Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director.

In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route of a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects.

With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction.

The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion.

In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

ORDER DEFERRAL AND ACCELERATIONS OF AGENDA ITEMS, VOTE WITHOUT DISCUSSION.



Pledge

The Pledge of Allegiance led by Steve Christy.

Roll Call

Roll call by Board Secretary, Mary Currie.

In attendance: Bill Feldmeier, Felipe Zubia (absent), Bob Montoya (absent), Bobbie Lundstrom, Victor Flores, Steve Christy, and Kelly Anderson.

Opening Remarks

He has been to Parker a couple of times and likes it especially in the winter where it is a lot warmer than it is in Prescott. He has also noticed over the years that it is a very clean town and people are friendly.

Call to the Audience

<u>Jack Hakim, Mayor of Bullhead City:</u> He spoke about concerns that traffic is being congested in the Boulder City area and it was disrupting the businesses in the community because of the back up of the trucks. The proposed solution is to send the truck traffic back to Bullhead City on 68 and 95 over the existing Bullhead – Laughlin Bridge and transfer the problem back to Arizona. Mayor Hakim distributed information about some of the issues to the Board Members and ADOT staff for the record.

Paul Johnson, Councilmember, City of Yuma: On behalf of the Rural Transportation Advocate Council, he invites the Board to the Rural Transportation Summit January 18th to January 20th, 2012 in Yuma. The existing CIP, there is \$20M in FY2012 and 2013 to begin the first part of CANAMEX corridor north of Yuma. In the revised draft it has disappeared. There is a resolution that was passed by the State Transportation Board, designation of the CANAMEX in Arizona when Jim Martin was Chairman of the Board. The \$20M for this project is the first step. This is important because it is the only paved road that goes to Yuma Proving Grounds and the Army's premier test center.

Sanford Cohen, Open Trails Association: He is the Chairman of the Landowner-Lessee/Sportsman Relations Committee and Arizona Game and Fish. His suggestion is that when sending registration renewal notices to OHV owners, can another line be added where they will be notified of their need to renew their OHV decal. Currently, they are leaving it up to the owner of the vehicle to remember to renew the OHV decal. Compliance statewide is languishing at less

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than 25%. That would allow for the full funding of monitoring and law enforcement activities that are under consideration that the legislature was originally crafted.

ITEM 1: District Engineer's Report – Alvin Stump, Yuma District Engineer (Acting)

Alvin provided an update on the projects in the La Paz County area. In the next couple of years, there is roughly \$42.5M program for the La Paz County region

ITEM 2: Director's Report – John Halikowski, Director

There are two Items he would like to bring to the attention of the Board.

1) I-11 Update – The owners that cover a substantial portion of that property and the future freeway corridor. They have been working with ADOT to try and identify approximately \$1.25M to complete the \$3.5M of funding necessary that they estimated needed for phase I from the I-11 environmental study. The department had previously committed \$2M to this effort at the request of the Governor and the landowners have secured \$250K from Congress. Phase I extends from I-10 west of phoenix at about 365th Avenue to US 93 north of Wickenburg.

2)

<u>Victor Flores</u>: He does not oppose I-11, although his concern has been that since he started commenting on issues that he had is that the moneys that are being asked for are asked for in a time when they do not have much money. He wants the conclusion to be to ask the Chairman to put this as an Agenda Item and discuss further and at that particular point debate whether or not it is the issuance of \$1.5M or \$3.5M that is in fact a Board Policy.

<u>Bill Feldmeier:</u> He will put it on the agenda for either a regular meeting or study session which ever is the first that provides them with the ability to come up with the answers that they are going to need.

<u>John Halikowski:</u> He briefly reviews the executive and the legislative budget proposals as they affect ADOT. These are what the executive and the legislative budget proposals include:

- o New lane miles, neither of the executive or the JLBC proposal do anything for them with the increase of maintenance money for new lane miles.
- o The building renewal fund is at \$1M. If full funding was looked at for the facilities renewal, they would be at \$9.6M
- o LB& I and JLBC gives nothing for those. The executive budget proposes giving \$2.3M per DI storage buildings provided that they are state highway fund revenue sufficient and \$3M for the vehicle wash systems.
- o Both of budgets proposed continued suspension of the HURF and the state highway fund transfer caps. Those are set by law at \$12.5M and for years those have been ignored and essentially they are going to continue the \$43M VLT transfer into FY2012.
- o The aviation fund balance is \$13.6M. There is an outstanding balance of about \$20M and what the executive proposes to do is take an additional \$3.2M transferred from the aviation fund.

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- Prison labor is an issue that comes up as to why they cannot use more inmate labor. In fact the use has increased. They are performing nearly all of the facility related landscaping activities for the buildings in Phoenix and Tucson.
- Moving from 2009 to 2010, things look pretty grim. They have had to take some significant actions to make the budget balance. They continue to look closely where they spend money and achieve savings.

<u>Victor Flores</u>: For clarification on 2011, the letter from the Governor that asked John to find the \$1.5M, there is no time constraint so if it is put as an agenda item for the next meeting or study session, is the understanding that there is no action going to be taken prior to that or is the \$1.5M ever been found?

<u>John Halikowski:</u> If the desire of the Board is to come back and identify where this money would be coming from, they would have to start looking at that right now. However, as noted, the Governor understands that the money for this study needs to be approved not only MAG's Regional Transportation Council, but also by the State Board. He clarifies that if Victor is asking if ADOT will expend the money absent Board approval, the answer is no.

ITEM 3: Consent Agenda

Motion to approve Consent Agenda made by Kelly Anderson and a second by Steve Christy, in a voice vote, motion carries.

ITEM 4: Legislative Report – Eileen Colleran

FY 2011 Appropriation - The House introduced a Continuing Resolution (CR) last week HR 1 which would provide funding through the rest of the federal fiscal year (September 30, 2011). The proposal would cut spending and represents \$100 billion less than the President's budget recommendations.

FY 2012 Appropriation - The President introduced his budget recommendations this week for federal FY 2012. For transportation he is recommending an additional \$50 billion to kick off a 6 year reauthorization and includes:\$70.5 B is requested to rebuild our roads and bridges, \$22.4 B is requested to support public transit, \$8.3 B rail.

SAFETEA-LU Reauthorization -- President introduces a 6 year reauthorization proposal which includes \$556 billion with \$50 billion "Up-Front" economic boost that would foster job creation and a \$5 billion Infrastructure Bank. There have been no recommendations on how to pay for the bill. The House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee passed HR 662 on Wednesday which continues SAFETEA-LU at current funding levels through 9/30/11. Senator Boxer, Chair of the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee continues work on her piece of the reauthorization bill.

FAA Reauthorization - The Senate continues hearing S 223 on the floor. The House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee introduced HR 658 last week.

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<u>John Halikowski:</u> There are about 12 bills moving through with brand new special license plates honoring everything from professional hockey to food banks.

ITEM 5: Financial Report – John Fink

Highway User Revenue Funds:

- o January HURF was about \$102.7M, down about 2.2% compared to last year. Last January was a very high month at \$105M. They are up 4.4% compared to the estimate.
- o For the year, HURF now stands at \$694.9M. That is up 1.6% compared to last year and up about 1.2% compared to the estimate.

Regional Area Road Funds: He will only discuss the January results.

o January RARF stood at \$30.1M. That is up 6.3% compared to last year and up 3.1% compared to the estimate. There are four straight months where the RARF monthly results were above the comparable period for last year.

Aviation funds:

- O Aviation fund revenue in January was \$2.5M. That is down quite a bit from last year but is up about 10.7% compared to the estimate.
- o For the year now, aviation fund revenues stand at \$14.2M. That is up 14.6% compared to last year and is up 11.3% compared to the estimate.

Investment report:

- o In January there was an average monthly investment balance of \$1.165B.
- o Investment earnings for the month were about \$1M for an annualized yield of 0.71%. Investment earnings for the year now stand at about \$5.2M for an annualized yield of 0.81%.

