Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director.

In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route of a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects.

With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction.

The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion.

In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

All such accelerated agenda items will be individually considered and acted upon ahead of all other agenda items. With respect to all agenda items not accelerated. i.e., those items upon which action has been deferred until later in the meeting, the Chairman will entertain a single motion and a single second to that motion and will call for a single vote of the members without any discussion of any agenda items so grouped together and so singly acted upon. STATE ENGINEER'S REPORT May 2011

The Status of Projects Under Construction report for May 2011 shows 123 projects under construction valued at \$1,156,084,006.76. The transportation board awarded 12 projects during May valued at approximately \$32.5 million.

During May the Department finalized 13 projects valued at \$57,030,050.15. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package.

Year to date we have finalized 114 projects. The total cost of these 114 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 8.3%. Deducting incentive/bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to 5.9%.

It is with sincere regret that I must inform you that the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) will not transfer \$10,650,550 (Payment) to the City of Sedona (City) on April 11, 2011 as indicated in my letter to you dated March 11, 2011.

As you are aware, the Transfer Agreement (the Agreement) dated March 7, 2011 between the City and ADOT, stipulates that the City shall (with the exception of the Andante signal project segment) "... accept full ownership, control and maintenance responsibility over the Transfer Segment..." at 12:01 a.m. on the Transfer Date. The Transfer Date is defined as the next calendar day after the date of the Payment.

You have made us aware that a group called "Let the People Vote on 89A" has filed referendum petitions that would challenge the actions taken by the City Council on February 22, 2011. You have indicated that it could be several weeks before the City knows for certain whether or not enough valid signatures were obtained to meet the requirements of the referendum. You have indicated that the City has yet to set a date for a public vote on the referendum, if a sufficient number of signatures are determined to be valid. And finally, you have indicated that the City does not intend to take any legal action to challenge the legitimacy of this potential referendum.

As you are aware, City Attorney Mike Goimarac has expressed in an email sent to our attorney, Mr. Joe Acosta, his opinion that the possibility of a referendum prevents the City from taking any actions to honor the March 7, 2011 Agreement with ADOT. Mr. Goimarac also states that he believes the referendum does not necessarily prevent ADOT from making Payment to the City, but does prevent the City from assuming ownership and operational control of the road after the Payment is made.

Since the sole reason for the Payment is for the City to assume control over the road, the inability of the City to give written assurance to ADOT that it is ready, willing and able to fully comply with the terms of the Agreement, in spite of the referendum filing, makes it unreasonable for ADOT to move forward with its Payment obligation until this matter is resolved.

ADOT and the State Transportation Board have shown good faith in their willingness to abide by the terms of the Transfer Agreement. The State Transportation Board has taken all actions necessary to comply with the Agreement. Within the past two weeks the Department has advertised both the Pavement Preservation Project, and the Andante Signal Project. ADOT has had a check cut for \$10,650,550 to present to the State Treasurer for a wire transfer (per your instructions) on April 11. However, given the fact that the City's legal counsel believes the City cannot honor the terms of the agreement, ADOT cannot wire those funds to the City at this time.

If the City is able to resolve the issues described above to the satisfaction of ADOT, by giving the Department adequate, written assurance that the City can, and will, accept full ownership, control and maintenance responsibility over the Transfer Segment in accordance with the specific provisions of the Agreement, then ADOT will once again use its best efforts to fund this obligation and fulfill its terms under the Agreement. Such assurance must be received by ADOT no later than May 30, 2011, so that ADOT can fulfill its 30 day notice requirement for the Payment.

Until such assurances are received, ADOT cannot move forward with the Payment.

Dear John:

It was very disappointing to receive your letter of April 7, 2011. We certainly understand that, given the possibility of a referendum, ADOT would want to proceed cautiously in distributing funds to the City. However, we were not prepared for you to give the City an ultimatum that the City is powerless to meet. Specifically, you state that the city must give ADOT "written assurance that the City can, and will accept full ownership, control and maintenance responsibility over the Transfer Segment. . . no later than May 30, 2011. . . . Until such assurances are received, ADOT cannot move forward with the payment."

