may be passed after the date of this Lease, or that LESSOR may adopt regulations or additional procedures pertaining to the leasing of right of way. Should any of these events, or any combination of them occur, all of the relevant statutory provisions, regulations, or procedures, including subsequent amendments thereto, will become part of this Lease. If any of these events, or any combination of these events occurs, any language or terms now in this Lease inconsistent with the relevant new statues, regulations, or procedures will be void immediately upon their effective date.

26. A.R.S. Section §28-7048

LESSEE is aware of the statutory requirement of A.R.S. §28-7048 requiring policy to be adopted by the State Transportation Board. In order to comply with A.R.S. §28-7048, the Board passed policy, dated November 17, 1995, governing the Lease of Highway Rights-of-Way. LESSEE will not raise the lack of any procedures as a defense or objection to any demands of LESSOR under this Lease, or in any litigation involving any of the terms of this Lease. Should a formal Attorney General opinion, or a court decision invalidate this Lease for lack of sufficient procedures, or any other reason, the LESSEE will in one hundred eighty (180) days vacate the leased Premises and restore it to an appropriate condition as described hereunder.

27. Termination for Convenience

LESSOR reserves the right to terminate this Lease whole or in part at anytime for the convenience of the State without penalty or recourse. The LESSOR shall give written notice by certified mail, return requested, to the LESSEE of the termination at least one hundred eighty (180) days before the effective date of the termination. Upon receipt of the written notice, the LESSEE shall stop all work and immediately notify all applicable third parties to do the same.

28. Termination by Lessee

LESSEE may elect not to renew this Lease_and any applicable Individual Site Agreement by providing written notice to LESSOR on or before sixty (60) days prior to the termination of the first five (5) year term of the Lease or any applicable Individual Site Agreement. Thereafter, LESSEE may terminate this Lease or any applicable Individual Site Agreement at anytime and for any reason by providing a minimum one hundred eighty (180) day written notice to LESSOR. However, any obligation pertinent to the indemnification and environmental sections of this lease shall survive the termination, and LESSEE shall be obligated to pay the annual rent when due. Rent will be prorated up to and including the date ADOT inspects and accepts the condition of the vacated Site.

STATE ENGINEER'S REPORT February 2010

The Status of Projects Under Construction report for February 2010 shows 105 projects under construction valued at \$1,324,836,863.51. The transportation board awarded 13 projects during February valued at approximately \$16.1 million.

During February the Department finalized 4 projects valued at \$6,568,337.52. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package.

Year to date we have finalized 73 projects. The total cost of these 73 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 7.0%. Deducting incentive/bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to 3.7%.



COMMENTS:

At the bid opening, BECO Construction Co., Inc. was read as the apparent low bidder with a bid of \$69,576.00. The second low bidder was Bison Contracting Co., Inc. with a bid of \$98,155.55.

Subsequent to the bid opening, BECO requested to withdraw their bid due to a clerical error in transferring to the computer the number of panels needed for the retaining wall item. The number of panels needed for the 157 foot length is 67 but a quantity of 40 was input in error. Due to this error, the unit price submitted was \$22.00 per Sq. Ft., which results in an extended amount of \$38,500.00. The intended unit price was \$35.33 which would result in an extended amount of \$61,827.50.

BECO requested to withdraw its bid due to a clerical error and submitted documentation supporting the request.

Staff recommends that the low bidder, BECO Construction Co., Inc., be allowed to withdraw its bid and that the contract be awarded to the second low bidder, Bison Contracting Co., Inc. BECO is legally justified in withdrawing its bid due to a clerical error. The error stems from transferring a panel quantity to a computer worksheet different than what was on the bid worksheet. The error is of such grave consequence that to enforce a contract would be unconscionable since the amount of the error is more than 33% of BECO's bid. In addition, the mistake relates to a material feature of the contract, i.e., the proposed contract price. The error did not come about because of a violation of positive legal duty or from culpable negligence.

Finally, the State is placed back to the status quo to the extent that the State suffers no serious prejudice except the loss of the benefit of the bargain. *See, Marana Unified School District v. Aetna Cas. and Sur.* 144 Ariz. 159, 696 P.2d 711 (App. 1985).