HELP fund:

o HELP fund balance on January 31st was about \$70.4M. There are currently four loans outstanding totalling about \$5.4M.

<u>ITEM 6: Financing Program – John Fink</u>

John provided information on a rule that has been proposed by the Securities and Exchange Commission that would have the effect of requiring appointed Board members or bond issuing entities to register as municipal advisors with the SEC.

ITEM 7: Multimodal Planning Division Report – Scott Omer

They are scheduled to finish the long range plan at the end of June. They will be having a policy committee meeting which generally is chaired by the Director and the members of the policy committee, the elected officials, mayors, and local communities throughout the state of Arizona. The policy committee meeting is coming up in March. They will also have public involvement that starts in March. An ADOT kickoff meeting was held for inner city rail on February 16th for

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ADOT senior staff as well as the consultants. There will be a stake holder kickoff meeting on March 10th.

ITEM 8: Priority Planning Advisory Committee (PPAC) – Scott Omer

Item 8b is a new project on US 89 in Coconino County in Flagstaff. It is emergency drainage repairs. It is an emergency project to restore and improve the drainage system within ADOT Right of Way on US 89 due to the July 10th fires in the area.

Motion to approve Items 8b – 8d made by Victor Flores and a second by Kelly Anderson, in a voice vote, motion carries.

Item 8e is for the City of Scottsdale Reliever Airport. It is the state and local sharer of the FAA grade and Item 8f is in Wickenburg, the Town of Wickenburg Public Airport.

Motion to approve Items 8e and 8f made by Steve Christy and a second by Bobbie Lundstrom, in a voice vote, motion carries.

ITEM 13: Sedona Route Transfer - PPAC – John McGee

- Item 13a is request for motion to return the project from FY 2013 to FY 2011 in the Highway Construction Program. This is part of the negotiations for Sedona Route Transfer.
- Item 13b is a request for approval of a debt service repayment for \$2,640,000.
- Item 13c A request for a motion directing Department staff to develop all documents necessary to accomplish the transfer of the Transfer Segment to the City of Sedona, conditioned on the City of Sedona's execution of the Transfer Agreement.

Motion to approve Items 13a – 13c (13a and 13b on a conditional basis) made by Steve Christy and a second by Kelly Anderson, in a voice vote, motion carries.

ITEM 9: State Engineer's Report – Floyd Roehrich

There are 123 projects in the program but the dollar amount has stayed relatively low compared to some years. The \$1.1B on the contract really has less than \$300M worth of work left to do. He provided follow-up on the Adopt a Highway program. They have decided to modify the policy and ook at is a way to make it incentive wise or make it more attractive for groups to do this more times a year.

<u>Chairman Feldmeier:</u> He would also like to have them come to one of the Board Meetings and have the Board recognize them for their special efforts and give them a certificate.

ITEM 10: Construction Contracts – Floyd Roehrich

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There are 11 projects on the projects listed for award this month. Three of them were a part of the Consent Agenda. A few of these that are on there are ARRA projects which were local government projects in the Towns of Buckeye, El Mirage, and Gilbert.

Motion to approve Items 10a, 10c, 10d, and 10g made by Steve Christy and a second by Bobbie Lundstrom, in a voice vote, motion carries.

The action requested today for Item 10b and 10h is to defer until the special board award to coincide with the Board Study Session on March 1st.

Motion to approve Item 10b and 10h deferred to the March 1st Special Board Meeting to coincide with the Study Session made by Bobbie Lundstrom and a second by Kelly Anderson, in a voice vote, motion carries.

Item 10f, is a project on SR77 in the City of Mammoth. There may be a possibility of an irregular bid, unbalanced bid that was submitted. The request is for a motion to defer this item to the March regular Board Meeting.

Motion to defer award discussion on Item 10f to March regular meeting made by Victor Flores and a second by Bobbie Lundstrom, in a voice vote, motion carries.

ITEM 11: 2012 – 2016 Tentative Program Review and Request for Approval for Public Comment – Scott Omer and Steve Hull

Opening Remarks

<u>Mayor Lynne Skelton:</u> She welcomes everyone to the town of Sahuarita. The Arizona Department of Transportation and the Town of Sahuarita share many years of good working relationships and dedicated individuals to bring such plans to commission. She thanks the Board and ADOT's staff for all their hard work and support and look forward to working with them as they improve the quality of life throughout this state.

Steve Christy: He speaks on behalf the Board in recognition for Mayor Skelton who has gone through some recent grief with the loss of her husband Dennis, yet she has maintained a grace under pressure and a certain dignity that is admirable as evidence by her presence here this morning and her continue to work for the people of Sahuarita and the region particularly as Chairing the Pima Association of Governments and the Regional Transportation Authority. On behalf of the Board and behalf of the residents of this community, he offers their sympathy and condolences and thanks for her continued work.

<u>ITEM A: FY2012 – 2016 Statewide Subprograms / ITEM B: FY2012 - 2016 Statewide Highway Construction Program / ITEM C: FY2012 – 2016 PAG Regional Highway Construction Program – Jennifer Toth</u>

The 5 year program is developed annually for the upcoming 5 years. It outlines how they are going to spend state / federal money throughout the next 5 years. It is approved annually and the fiscal year starts July 1st of the year.

If the 5 year program is taken with the MPO's and COG's who develop the transportation improvement program similar to a local jurisdiction for developing a capital improvement program. Then those programs then roll into the statewide transportation improvement. The 5 year program can be viewed as ADOT's TIP rolling into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program. The important thing to remember about the 5 year program and the steps is that they do have to be fiscally constrained. In particular, the first two years have to be fully

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funded projects or projects that are felt to be reasonably able to be advertised and funded at that level within those first two years. The elements of the program as it stands today are three separate sections within the 5 year tentative program. The first being highways and within that there are greater Arizona major projects, including the PAG (Pima Association of Government) major project. There are federal aide subprograms and subprograms in terms of the operations. A lot of those federal aide programs are programs that have very specific requirements and eligibility requirements for use within those funds such as the Transportation Enhancement Program or the Coordinated Border Infrastructure Program, things of that nature.

Revenues statewide continue to remain down and as many entities have had to do, ADOT is in a position where they have had to re-prioritize and defer some projects in order to keep the program fiscally constrained. They have gone through the old program updated project costs for those projects that were in the program. Having done that and having looked at the revenues for the next 5 years, they had to move \$112M out of the program. They have gone through and reduced a number of the subprograms, the majority of that being from pavement preservation \$31M was removed from the subprogram of pavement preservation over the 5 year timeframe and \$45M in terms of the district minor subprograms. The other subprograms were nickeled and dimed to come up with a total of \$35M that was reduced from other subprograms. In addition, some of the changes that will be seen from last year into this tentative program is that they have actually programmed out the pavement preservation and bridge programs. Normally those would be subprograms in fiscal 2012 and 2013 but they have included those projects in the program and programmed those out to those first years.

She will cover the changes from 2011 to 2015 program that comprised the tentative program. She will concentrate on the major projects. There are singular adjustments for either a project that was new or a project that was only deferred or a project that only had budget adjustments. To cover those, due to emerging needs they have proposed funding for I-15 bridge replacement starting with design in FY2012 and then programming construction in the years 2014 – 2016. In terms of deferral, on I-10, Earley Road to I-8, they have deferred \$19.4M from FY2013 out to FY2015 and updated that project estimate within the 5 year program. They would need an additional \$106M to fully fund that project. I-10 is a high priority for the department along with US 93 and I-17. In addition, they deferred SR 90 Central Avenue to Moson Road which is widening to a 5 lane section, to FY2013 – 2014. They re-budgeted the Sanders Port of Entry and that project is currently in FY2014 and they had to do a budget adjustment increasing that \$1M. The projects that are listed here have schedule and budget changes and there is one odd project in the middle that had some money advanced as part of that and deferred some of it. Currently they are undertaking a design concept report on I-17 from New River to Cordes Junction. This was brought into the program as initial funds for corridor improvement once the DCR is finalized. The estimated project costs for that entire corridor is upwards of \$500M. They have advanced \$3M in design money to FY2014 so they can start undertaking some disputes of segments in terms of designing those and they have deferred money out of the program for construction until they are able to program out and decide what those distinct project will be. On US 89 the Cameron section, they have advanced \$10M from FY2014 and they have \$17M in FY2015. They have moved that project up to FY2013 due to some issues associated with the bridge that they want to move forward with. They have increased that budget from \$27M up to \$35M. On US 93 Antelope Wash, that has advanced from FY2013 to 2012 and increased that budget by

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\$6.5M. On US 60, they have combined two projects one being the US 60 Silver Kings section and then the other being US 60 Superior Streets. They have deferred those projects out to FY2016 and have increased that budget from \$25M to \$60M in order to be able to move forward with that project. They are currently under design for both of those projects.