As you know, the referendum seeking to overturn the City's route transfer decision is an action taken by a group of citizens independent from the City. These citizens are exercising their constitutional right to challenge the City's decision. The City has absolutely no control over the outcome or legal effect of this pending referendum. If in fact it is determined that they have properly filed their referendum petition and have met the required signature threshold, then per the pronouncements of the Arizona Supreme Court, the City is stayed from taking ownership of the Transfer Segment. We have previously cited to you the case of *Queen Creek Land and Cattle Corp. v. Yavapai County Bd. Of Supervisors, 108 Ariz. 449, 501 P.2d 391 (1972)*, where the Arizona Supreme Court stated:

The referendum stays the effect of the action of the lawmaking body until the electorate has had an opportunity to approve or reject it.

In this case, Sedona is the sole "law-making body" whose actions can be stayed by the referendum. Per this holding, we cannot assume ownership of the Transfer Segment until after the referendum is determined. We have previously shared this case with you and have not received a contrary opinion from your legal counsel that this is in fact the law. However, we have also offered a

number of options that ADOT could do in order to be assured that the route transfer agreement remains viable if the people of Sedona in deciding the referendum so choose.

First, we offered to agree to hold the \$10.6 million, and if the referendum were successful in overturning the route transfer, to return that sum plus interest to ADOT. The City, upon council approval, would be willing to commit to this result in writing and to provide any other reasonable assurances that ADOT would require in order to protect these funds. This option would present no risk whatsoever, to ADOT. The advantages of this option are that it would satisfy the funding requirement of the transfer agreement while at the same time respecting the referendum process. Your letter provides no explanation whatsoever as to why this option is not acceptable.

Second, we offered to agree to amend the transfer agreement to move the funding deadline from June 30, 2011 to a time after the referendum is determined. This simple measure would again respect the referendum process and would allow the transfer agreement to proceed if the people of Sedona, through an election so chose. Again, your letter of April 7th is silent on why this proposal is unacceptable.

In response to these two very viable options, you have offered the City a third, wholly unworkable option. That option is to essentially ignore the referendum process, ignore court precedent and agree to accept ownership of the roadway before May 30th and before the referendum has even been decided. It is impossible for the City to consider this option for a number of reasons. First and foremost, the City is powerless in light of the referendum to agree to it, as described above. Second, because the City is powerless to accept this sole option offered by ADOT, the people of Sedona will be robbed of their right to make a decision regarding roadway ownership, as the transfer agreement will terminate unless the funds are transferred by June 30th.

It is puzzling why you would offer an option that effectively ensures ADOT will retain liability for the roadway in perpetuity. Under the options offered by the City, there is a potential way for the transfer agreement to survive and for ADOT to transfer the roadway, and its associated liability, within a few short months after a referendum vote. In contrast, because the City cannot legally accept ADOT's singular option, if ADOT does not make the payment (as you have indicated it will not), as of June 30th the transfer agreement will be voided and ADOT will continue to own the transfer segment.

We are struggling to understand the logic of the option you have offered and we hope that you might be able to provide a more detailed explanation. After months of working together to find a solution to this matter, it would be unfortunate if our efforts were lost due to the City not being able to meet the impossible conditions of your sole option. To preserve the hard work and long

hours that both ADOT and the City have committed to this process, we respectfully ask you to reconsider the options offered by the City. We also request that if you do reject both of these options, you provide us with a detailed explanation as to why. If this process is going to break down at this late juncture, we would appreciate having your explanation to provide to the citizens of Sedona.

Dear Tim:

I am writing in response to your letter of April 13, 2011, concerning the Transfer Agreement and ADOT's response to the pending referendum. In your letter, you express disappointment that ADOT is giving the City an "ultimatum that the City is powerless to meet". The letter goes on to state that there are two reasonable alternatives for ADOT to consider.

The City's first alternative is that ADOT pay the \$10.6 million dollars to the City now, while the City would do nothing in return until the referendum vote is held and the Transfer Agreement is validated. You have indicated to us that it is the intention of the City to hold a special election in November, 2011 in order to allow the voters to consider the referendum.