Therefore, the State Engineer recommends allowing BECO Construction Co., Inc. to withdraw its bid without forfeiting the bid bond and recommends that the contract be awarded to Bison Contracting Co., Inc.

COMMENTS:

At the bid opening, Fisher Sand and Gravel DBA Southwest Asphalt Paving (Fisher) was read as the apparent low bidder with a bid of \$3,838,383.83. The second low bidder was Meadow Valley Contractors, Inc. (Meadow Valley) with a bid of \$3,995,135.07.

Subsequent to the bid opening, Meadow Valley submitted a formal bid protest. The bid protest states that Fisher submitted a bid that was mathematically and materially unbalanced, and that Fisher's bid should be rejected. Meadow Valley requested that the Department reject Fisher's bid and award the project to Meadow Valley.

A bid is determined to be mathematically unbalanced if it does not "reflect reasonably anticipated actual costs plus a reasonable proportionate share of the bidder's anticipated profit, overhead costs, and other indirect costs."

A bid is materially unbalanced if the bid generates "a reasonable doubt that an award to the bidder submitting a mathematically unbalanced bid will result in the lowest ultimate cost to the Department."

The bid protest concerns Item 7016020 - Temporary Concrete Barrier (TCB) (In-Use). The specifications establish this item to be measured by the linear foot for each 24 hour day that it is in use. The bid schedule quantity for this item is 74,500 linear feet per day.

Fisher bid \$1.00 per linear foot per day. Meadow Valley bid \$0.07 per linear foot per day. The average unit price bid for this item, excluding Fisher's bid of \$1.00 per linear foot per day, is \$0.08 per linear foot per day. ADOT estimated a unit price of \$0.08 per linear foot per day for this item.

The estimated quantity of TCB (In-Use) was derived by multiplying 745 linear feet of TCB for each of the 10 locations for a duration of 10 days. The duration of 10 days was underestimated, so the quantity of TCB (In-Use) will increase. The quantity may also increase if additional linear feet of TCB are needed.

ADOT believes that the final quantity will exceed the original estimated quantity by a significant amount. Meadow Valley states that it will take approximately 35 days to complete the work for which the TCB is needed. If the work does average 35 days for installation, Meadow Valley's total cost for the project will be lower than Fisher's. Whether Meadow Valley's estimated duration of 35 days is the best estimate is not at issue. The issue is simply whether a duration of 35 days is possible. A duration of 35 days is definitely possible. Therefore, since a duration of 35 days is possible, there is a reasonable doubt that Fisher's bid would result in the lowest ultimate cost to the Department, based on the submitted unit prices.

Therefore, Fisher's bid is materially unbalanced.

Fisher's letter, dated February 11, 2010, indicates that Fisher intended to recover 50 percent of its cost for casting the TCB on this project. Recovering 50 percent of the cost on one project does not reflect the reasonably anticipated actual cost for the barrier over the life of the item along with a reasonably proportionate share of the profit, overhead and other indirect costs. Per Fisher's letter, 50 percent of Fisher's costs are based on a quantity of 74,500 linear feet per day. However, since the quantity will over-run, an even larger amount of Fisher's costs would be paid on this project, and would likely be an amount greater than the cost of casting the TCB.

By submitting a unit price of \$1.00 for this item, Fisher mathematically unbalanced their bid, as defined in Subsection 101.02 of the Specifications. Since the quantity will over-run and it is possible that it will take at least 35 days, Fisher's bid is also materially unbalanced, as defined in Subsection 101.02 of the Specifications. This is unacceptable to the Department. Subsection 102.10 of the Specifications states that proposals may be considered irregular and may be rejected if the bid is unbalanced.

The State Engineer considers Fisher's bid to be unbalanced, both mathematically and materially. The quantity for the TCB (In-Use) will over-run so there is a definite detriment to the Department. Therefore, the State Engineer recommends rejecting Fisher's bid and awarding the contract to Meadow Valley.