Projects that have been moved out of the program: On I-40, there is the Ranchos – Santa Fe Parkway. On June 17th, 2005, the State Transportation Board programmed \$500,000 in FY2006 to complete a scoping document for the first phase of that project. The design concept report and environmental document was completed in 2007. A letter of intent was signed between ADOT and the City of Kingman and approved by the State Transportation Board in December 2005 and the Board agreed to fund 70% of the construction at a cost of \$25.1M. At this time, they need to work on developing an intergovernmental agreement or a joint project agreement in order to be able to move forward with that project. At this time, they have moved that out until such time so that this could be negotiated with the City of Kingman. In addition on US 93, Carrow to Stevens and the corridor north of Wikieup has been improved to a four lane divided highway or have sections programmed to complete improvements with the exceptions of Carrow to Stevens and also the Cane Springs section. Antelope Wash is being kept in the program but needing to defer the Carrow to Stevens project in order to complete that corridor they will still need Carrow to Stevens as well as Cane Springs section.

On US 95 Avenue 9E to Avenue Road, the department completed a design concept report for that and that DCR ranges exactly that US 95 starting from Avenue 9E and approximately 6 miles east of the City of Yuma to continuing for 16 miles to just beyond the intersection of Aberdeen Road. Aberdeen does serve as the main entrance to the US Army Yuma Proving grounds, a major employer for the region. The project is located in Yuma County outside of the city limits. The 5 year highway construction program included \$10M in FY2012 and an additional \$10M in FY2013. The entire corridor is anticipated to be \$85M. They have asked the District Engineer to continue working with the communities to look at implement-able segments along that road to be able to reprogrammed in at a future date. In addition in that area, there is SR 195 San Luis II Port of Entry. Design for the state Port of Entry for San Luis II was funded in FY2004 and then construction was finished in September 2009. Based on an assessment from the Enforcement Clients Division which operates the Ports of Entry, they felt there were no further needs at the San Luis II Port of Entry. That project was moved out of the program.

The last project in greater Arizona is SR 260, the West Willis Extension. SR 260 is a main link between Payson, Show Low, and the Apache Sitgreaves National Forest, also the Sunrise Ski Area which is located on White Mountain Apache Reservation. This project would take a two lane roadway and improve it with turbaned gutter as well as widening that roadway. This project was added last year into FY2015 and is part of that program at an estimated cost of \$6.8M. Because it was one of the last projects to be added, it was moved out of the program.

PAG Regional Program: They have worked closely with PAG to move forward with what is in the tentative program. They have a deferred project, I-10 Marana Road to Ina Road. They have deferred design money which was about \$4M from FY2014 out to FY2015 and they renamed Marana to Cortero. In addition, they brought in a new design project on I-10 from Cortero Road to Ina Road in order to move forward with the I-10 project. They also brought in two new

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projects, SR 86 the San Isidro section which will widen drainage structures and shoulders in FY2012. That is a combination of ADOT funds and PAG 2.6 funds. Also on SR 86, there is the Santa Rosa section and that is in FY2012. They have also adjusted the budget on SR 86 to Kitt Peak and they had that in FY2012 and that project was increased from \$6.3M to \$15M.

Projects that have both schedule and budget changes are I-10 Ina Road TI and reconstructing that. They have deferred that from FY2011 to 2016 and increased that budget by \$5M. In addition, I-10 Cienega Creek to Marsh Station, they have deferred that from FY2011 to FY2012 and have increased that budget from \$9.8M to \$20M.

ITEM D: FY2012 – 2016 MAG Regional Highway Construction Program – Steve Hull

For the MAG area, projects in FY 2012-2015 of the current program are being carried forward into the tentative FY 2012-2016 program with minor adjustments to budget and schedules as follows:.

- Loop 303 from Thomas Road to Camelback Road in FY2012 is being reduced from \$72M to \$61.6 for a construction budget savings of about \$11M.
- Loop 303 from Camelback Road to Glendale Avenue in FY2013 has a construction budget reduction of about \$6M from \$62.9M down to \$56.2M.
- Loop 303 from Glendale Avenue to Peoria Avenue in FY2012 has a construction budget increase of about \$13M from \$113M to \$126M.
- Right of Way budget savings at the US 60 Grand Avenue / Loop 303 traffic interchange in FY2013, with a reduction from \$25M down to \$10M.
- I-17 from the Arizona Canal to Route 101, a general purpose lanes and drainage improvements project, is being deferred from FY2015 to FY2016
- Route 101 Pima Freeway, general purpose lanes from Shea to Loop 202 Red Mountain Freeway, is being advanced from FY2013 to FY2012.
- Route 101 Pima corridor, the Pima Road extension project is being deferred from FY2012 to FY2013.
- Loop 303 / I-10 traffic interchange landscaping construction will be deferred from 2013 to 2014.

Overall these are minor changes in budget and schedule for the MAG program. MAG will be addressing those changes in their April or July committee meetings for companion changes to their current five year program, the one exception being I-17, where MAG is asking us to hold off on moving that project to FY 2016 pending further review of the program later this year.

The proposed tentative five year program for the MAG area simply carries forward the current program along with those relatively minor changes. The fifth year that is shown in the handout for the tentative 5 year program includes FY 2016 projects from the MAG 20 year plan. However, MAG is under the constraint that the entire prop 400 regional Freeway program through FY 2026, including the tentative five year program, must be fiscally constrained. With revenue having declined since MAG did a rebalance of the program two years ago, the MAG area program once again needs to be rebalanced. The overall cost for the tentative program for the MAG area, if the FY 2016 fifth year projects were adopted, would be \$2.8 billion. Under that scenario the cash flow balance by the end of FY2016 would fall to a negative balance of nearly

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\$700 million, so the proposed tentative MAG five year program is not fiscally constrained. Accordingly, MAG is beginning the process to defer some projects out of FY2014, FY2015, and FY2016 to future years to bring costs and revenue back in balance. This is a process that will take some time and will not be done in time for MAG to adopt a FY2012 – 2016 program. They will instead wait and adopt an FY 2013 – 2017 program sometime next year. In the interim, we can continue to adopt schedule and budget adjustments to FY 2012-2015 MAG area projects as needed, but for now will not adopt any MAG projects for FY2016 and will hold off on moving the I-17 project from FY 2015 to 2016 until MAG has studied the broader issue of how to rebalance the program and which projects to defer.

ITEM E: FY2012 – 2016 Airport Development Program – Jennifer Toth

65 airports have submitted 840 projects worth about \$1.6B in total over the 5 years. The five year programs are shown in priority order specifically for FY2012. If the legislature diverts aviation funds, they will need to change the priority of this moving the airport pavement preservation up above the state local grants. They have deferred the pavement preservation over the past few years to the redirection of funds and it is extremely important that they move forward in assessing the payment of the airports runway system. Representing 5 years with a very conservative approach with increasing the aviation fund back to its full capacity by the year 2016 and dividing that into the 5 different subprograms as noted earlier.

Call to the Audience

<u>Charlene Fitzgerald, Executive Director of YMPO:</u> During these challenging times, they hope that the Board will keep in consideration the extremely important projects that they are looking at that would be in Yuma County.

Steve Stratton: He urges the Board to reconsider and not defer the Silver Kings section of 260.