Given that ADOT is proceeding with the advertisement for the Pavement Preservation Project and the Andante Traffic Signal Project, the advance payout you are advocating would result in ADOT performing on close to 99 percent of its obligations under the Transfer Agreement (with only the enhancement project remaining) while the City would do nothing in return unless authorized in the future election. Your letter asserts that "this option would present no risk whatsoever, to ADOT." We believe that there is substantial risk to ADOT.

First, this alternative would require ADOT to fully perform on the contract, while getting nothing in return from the City beyond a hope of its future performance.

Second, our engineering study indicates that continuous roadway lighting should be installed as soon as possible. Your alternative entirely negates the issue of the lighting. As you are well aware, the driving force behind the Transfer Agreement has been the City's desire to avoid installation of the lighting improvement that the Department's engineers recommend.

Third, the Department has no assurance that if the money is sent, and the referendum is successful, that the City would be able to act upon its pledge to "return that sum plus interest" to ADOT. How can we have any assurance that another referendum or action of the Council might not stay the City from returning the funds, resulting in future litigation to recover them?

Fourth, the transfer of State funds without contract performance on the City's part is not only a poor business decision, but a breach of ADOT's stewardship responsibility over State funds, and, quite possibly an unlawful "gift" of public money which is prohibited by Arizona's Constitution. ADOT cannot be put in such a position.

Finally, both ADOT and the State Transportation Board have previously indicated their desire to have this issue resolved as soon as possible. As you will recall, the Board originally gave the City a deadline of January, 2011 to finish and approve the Transfer Agreement. The Board later modified this deadline (at the request of the City) to February, 2011. Under your proposal, ADOT would now have to wait at least an additional seven months with no continuous roadway lighting in place, and without any assurance that the transfer will ever be accomplished.

For all these reasons, your first proposal is unacceptable.

As a second alternative, the City offered to "agree to amend the Transfer Agreement to move the funding deadline from June 30, 2011, to a time after the referendum is determined." This alternative presents some of the same difficulties as the first alternative. It does not address the fact that the lighting is not in place, nor does it address the Board's desire to have a timely resolution of this issue.

The amendment alternative raises a number of other questions. If the Department and the City were to agree to amend the Transfer Agreement, would that agreement then be subject to a referendum? Since the City has taken the position that the referendum stays all action under the agreement, can the City even agree to an amendment? Sedona's City Attorney opined in an email sent to ADOT on April 1, 2011 that such an amendment "could possibly be challenged in Court as violating the referendum stay, or it may give rise to another referendum challenge thereby staying the amendment itself." And yet your letter of April 13 refers to this as a "very viable option". Based on the potential legal issues raised by your own attorney, it seems anything but a "very viable option".

Even if one assumes that these options are somehow "viable", they do not meet the parties' intent to finally decide the issues of control over the highway and roadway lighting. The City offers no compensation to ADOT for the fact that under either alternative ADOT would continue to retain control of the highway without the continuous lighting, or the fact that ADOT would continue operating a highway that the City Council agreed to immediately take over.

For all these reasons, your second proposal is unacceptable.

The fact remains that ADOT would not receive the benefit of the bargain under either alternative presented by the City. ADOT would be required to bear additional risks, while receiving none of the benefits of the Agreement, while also remaining in limbo with no definite or assured endpoint to the transfer.

Your letter of April 13 also claims that ADOT's position "effectively insures ADOT will retain liability for the roadway in perpetuity." We disagree with your conclusion that absent the

Transfer Agreement ADOT must continue to hold the roadway in perpetuity. ADOT believes other valid legal options exist to address this issue.

Your letter also states that ADOT has offered the City a "wholly unworkable option." The previous memorandum from your City Attorney to the Assistant Attorney General stated that the City Attorney was not asserting the official position of the City. Even so, we view the April 13, 2011 letter indicating the City is powerless to perform under the Transfer Agreement as constituting the official position of the City. The Attorney General's Office cannot overrule the City Attorney's advice, nor can it give the City legal advice.

