# ITEM 1: Consent Agenda - Floyd Roehrich

# ITEM 2a: Construction Contracts - Floyd Roehrich

This item is a pavement preservation project in Apache County in the Springerville-Eagar area. It is known as the Main Street through Eagar, and Mountain Avenue in Springerville. This had a bid amount of \$699,000, 15% over the Department's estimate most of the cost is due to the fact there are limited suppliers of materials such as binder asphalt concrete in that area, and contractors have to bring it in. The Department had not foreseen that when they put the bid together, but that factor was consistent throughout the bids received. They reviewed the bid, evaluated it and concluded it was a competent bid. Staff recommends that the Board award Item 2a in the amount of \$699,421.41.