<u>Sheldon Miller:</u> He is a resident of Globe and he represents Gila County and he wants to comment on US 60 being deferred and ask that if there is any way that this could be moved back into 2013 that this is done.

Call to the Audience

Mayor Anthony Smith, Town of Maricopa: Spoke in support of I-11, environmental impact statement. He realizes the city of Maricopa is not in a target area for the proposed EIS, however, he strongly supports this effort. Pinal County, Casa Grande and the city of Maricopa are paying for a DCR for an East – West corridor study along the path of the future I-11 project. As mayor and a citizen of this great state, he encourages the Boards support of this vitally needed project.

<u>John Liosatos</u>, <u>Planning Director from PAG</u>: They appreciate the work that Todd Emery and his staff did on getting the Twin Peaks TIA completed. They appreciate that the SR 86 projects got back into the program.

Meg Radigan, Health Educator: She is here with Maricopa County Public Health Department to support the state route plan for injury prevention and health overall.

<u>Annie McGreevy:</u> She thanks the Board for changing the Adopt-A-Highway policy with no cost to ADOT. If each district Adopt-A-Highway staff could contact the groups that gave up their permits in the past, they would now be glad to sign up again to help ADOT keep Arizona's shoulders clean and beautiful. She thanks the Board for responding to her plea in December in Nogales.

<u>Jordan Feld, Arizona Airports Association:</u> On behalf of the Tucson Airport Authority, he thanks Ms. Toth for working with the Arizona Airports Association in developing an airport development program.

<u>Barbara Warren:</u> She addresses the benefits to human health of developing the rail system to accommodate a much more effective interstate transportation of people. She urges the Board to approve the state rail plan today and to take steps toward better protecting the state's public health and be sure to include the health impact assessments with the positive changes that can be made.

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Serena Unrein, PIRG Education Fund: She is here to support the state rail plan. The state rail plan is a visionary document that will help to bring better transportation options to Arizona and the Arizona PIRG Education fund supports this plan in efforts to expand passenger rail in the state. More than 1,000 Arizonan's signed the petition supporting the state rail plan and a number of organizations across the state also wanted to note their support and a number of more than 70 businesses endorsed passenger rail between Phoenix and Tucson.

ITEM 1: District Engineer's Report – Todd Emery, Tucson District Engineer

Currently there are 14 projects in the Tucson district as a whole for around \$102M right now that are being worked.

- SR 86, milepost 141 reservation boundary is being widened...
- Lukeville Port of Entry adding two booths and two lanes to help facilitate traffic in and out of the port. They estimate it to be complete in August 2011.
- Widening I-10 to four lanes in each direction and also the full reconstruction of the Prince Road railroad track interchange. It is currently estimated that this will be \$126M. They are hopeful that it will advertise in April at this time.
- Another upcoming project is phase 3 of Marsh Station. That project is scheduled right now to advertise on August of this year. This is currently estimated at \$20M.
- SR 86 several projects, phase 5, phase 6, and phase 7 are all scheduled to go to construction before the end of FY2012 just before the end of June 30th of next year
- SR 77 from Tangerine to the Pinal County line will be expanded from a 4 lane facility to a 6 lane facility divided. Currently this is at \$32M. Hopefully it will go to construction in FY2013.

There is an addition to the Consent Agenda which is Item 3n on construction contracts.

<u>John McGee</u>: Mentioned a noteworthy Right of Way resolution within the Consent Agenda (p. 57) for the Prescott – Flagstaff; Rimrock – Sedona SR 89A / SR 179. This is a resolution for the turn back of the transfer segment under the transfer agreement that was recently completed with the city of Sedona which is contingent upon certain items to be discussed under Agenda Item 9.

Motion to approve Consent Agenda made by Kelly Anderson and a second by Bobbie Lundstrom, in a voice vote, motion carries.

ITEM 4: Legislative Report – Eileen Colleran

FEDERAL

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FY 2011 Appropriation – A short term Continuing Resolution (CR) was passed through March 18 and a second CR will be passed through April 8 while the House and Senate work out their differences on the House introduced bill HR 1 which would provide funding through the rest of the federal fiscal year (September 30, 2011). HR 1 was defeated in the Senate who was unhappy with the proposed cuts in the bill.

FY 2012 Appropriation – The House and Senate have held hearing on the President's 2012 budget recommendations. For transportation, both houses have had questions regarding where the funding would come from. The Administration has not offered any ideas or information on how funding would be found.

SAFETEA-LU Reauthorization -- President introduces a 6 year reauthorization proposal which includes \$556 billion with \$50 billion "Up-Front" economic boost that would foster job creation and a \$5 billion Infrastructure Bank. There have been no recommendations on how to pay for the bill. The Administration will be coming out with further details on their reauthorization proposal sometime next week.

Congressman Mica completed field hearings and also asked a small number of DOT directors to meet with him and provide input on the next authorization bill. He is targeting having a bill to the floor by August.

Senator Boxer, Chair of the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee continues work on her piece of the reauthorization bill. She is targeting have the bill heard in committee before Memorial Day.

FAA Reauthorization - The Senate continues hearing S 223 on the floor. The House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee introduced HR 658 last week. The House has targeted the end of the month to hear the bill on the floor.

STATE

The Senate passed their budget late Wednesday. The House has been meeting in small groups, sub-appropriation committees. They are still watching a couple of bills related to political signs being placed in the right way except for on controlled access highways, as well as, House bill 2577 on legislative appropriations of federal moneys, Senate bill 1215, public meetings call to the public which made a small change from "may" to "shall" for all public bodies to actually have a call to the public. Finally, Senate bill 1270 passed the House Transportation Committee.

ITEM 5: Financial Report – John Fink

Highway User Revenue Funds revenues are up. With gas tax, they are still not seeing any signs with the effect of rising fuel prices. Regional Area Road Funds: There is no RARF report. Aviation fund revenues are up. Investment earnings: Money continues to be invested and no money being earned on it. The HELP fund has \$70.4M in the bank.

ITEM 6: Financing Program – John Fink

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The Securities Exchange Commission proposing a rule that would require the Board members to register as municipal advisors. As was mentioned at the last meeting, they are going to be sending a letter to be signed by both Director Halikowski and the Chairman. The SEC received a large number of comment letters relative to the proposed rule, which are posted on the website. He will keep the Board updated as more is learned.

ITEM 7: Multimodal Planning Division Report – Jennifer Toth (No report given)

ITEM 8: Priority Planning Advisory Committee (PPAC) – Jennifer Toth

Item 8a - 8b are adjusting the program to pull out utilities from the construction line item. They are starting to program out phases within a particular project per the federal regulations. There are also 5 pavement preservation projects throughout the state and one drainage project on US 160 at the junction of 89. At this time the staff recommends approval of Items 8a - 8h.

Motion to approve Items 8a – 8h made by Felipe Zubia and a second by Kelly Anderson, in a voice vote, motion carries.

ITEM 9: Sedona Route Transfer Update – John McGee

The Board is aware that on February 22^{nd} , the city of Sedona City Council did vote 4/3 to accept the transfer agreement and the route transfer. As required into that agreement, they have given the city a 30 day notice that they will be transferring the funding that was agreed to under that agreement to the city on April 11^{th} .

Agenda Item 9a is a recommendation that the Board increase the funding for the Andante project from \$400,000 to \$900,000 so that they can move forward with the advertisement on that project just as soon as possible.

Motion to approve Item 9a made by Steve Christy and a second by Bobbie Lundstrom, in a voice vote, motion carries.

ITEM 10: State Engineer's Report – Floyd Roehrich

There are 118 projects spread throughout the state. Out of the \$1.2B under contract, there is approx. \$400M left to perform. There was a major incident on I-10 this week in the eastern Arizona that caused a fire underneath the overpass crossover at I-10. They are in the process of finalizing the assessment, determining the damage to the crossroad. As of this time, the crossroad is still closed and did receive some pretty significant damage. They feel they can make some emergency repairs to keep the bridge intact as they look for a longer term fix.