ADOT has been diligently working with the City since 2006 to address the City's request relating to safety issues on SR89A. Since that time the City Council has voted on three separate occasions in support of the lighting project, and, on February 22nd, 2011, voted to take back the road as part of the Route Transfer Agreement. Four times ADOT believed it had come to resolution with the City on this issue. And yet, each of those actions was ultimately overturned or delayed. ADOT today finds itself essentially in the same position it was in 2006. ADOT still owns and is responsible for the road, and the issue of continuous lighting has yet to be resolved.

ADOT fully respects the constitutional right of the citizens of Sedona to refer the Council's decision in this matter to a referendum vote. However, it is unreasonable to assume that ADOT must continue to bear sole liability and risk while the community and its elected representatives continue to deliberate this issue. ADOT has a responsibility to address public safety concerns on all its highways, and to act in the best interests of all of Arizona's citizens and visitors.

TRANSFER AGREEMENT

This Transfer Agreement (the "Agreement") is entered into March 7, 2011, between the City of Sedona, an Arizona municipal corporation (the "City") and the State of Arizona acting through the Arizona Department of Transportation, as defined in ARIZ. REV. STAT. § 28-331 et seq. ("ADOT"). The City and ADOT will be referred to herein individually as "Party" or collectively as "Parties".

RECITALS

- A. The City is authorized to enter into this Agreement by virtue of Arizona Revised Statutes ("ARIZ. REV. STAT.") § 28-7209 and action taken by the City Council on February 22, 2011.
- B. ADOT is authorized to enter into this Agreement by virtue of ARIZ, REV. STAT. §§ 28-7209 and 28-334.
- C. ADOT owns and operates State Routes 89A and 179 within the corporate limits of the City (the "Transfer Segment") as described and depicted in <u>Exhibit A</u> and attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- D. The Transportation Board, as set forth in ARIZ. REV. STAT. § 28-101 et seq., (the "Board") desires to transfer ownership, control and maintenance responsibilities of the Transfer Segment to the City, and the City wishes to accept the ownership, control and maintenance responsibilities of the Transfer Segment pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. The Board has taken certain actions prior to the execution of this Agreement, but the transfer shall not be deemed to be effective until the Transfer Date as defined in Section 1.2 below.
- E. ARIZ. REV. STAT. § 28-7209(A)(2) requires that before the Board transfers ownership and control of the Transfer Segment, the Board must give the City four years advance notice of the planned transfer, unless the City waives the right to the advance notice.
- F. ARIZ. REV. STAT. § 28-7209(B) requires that before the Board transfers ownership and control of the Transfer Segment, the pavement before such transfer must "be in such a condition that additional surface treatment and major maintenance of the highway are not required for at least five years, unless the board and the affected jurisdiction agree to waive the requirements of this subsection" (the "Pavement Condition Requirement").
- G. The Parties anticipate certain projects to be completed along the Transfer Segment in the future (the "Future Projects" as more particularly set forth in Article II

below), with the understanding that either or both State funds and Federal financial assistance may be used in whole or in part to fund such Future Projects.

- H. ADOT may utilize funds from the Highway Expansion and Extension Loan Program ("HELP") loan program (as described in ARIZ. REV. STAT. Title 28, Chapter 21, Article 5) to finance a portion of the amounts ADOT will pay the City under this Agreement. ADOT is solely responsible for applying for and repaying the HELP loan.
- I. The Board has taken the following action in anticipation of this Agreement, conditioned on the Parties' execution of this Agreement and ADOT and the City taking the actions designated in Section I of this Agreement:
 - 1. Amended its fiscal year (FY) 2011 2015 Highway Construction Program, to include the following:
 - a. In FY 2011 Program funding sufficient to pay 100 percent of all costs associated with the Andante Traffic Signal Project.
 - b. In FY 2011 Program funding sufficient to pay 100 percent of all costs associated with the Pavement Preservation Project.
 - c. In FY 2011 FY 2015 Program all costs (including principal and interest) for the re-payment of a HELP loan in the aggregate principal amount of \$9,275,550.
 - 2. Directed ADOT to develop all documents necessary to accomplish the transfer of the Transfer Segment to the City.
- J. In order to accomplish the abandonment of the Transfer Segment to the City, the Parties have agreed to enter into this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, which are incorporated herein by reference, the following mutual covenants and conditions, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the ADOT and the City hereby agree as follows:

Article I. Route Transfer

- 1.1 <u>Acceptance of Transfer Segment</u>. The City shall accept into its road system the Transfer Segment in "as-is" condition and shall by virtue of this agreement acquire all preexisting rights within the entire right-of-way comprising the Transfer Segment that currently belong to ADOT. The City shall execute all documents necessary to effectuate this route transfer. In consideration of the transfer of ownership, control and maintenance responsibility, the City shall receive from ADOT (A) compensation as described in Section 1.2 below and (B) contributions towards the Future Projects as set forth in Article II below.
- 1.2 ADOT Contributions to City: Ownership. ADOT shall pay the City \$10,650,550 on or before June 30, 2011. ADOT shall give the City 30 days notice of the date of payment. The first calendar day after the date of payment shall be the "Transfer Date." If ADOT does not pay the City \$10,650,550 on or before June 30, 2011, (A) this Agreement shall be immediately terminated without further action by either Party, (B) ADOT shall continue to own, control and maintain the Transfer Segment and (C) neither Party will be responsible for constructing or financing the Future Projects.
- 1.3 <u>City Control of Transfer Segment: Andante Exception.</u> As of 12:01 a.m. on the Transfer Date, the City shall accept full ownership, control and maintenance responsibility over the Transfer Segment, with the exception of the project area for the Andante Traffic Signal Project (defined in Subsection 2.1(A) below), as depicted in <u>Exhibit A</u> attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, which shall become the City's responsibility as set forth in Section 1.4 below.
- 1.4 <u>Andante Acceptance</u>. Upon final construction acceptance by ADOT and the City of the Andante Traffic Signal Project, the City shall accept full ownership, control and maintenance responsibility over the project area for the Andante Traffic Signal Project, as depicted in <u>Exhibit A</u>.
- 1.5 <u>Notice Waiver</u>. In reliance upon ADOT's obligations contained in this Agreement, the City waives the four year advance notice requirement set forth in ARIZ. REV. STAT. § 28-7209(A)(2).
- 1.6 <u>Condition of Transfer Segment</u>. In reliance upon ADOT's obligations contained in this Agreement, the City waives the Pavement Condition Requirement of ARIZ, REV. STAT. § 28-7209(B).
- 1.7 <u>City Account.</u> The City shall place all State funds transferred to the City under this Agreement into a separate City account (the "City Account"). The City shall use all such funds (including investment earnings) solely for maintenance, operations, planning, design and construction (including the purchase of right-of-way) on the

Transfer Segment. Where the City is improving an intersection, the work may include a cross street to a distance not more than 100 feet from the right-of-way line of the Transfer Segment as it exists on the date of this Agreement. Should the intersection work need to extend beyond 100 feet, funds from the City Account may be used for work directly related to the intersection, subject to approval by the ADOT District Engineer.

- 1.8 Reporting. If requested in writing by ADOT, the City shall make a report to ADOT concerning the obligation and expenditure of all funds deposited within the City Account, with sufficient detail that ADOT can ascertain that the funds are being used for the purposes allowed under this Agreement.
- 1.9 <u>Audit</u>. The City agrees to make its records available for review or audit by an ADOT representative upon reasonable request. The City may comply with this requirement by making the documents available at City offices during normal business hours.

Article II. Future Projects

- 2.1 <u>Generally</u>. The Parties agree that in addition to the compensation set forth in Article I above, ADOT will use its best efforts to finance the Future Projects set forth below. ADOT shall, prior to the Transfer Date and thereafter annually, provide the City with copies of the relevant pages from its Highway Construction Program to ensure that ADOT has programmed the Future Projects into its Highway Construction Program as contemplated by this Agreement.
- A. Andante Traffic Signal Project. The Andante traffic signal project shall include installation of traffic signals for the intersection of Andante Drive and SR 89A, as depicted in Exhibit A ("Andante Traffic Signal Project"). ADOT will bear the full cost of the Andante Traffic Signal Project. ADOT will advertise the Andante Traffic Signal Project for construction no later than 60 days after the Transfer Date and will be solely responsible for awarding and administering the construction contract (the "ADOT Andante Contract"). The City shall not be a party to the ADOT Andante Contract; provided, however, that ADOT shall allow the City to review and comment upon the contract documents.
- B. Pavement Preservation Project. The pavement preservation project includes improving the condition of the surface treatment of that portion of the Transfer Segment depicted in Exhibit A, to ADOT standards (the "Pavement Preservation Project"). ADOT shall advertise the Pavement Preservation Project for construction as soon as practicable after the Transfer Date, but no later than February 1, 2013. The City shall give ADOT any and all rights of entry necessary to perform the Pavement Preservation Project.