ITEM 11: Construction Contracts – Floyd Roehrich

There are 13 contracts to award today, 6 were awarded on the Consent Agenda including the one emergency project on US 89 that the federal government has authorized. Contract items Items 11a – 11g require separate Board action. Items are Item 11d and Item 11f are being protested.

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Motion to approve Items 11a, 11b, 11c, 11e, and 11g made by Victor Flores and a second by Bobbie Lundstrom, in a voice vote, motion carries.

Motion to approve Items 11f made by Steve Christy and a second by Bobbie Lundstrom, in a voice vote, motion carries.

ITEM 12: Acceptance of State Rail Plan – Jennifer Toth

They have presented the draft state rail plan to the Board at the Study Session in January. At that time, she discussed three specific areas, the passenger rail service, network requirements including freight, and then safety and congestion mitigation. They also covered short-term, intermediate, and long-term implementation strategies including funding options.

Staff recommends acceptance of the state rail plan in order to submit to the Federal Railroad Administration.

Motion to approve Item 12 made by Bobbie Lundstrom and a second by Steve Christy, in a voice vote, motion carries.

ITEM 15: Routing of Traffic from Boulder City, Nevada to Bullhead City, Arizona – Bill Feldmeier

After hearing concerns of Mayor Jack Hakim of Bullhead City about increased truck traffic through Bullhead City and safety concerns of the citizens, Chairman Feldmeier proposed a resolution of support for Bullhead City in finding a long-term resolution.

Motion to approve Item 15 made by Steve Christy and a second by Felipe Zubia, in a voice vote, motion carries.

Dear Board Member:

The attached information is for your review. It is our intention to present a lease for information and possible action at the April 2011 State Transportation Board meeting.

ADOT initiated a leasing program in November of 1995 with the passage of Board adopted policy as required by ARS §28-7048 (formerly ARS § 1865.01). ARS §28-7048 specifically allows the lease of right-of-way within the highway control of access. Since that time the Department has actively been leasing sites to all of the major cellular providers as well as consummating a few other innovative leasing projects. This program differs from the Right-of-Way Group's leasing program because active highway property (property within the control of access) is under the control of the District Engineer. It is land needed for highway operational purposes and cannot be sold as excess land.

At the April 2011 Board meeting, we will be presenting a Master Lease Agreement received from LightSquared, LP for wireless communications sites. Information is enclosed, along with a copy of the lease agreement, for your review.

MASTER LEASE AGREEMENT FOR LIMITED ACCESS RIGHT OF WAY

LESSEE: LightSquared LP, a Delaware limited partnership

LEASE: #XM0018

The State of Arizona, by and through the <u>Arizona Department of Transportation</u>, hereinafter referred to as LESSOR, subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein, does hereby lease to LightSquared LP, a Delaware limited partnership, hereinafter referred to as LESSEE, the Premises more particularly described herein. LESSEE desires to lease the Premises from LESSOR upon the following terms and conditions. This Master Lease ("Master Lease" or "Lease") is entered into by the parties pursuant to A.R.S. §28-7048

1. Master Lease

LESSEE may lease several sites ("Sites") from LESSOR for the operation of its Facilities, as herein defined. The lease of each Site shall be pursuant to an Individual Site Agreement which shall be attached to this Master Lease and incorporated herein. Each Individual Site Agreement shall be subject to and governed by the terms and conditions of this Master Lease, unless otherwise set forth in the Individual Site Agreement.

2. Term

3. Rental Rate

The initial rental rate shall be One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000) per month, per Site, paid annually in advance, as hereinafter defined.

In accepting the Lease, the LESSEE agrees to timely pay all taxes and assessments of any kind which may be levied against the Premises, which are directly attributable to Licensee use of the Premises. The initial payment of rent shall be due and payable commencing on the first day of the month following the issuance of ADOT permits. All subsequent payments shall be due and payable annually, on that date, each successive year thereafter. The rent shall be paid by check or cashier's check payable to the Arizona Department of Transportation. The rent shall be subject to adjustment every five years. The rent for each renewal period shall be increased by 20% of the amount of the annual rent payable during the preceding renewal period. LESSOR agrees to notify LESSEE by certified mail sixty (60) days prior to the effective date of any adjustment in the rent. Upon termination of this Lease or the applicable Individual Site Agreement by LESSOR, LESSOR

will refund, without interest, the unused portion of any pre-paid rent, if any remains owing after deducting appropriate fees and other costs. Prorated rents shall be calculated on a 360 day year basis. LESSEE shall be in default hereunder if rent is not paid within fifteen (15) days after such rent is due. LESSEE shall pay five (5%) percent per day of the current monthly rental rate as a late charge for each day the rent remains unpaid after the fifteen (15) day period.

4. Security Deposit

Upon execution of each Individual Site Agreement, LESSEE agrees to deposit with LESSOR the sum of One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000) per Site, as a guarantee for faithful performance of the terms and conditions of this Lease and the applicable Individual Site Agreement. If at any time Lessee fails to keep and perform any or all of the terms, covenants and conditions of this Lease and the applicable Individual Site Agreement, including without limitation the payment of rent, and any other expenses, fees and costs, LESSOR may, at its sole option, appropriate and apply all or any portion of the security deposit applicable to the Individual Site Agreement to the payment of any such amounts. Upon termination of this Lease or the Individual Site Agreement and LESSEE'S vacating the applicable Premises, LESSOR shall return, without interest, any remaining portion of said deposit.

5. Use of Premises

The LESSEE has the right to use the Premises only for the construction, installation, operation, and maintenance therein of the facility described in Exhibit B (the "Facility"), and as shown in the Site Plan set forth on Exhibit C (the "Site Plan") both of which are attached to the Individual Site Agreements and are incorporated herein by this reference. The Site Plan shall be approved in advance by LESSOR, which approval shall not be unreasonably delayed or withheld. The LESSEE shall not use the Premises for any other purpose without the specific written prior permission of the LESSOR. Any other use of the Premises shall constitute a material breach and default of this Lease. LESSOR makes no representations as to the status of the Premises, including title, easement, or other restrictions, or its fitness for a particular use. LESSEE shall conduct all investigations necessary to determine if the Premises are fit for the intended use.

LESSEE shall have the right to provide or have provided to the Premises necessary public utility service (electric, gas, water, sewer and telephone service) and such necessary wires, cables, pipes, conduits, lines, ducts and such other equipment as either LESSEE or LESSOR may consider appropriate, the installation and use cost of which public utility services shall be borne by the party requiring same. While the LESSEE is applying for electric service from the local utility company for a Site, it may temporarily, for up to sixty (60) days, use ADOT electricity, where available, and pay to ADOT \$300.00 per month, per Site, or an amount as modified in an Individual Site Agreement, for the electricity consumed. In the event provision of such services to LESSEE requires use of a portion of the contiguous or adjacent right-of-way of the LESSOR other than the Premises, such use shall only be made upon prior written approval of the LESSOR, which shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. LESSOR shall cooperate with LESSEE, at no expense to LESSOR, in LESSEE'S efforts to obtain such public utility services as shown on the applicable Site Plan.

The Facility shall be operated in accordance with prevailing standards and criteria established by the applicable governing agencies and without creating or causing to be created, nuisances or hazards to the public health or safety or interfering with the rights or business activities of other tenants. LESSEE further agrees not to commit, or permit the commission of, any act or thing on the Premises which is a violation of any local ordinance or of any law of the State of Arizona or the United States. LESSEE shall access the leased

Premises from access points as directed or approved by the LESSOR'S District personnel or as shown on the approved Site Plan. Normally, LESSEE shall not be given access to the leased Premises from the highway or interfere with the operations of the highway facility without the express permission from LESSOR. LESSEE shall provide appropriate traffic control approved by LESSOR'S District personnel.

The LESSEE shall develop its Sites in a manner that will facilitate the improvement of wireless communications services and enhance the safety and efficiency of the State's transportation systems and facilities. The LESSOR and the LESSEE agree that the State will benefit from the introduction and enhancement of telecommunications services that may include, but are not limited to, the possible introduction of general mobile telephone service, 911 or 311 emergency telephone service, vehicle identification service, a surveillance and guidance system, personal communications services, standard paging services and the emergency paging services useful to firefighters and EMS personnel. Notwithstanding anything herein, LESSEE makes no representation, warranty or covenant concerning the possible introduction or enhancement of safety or efficiency to the State's transportation systems and facilities that may arise out of the development and operation of the Sites.

LESSOR covenants that upon LESSEE'S paying rent and performing all of the covenants and conditions set forth in this Lease and the applicable Individual Site Agreement, LESSEE shall peaceably and quietly have, hold and enjoy the Premises unless otherwise provided in this Lease.

6. Maintenance of Premises

LESSEE shall maintain the Premises in good repair and condition during the term of the Lease and the applicable Individual Site Agreement. LESSOR shall have the right to enter the Premises, except for LESSEE'S equipment shelters and cabinets, at reasonable times for the purpose of making necessary inspections, repairs and performing maintenance of LESSOR equipment, if any. LESSEE acknowledges LESSOR shall have no responsibility for LESSEE'S Facility in the event of an emergency or any other condition that my arise. The LESSEE shall provide detailed plans to LESSOR describing how the Facility will be maintained, including a proposed schedule for both routine and emergency maintenance.

LESSOR will not participate in any costs for maintenance of the Premises, unless otherwise stated in writing. In the event that LESSEE, its agents, representatives, employees or invitees, damages any property or facilities owned or maintained by LESSOR, LESSEE shall immediately pay for the costs of repairing or replacing the damaged property or facilities. Should the Facility extend outside the Premises, and be damaged by another entity during excavation and/or maintenance of another facility, LESSEE will be responsible for all costs of repair or replacement of its damaged property. Except under emergency conditions, LESSEE shall give at least forty-eight (48) hours notice of its intent to enter the right of way for installation or maintenance of the Facility. LESSEE shall complete all emergency repairs immediately.

LESSEE shall maintain the Premises in a neat, clean and orderly condition at all times and shall not permit debris to accumulate at any time. LESSEE shall not commit, suffer, or permit any waste of said property or any acts to be committed in violation of any laws or ordinances. LESSEE shall provide adequate weed and dust control on the Premises. LESSEE shall close and lock all gates whenever entering or exiting the Premises.

7. Additional Leases

LESSOR reserves the right to lease any of the Premises subject to this Lease to other entities for installation of additional facilities. LESSEE shall make no claim against LESSOR

for damages or for the prevention of such additional leases. Notwithstanding the foregoing, LESSOR shall not permit the installation of any future equipment which results in radio frequency interference to LESSEE or with LESSEE'S access and operation of the then existing equipment of LESSEE'S Facility.

Additionally, LESSEE shall exercise reasonable effort to co-develop Facilities with qualified, compatible users, or allow collocation on their already constructed Facilities unless collocation will result in interference with the operations, communication systems, microwave antennas or other equipment of the LESSOR, other government agencies or the LESSEE. LESSEE'S standard collocation application process shall be used to determine feasibility and compatibility. The LESSEE may charge a fee for collocation, under written agreements. Copies of the agreements between the LESSEE and the third parties shall be provided to the LESSOR. Any collocation or co-development of Facilities by LESSEE shall be subject to prior approval by LESSOR. Notwithstanding the foregoing, LESSEE shall not collocate or co-develop a Site unless LESSOR has selected a third party for collocation pursuant to a competitive bid process. More than one compatible third party may be selected to occupy the Premises. All third party leases shall be subject to the same terms, term, conditions, and renewal periods as the original LESSEE. The Lease amount shall be determined through the bid process.

Notwithstanding anything herein, however, LESSEE shall obtain the prior written consent of LESSOR, and any ADOT permits that may be required, for modification or upgrades that change the size, function, or operation of the Facility, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

8. Lessor use of the Facility

LESSEE agrees to allow the LESSOR to install equipment, for LESSOR'S use, on any tower owned by LESSEE. It is acknowledged by both parties that the LESSOR shall not be required to pay to the LESSEE any rental, license or other fee in exchange for the right to occupy such a Facility. It is also acknowledged by both parties: 1) the LESSOR'S use must be compatible with and not create technical interference problems with the LESSEE'S then existing use; 2) the LESSOR shall obtain LESSEE'S comments regarding equipment compatibility in writing prior to installation of any such equipment, which comments shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. LESSEE reserves the right to review the ADOT list of contractors pre-qualified to perform the equipment installation; and 3) all costs of all such installations, maintenance and removal will be the sole responsibility of the LESSOR.

The LESSOR may seek to provide the traveling public with wireless telephone access to traveler information lines. If the LESSOR does so, the LESSEE shall make reasonable efforts to provide the traveling public with wireless telephone access to information lines. The LESSEE shall create a cost-free access line identified as 911, 311, or a similar designation. LESSEE's obligation to make reasonable efforts to provide the traveling public with wireless telephone access to information lines and to create a cost-free access line identified as 911, 311, or a similar designation as provided in this paragraph 8 is only enforceable against LESSEE if LESSEE begins to offer wireless voice service to members of the general public or individual subscribers directly.

9. Cancellation Clause

This Lease is subject to cancellation by the Governor pursuant to A.R.S. 38-511.

10. Improvements to Premises

Except as authorized by the Lease, no permanent structures or facilities of any kind shall be erected or moved upon or within the Premises by the LESSEE without the express written prior permission of the LESSOR. Any such structure/facilities erected or moved upon or within the Premises without the express written consent of the LESSOR may be immediately removed by LESSOR at the expense of LESSEE.

LESSOR, at its option, upon termination or expiration of the Lease or an Individual Site Agreement, may require removal of the improvements from the applicable Site. If removal of the improvements damages the Premises, LESSEE, at LESSEE'S expense shall replace or repair any such damage prior to the termination or expiration of this Lease or an Individual Site Agreement. At LESSOR'S option, if LESSEE does not require the removal of the improvements, the improvements, excluding the electronics and other technical equipment, shall become the property of LESSOR upon termination or expiration of this Lease.

11. Performance

LESSEE shall complete the construction of any improvements on a Site within six (6) months after obtaining all necessary permits and authorizations, unless otherwise agreed by the parties. Unless otherwise agreed by the parties, if LESSEE fails to complete said construction within the six (6) month time period, LESSOR shall have the option of terminating the Lease or the applicable Individual Site Agreement or extending the time frame for construction. If the improvements are not timely completed, LESSEE shall be liable for any damages which may arise due to such failure to timely complete the Facility.

12. Zoning and Permits Required

If required, LESSEE shall obtain proper zoning clearance and/or building permits from all governmental agencies having jurisdiction over the Premises and the intended use, including ADOT District approval, prior to the start of construction of any Facility. LESSEE shall diligently pursue the issuance of all required permits and approvals pursuant to this Lease. LESSEE shall submit applications for all permits and authorizations within ninety (90) days after execution of an Individual Site Agreement unless otherwise agreed to by LESSOR. ADOT District personnel must be notified prior to performing any Facility work on the Premises. LESSEE shall have maintenance plans approved by the LESSOR and make them a part of this Lease, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. ADOT Permits will be issued for each job site upon application by LESSEE and approval by LESSOR'S District personnel.

The LESSEE shall provide construction plans and specifications for each Site or Site type to the LESSOR for approval, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. The LESSEE shall submit "as-built" plans for the Facility to ADOT within six (6) months of its completion.

ADOT may rely exclusively on the as-built plans to locate the Facility in conducting any excavation in the Premises for transportation purposes. The LESSOR and Federal Highways Administration specifically reserve the right to enter the Premises, except for LESSEE'S equipment shelters and cabinets, at any and all reasonable times for survey or preliminary engineering studies.

13. Mechanics Liens

LESSEE shall keep the Premises free from any liens arising from work performed, materials furnished or obligations incurred by LESSEE and shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend LESSOR from any liens and encumbrances arising from any work performed or materials furnished by or at the direction of LESSEE. Upon completion of any construction activity, copies of signed lien waivers shall be supplied to LESSOR.

14. Untenantable Premises Due to Damage

In the event the Premises are partially or completely destroyed by flood, accident or acts of God, LESSOR shall have the option to allow repair or restoration, if reasonably practicable, of said Premises or terminate the applicable Individual Site Agreement by delivering written Notice of Immediate Termination to LESSEE. At LESSOR'S option, and at LESSEE'S sole expense, the LESSEE may relocate the Facility to a new location within close proximity to the original location, provided such relocation does not interfere with any existing or planned use on the Premises.

15. Liability

LESSEE shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the State of Arizona, LESSOR, and their elected or appointed officials, agents, boards, commissions, employees and representatives (collectively "LESSOR") from all lawsuits, including without limitation attorneys' fees and costs of litigation, actions, loss, damage, expense, cost, claims or liability of any character or any nature (including without limitation punitive damages) arising out of or in connection with (i) any act or omission of the LESSEE, its agents, employees, representatives, invitees, successors and assigns (collectively "LESSEE"), and of any subcontractor of LESSEE, its agents and employees, in any way arising out of or resulting from any activity of LESSEE on the leased Premises which results directly or indirectly in the injury to or death of any person or persons or the damage of any property of any person. persons, or entity, or (ii) the failure of the LESSEE or those acting under LESSEE to conform to any statutes, ordinances, regulations, executive orders, laws or court decrees, or this Lease, or (iii) any mechanics', materialman's liens and/or liens of a like nature, or any other liens or encumbrances. It is the intent of LESSEE and LESSOR that LESSOR shall, in all instances, except for loss or damage resulting from the sole active negligence of LESSOR, be indemnified by LESSEE against all liability, losses and damages of any nature whatever for or on account of any injuries to or death of persons or damages to or destruction of property belonging to any person arising out of or in any way connected with LESSEE'S activity on the Premises, or this Lease. LESSEE shall give to LESSOR prompt notice of any claim made or suit instituted which in any way directly or indirectly affects or might affect LESSOR, and LESSOR shall have the right to compromise and defend the same to the extent of its own interest. LESSOR shall have the right, but not the duty, to participate in the defense of any claim or litigation with attorneys of LESSOR'S selection without relieving LESSEE of any obligations hereunder. LESSEE'S obligations hereunder shall survive any termination of this Lease or LESSEE'S activities on the Premises.

16. Insurance

- a. <u>Liability Insurance</u> Throughout the term and renewal terms of this Lease and the term and renewal terms of each Individual Site Agreement, LESSEE, at its expense, shall provide and maintain general public liability, motor vehicle liability and property damage insurance with limits of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000)
- b. <u>Insurance Policies</u> In the event that LESSEE fails to satisfy the insurance requirements set forth in this Lease, LESSOR, at LESSOR'S option, upon ten days advance written notice to LESSEE, shall have the right to secure the required insurance at the expense of LESSEE, or terminate this Lease. LESSEE shall deliver to LESSOR prior to its occupancy of the leased Premises certificates of insurance evidencing the requirements set forth herein. All policies shall be issued from companies authorized to do business in the State of Arizona and in a form acceptable to LESSOR. The policies shall include LESSOR and the State of

Arizona as additional insureds. The insurance policies shall provide that written notice of cancellation or of any material change shall be delivered to LESSOR by the issuing company or companies at least thirty (30) days in advance of the effective date thereof. LESSEE shall increase the aforesaid limits of coverage in the policies upon the written demand of LESSOR, provided that such increases are deemed reasonable and necessary by LESSOR, or required by law. Any such aforesaid limits maybe provided by an umbrella policy. Any enumeration of specific insurance coverages and amounts shall not limit or restrict the comprehensive indemnity covenant set forth in this Lease.

17. Compliance with Environmental Laws

LESSEE shall, at LESSEE'S own expense, comply with all present and hereinafter enacted Environmental Laws, and any amendments thereto, affecting LESSEE'S operation on the Premises. LESSEE shall immediately notify LESSOR should it receive any correspondence or communication from any governmental entity regarding the application of Environmental Laws to the Premises or LESSEE'S operation on the leased Premises. LESSOR shall immediately notify LESSEE should it receive any correspondence or communication from any governmental entity regarding the application of Environmental Laws to the Premises or LESSEE'S operation on the leased Premises. Any environmental assessments, studies, or audits known by LESSOR, may be disclosed to third parties as a result of public disclosure laws, and will be disclosed to other state and federal agencies that are concerned with the enforcement of environmental laws and regulations.

a. "Environmental Laws" mean any one or all of the following as the same may be amended from time to time: The Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act, 42 U.S.C. Section 9601 et seq; the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, 42 U.S.C. Section 6941 et seq.; the Toxic Substance Control Act, 15 U.S.C. Section 2601 et seq.; the Safe Drinking Water Act, 42 U.S.C. Section 300 h et seq.; the Clean Water Act, 33 U.S.C. Section 1251 et seq.; the Clean Air Act 42 U.S.C. Section 7401 et seq.; the Arizona Environmental Quality Act, A.R.S. Section 49-201 et seq.; the Arizona Underground Storage Tank Regulation statute, A.R.S. Section 49-921 et seq.; the Arizona Underground Storage Tank Regulation statute, A.R.S. Section 49-1001 et seq.; and the regulations promulgated under each of the above laws and any other laws, regulations and ordinances (whether enacted by the local, state, or federal government) now in effect or hereinafter enacted that deal with the regulation or protection of the environment, including the ambient air, ground water, surface water, and land use, including substrata land.

18. Environmental Waste Indemnification by LESSEE

LESSEE shall indemnify and hold harmless LESSOR, its officials, employees, boards, commission, agents and representatives from and against any and all loss, damage, and expense (including, but not limited to, reasonable investigation, legal fees and costs) including but not limited to any claim or action for injury liability, or damage to persons or property, and any and all claims or actions brought by any person, firm, governmental body, or other entity, alleging or resulting from or arising from or in connection with contamination of or adverse effects on the environment, or violation of an Environmental Law or other statute, ordinance, rule, regulation, judgment, or order of any government or judicial entity, and from and against any damages, liabilities, costs, and penalties which arise or result from LESSEE'S use, activity, omission or operation on the Premises during the term of this Lease. LESSEE'S obligations and liabilities under this paragraph shall continue so long as LESSOR bears any liability or responsibility under the Environmental Laws for any action that occurred on the Premises. LESSEE'S failure to abide by the terms of this paragraph

shall be restrainable by injunction. The term "LESSEE" shall include LESSEE'S agents, employees, representatives, invitees, successors and assigns.

19. Sale of Premises by Lessor

In the event LESSOR desires to sell the Premises, LESSEE will make no claim to prevent such sale. The sale shall be subject to the terms and conditions of the Lease, including the applicable Individual Site Agreements. Any transfer of ownership of, or rights in, the Premises by the LESSOR to any other governmental agency shall be subject to this Lease. LESSOR shall advise LESSEE in writing of any such sale.

20. Assignment

LESSEE may assign all of its rights, duties and obligations under this Lease and the applicable Individual Site Agreement, or sublet all or any portion of the Premises: (i) to any entity controlled by, controlling, or under common control with LightSquared LP, (ii) to any other entity now or in the future listed in the "LightSquared" corporation directories, (iii) to any entity which acquires all or substantially all of LESSEE'S assets in the area of the Premises by reason of a merger, acquisition or other business reorganization, provided, for section (iii) only, that LESSEE obtains LESSOR'S consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld or denied. In the event of any assignment of the Lease by LESSEE, LESSEE shall NOT be relieved of liability under any and all of its covenants and obligations contained in or derived from the Lease.

Additionally, LESSEE may, with written notice to LESSOR, mortgage or grant a security interest in this Lease (including the Individual Site Agreements) and LESSEE'S equipment, and may assign this Lease (including the Individual Site Agreements) and LESSEE'S equipment to any mortgagees, deed of trust beneficiaries, or holders of security interest, including their successors or assigns, (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Mortgagees" and individually as "Mortgagees"), provided such Mortgagees agree to be bound by the terms and provisions of this Lease. In addition, LESSOR agrees that a Mortgagee shall have the same rights and obligations as LESSEE under this Lease to cure any default and, with prior written notice to LESSOR, to remove any property of LESSEE or Mortgagee located on the Premises. Lessor hereby subordinates to any of Lessee's Mortgagees any lien rights Lessor may now or hereafter have concerning the Facility. Lessee shall hold title to the Facility and the Facility shall remain Lessee's personal property and are not fixtures.

21. Nondiscrimination Regulations

The Lessee, for itself, its successors in interest and assigns, as a part of the consideration hereof, does hereby covenant and agree, as a covenant running with the land:

- (a) That no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, creed, sex, religion, age, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or be other wise subjected to discrimination in the use of said facilities;
- (b) That in connection with the construction of any improvements on, over or under such land, and the furnishings of any services thereon, no person on the grounds of race, color, creed, sex, age, or national origin shall be excluded from participation, denied the benefits of, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination.
- (c) LESSEE shall use the Premises in compliance with all other requirements imposed by or pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation Effectuation of

Title VI of Civil Rights Act of 1964, and as said Regulation may be amended. In the event of breach of any of the above nondiscrimination covenants, LESSOR shall have the right to terminate this Lease and to reenter and repossess the Premises and remove LESSEE therefrom.

(d) That the Lessee shall use the Premises in compliance with all other requirements imposed pursuant to Title 15, Code of Federal Regulations, Commerce and Foreign Trade, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary of Commerce, part 8 (15 C.F.R., Part B), and as said Regulations may be amended.

22. Default by Lessee; Lessor's remedies

- a. <u>Default.</u> Each of the following occurrences shall constitute an event of default hereunder ("Default"):
 - 1. LESSEE shall fail to pay any rent, additional charges or any sum within fifteen (15) days after same are due hereunder or under the applicable Individual Site Agreement, unless a different time period is otherwise specified herein or in the applicable Individual Site Agreement.
 - 2. The failure or refusal of LESSEE to observe or perform any of the non-monetary convenants, terms and conditions of this Lease and such failure shall continue for a period of thirty (30) days after delivery by the LESSOR of written notice thereof, unless a different time period is otherwise specified herein, or approved by LESSOR, if LESSEE commences action to cure the Default within such 30 day period and proceeds with due diligence to fully cure the Default.
- b. <u>Remedies</u>. In addition to any other rights and remedies LESSOR may have or has by present or future law or hereunder, LESSOR shall have the following rights and remedies upon any default of LESSEE.
 - 1. LESSOR shall have the right, at its election, to re-enter the Premises or any part thereof, either with or without process of law, and to expel, remove and eject LESSEE and all persons occupying under LESSEE. No re-entry by LESSOR shall be deemed an acceptance of a surrender of this Lease, nor shall it absolve or discharge LESSEE from any liability under this Lease. Upon such re-entry, all rights of LESSEE to occupy or possess the Premises shall cease and terminate at LESSOR'S option.
 - 2. LESSOR shall have the right, at its election, with or without re-entry as provided in subparagraph 1 above, to give written notice to LESSEE stating that this Lease shall terminate on the date specified by such notice. Upon such termination, LESSEE shall quit and peacefully surrender to LESSOR the Premises. This notice need not be given prior to re-entry under subparagraph 1 above.
 - 3. No re-entry or termination shall relieve LESSEE of its liability and obligations under this Lease; and all such liability and obligations shall survive any re-entry or termination. In the event of any re-entry, whether or not the Premises, or any part thereof, shall have been relet. LESSEE shall pay to LESSOR the entire rent and all other charges required to be paid by LESSEE up to the time of such re-entry of this Lease.

23. Return of Premises to Lessor

Upon vacating the Premises, LESSEE agrees to leave the Premises in as good a condition as existed on the first day of occupancy, allowing for ordinary and normal usage, and to

reimburse LESSOR for any damage done to said Premises caused by LESSEE'S occupation or tenancy, other than due to normal use. LESSEE acknowledges that this tenancy is temporary by reason of the fact that LESSOR has acquired the Premises for transportation purposes. LESSEE, at LESSEE'S expense, shall vacate the Premises within three hundred sixty-five (365) days after receipt of a notice to vacate or sooner, if necessary in LESSOR'S discretion. Nothing herein shall be deemed a waiver of LESSOR'S right to demand and obtain possession of the Premises in accordance with the law in the event of a violation on the part of LESSEE of any of the terms or conditions hereof.

This Lease agreement shall not establish prior rights benefits for the LESSEE, or their assigns. Alterations to the Facility shall be at LESSEE'S sole expense. All Leases are subject to cancellation at will by the Department, after reasonable notice, to provide for use of the area for highway purposes. Relocation costs shall be the sole responsibility of the LESSEE.

24. Addenda

Any changes or modifications of this Lease and any applicable Individual Site Agreement shall be made by a written addendum and signed by authorized officials. Any addenda to this Lease and any applicable Individual Site Agreement are by this reference made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein.

25. Subsequent Legislation, Regulations, Procedures

It is foreseeable that additional legislation pertaining to the leasing of right of way may be passed after the date of this Lease, or that LESSOR may adopt regulations or additional procedures pertaining to the leasing of right of way. Should any of these events, or any combination of them occur, all of the relevant statutory provisions, regulations, or procedures, including subsequent amendments thereto, will become part of this Lease. If any of these events, or any combination of these events occur, any language or terms now in this Lease inconsistent with the relevant new statues, regulations, or procedures will be void immediately upon their effective date.

26. A.R.S. Section §28-1865.01

LESSEE is aware of the statutory requirement of A.R.S. Section §28-1865.01 requiring policy to be adopted by the State Transportation Board. In order to comply with A.R.S. Section 28-1865.01, the Board passed policy, dated November 17 ,1995, governing the Lease of Highway Rights-of-Way. LESSEE will not raise the lack of any procedures as a defense or objection to any demands of LESSOR under this Lease, or in any litigation involving any of the terms of this Lease. Should a formal Attorney General Opinion, or a court decision invalidate this Lease for lack of sufficient procedures, or any other reason, the LESSEE will in one hundred eighty (180) days vacate the leased Premises and restore it to an appropriate condition as described hereunder.

27. Termination for convenience

LESSOR reserves the right to terminate this Lease whole or in part at anytime for the convenience of the State without penalty or recourse. The LESSOR shall give written notice by certified mail, return requested, to the LESSEE of the termination at least one hundred eighty (180) days before the effective date of the termination. Upon receipt of the written notice, the LESSEE shall stop all work and immediately notify all applicable third parties to do the same.

28. Termination by Lessee

LESSEE may elect not to renew this Lease and any applicable Individual Site Agreement by providing written notice to LESSOR on or before sixty (60) days prior to the termination of

the Initial Term of the Lease or any applicable Individual Site Agreement. LESSEE may terminate this Lease or any applicable Individual Site Agreement at anytime and for any reason by providing a minimum one hundred eighty (180) day written notice to LESSOR. However, any obligation pertinent to the indemnification and environmental sections of this Lease shall survive the termination and LESSEE shall be obligated to pay the balance of any rent owing for the first five (5) year term of the applicable Individual Site Agreement at the time the one hundred eighty (180) day written notice is provided to the LESSOR. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in lieu of paying the balance owing for the first five (5) year term of the applicable Individual Site Agreement, LESSEE may, at LESSEE'S sole expense, relocate the Facility to an alternative location owned by LESSOR which is acceptable to the parties. Upon identification of an acceptable alternate site, the applicable Individual Site Agreement shall be modified accordingly.





STATE ENGINEER'S REPORT March 2011

The Status of Projects Under Construction report for March 2011 shows 115 projects under construction valued at \$1,228,723,569.08. The transportation board awarded 13 projects during March valued at approximately \$28.1 million.

During March the Department finalized 7 projects valued at \$21,876,270.25. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package.

Year to date we have finalized 81 projects. The total cost of these 81 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 7.3%. Deducting incentive/bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to 4.9%.