- 1. Funding. Subject to the availability of Federal aid funds or State funds (at ADOT's sole discretion) at the time ADOT commences with the Pavement Preservation Project, but in no event later than February 1, 2013, ADOT will bear the full cost (less the amount of the City's Federal match requirement in an amount not to exceed \$250,800 as described in Subsection 2.1(C)(2) below) for the Pavement Preservation Project. ADOT will advertise the Pavement Preservation Project for bids and award the contract to the contractor(s) (the "ADOT Pavement Preservation Contract"). ADOT will be solely responsible for administering the ADOT Pavement Preservation Contract. The City shall not be a party to the ADOT Pavement Preservation Contract; provided, however, that ADOT shall allow the City to review and comment upon the contract documents.
- 2. <u>City Match</u>. Upon written notice from ADOT, the City will pay \$250,800 to ADOT prior to the advertisement of the Pavement Preservation Project.
- C. <u>Transportation Enhancement Project</u>. The City will develop a transportation enhancement project (the "Transportation Enhancement Project") for the Transfer Segment and provide ADOT with the plans for such project no later than June 30, 2015. In the event the City fails to provide ADOT with plans for the Transportation Enhancement Project by June 30, 2015, the Parties will have no future obligation to finance this project.
 - 1. Funding. ADOT will use its best efforts to obtain an amount up to \$250,000 of Transportation Enhancement ("TE") project funds. If the City is unsuccessful in receiving up to \$250,000 of TE project funds, ADOT shall request the Board to fund \$250,000 from its "Projects of Opportunity" subprogram to fund the Transportation Enhancement Project. Subject to the approval of the Board, ADOT will advertise the Transportation Enhancement Project for bids and award the contract to the contractor(s) (the "ADOT TE Contract"). ADOT will be solely responsible for administering the ADOT TE Contract. ADOT's costs will be paid from the Project funds. The City shall not be a party to the ADOT TE Contract; provided, however, that ADOT shall allow the City to review and comment upon the contract documents.
 - 2. <u>City Match</u>. The City will notify ADOT that it desires ADOT to support the approval of up to \$250,000 of TE funds no later than June 30, 2015. Upon written notice from ADOT, the City will pay \$14,250 to ADOT prior to the advertisement of Transportation Enhancement Project.
 - 2.2 <u>Contingent Remedies If Future Federal Funding Is Not Available.</u>

- A. Federal Funding Through ADOT. The Parties acknowledge that work on the Future Projects will likely not be required for several months or years. The Parties also acknowledge that ADOT currently intends to use Federal aid highway funds to accomplish some or all of the work. The Parties also understand that any use of Federal aid highway funds will have to be approved by the Board and the Federal Highway Administration ("FHWA") at such future time before the projects are advertised. The Parties further acknowledge that the City has certain obligations to perform certain activities and to notify ADOT and the Board of its desire to commence a Future Project within pre-determined time limits as enumerated in Article II of this Agreement. ADOT can make no representations that these funds will be available or approved for such use, other than its representation that it will make its best efforts to obtain the Federal aid funding.
- B. <u>Equitable Adjustment</u>. If the Federal funding for a Future Project is not approved by the Board or FHWA (unless such disapproval is due to specific omission or actions taken by the City, on its own volition, which have made the work ineligible for Federal aid funding), the Parties agree to an equitable adjustment to the obligations set forth in this Agreement as follows.
 - 1. <u>Substituted Funds</u>. ADOT may, at its sole discretion, substitute other legally available funds in lieu of the Federal aid funds within 60 days of a demand by the City.
 - 2. <u>Initial Notice of Deficiency</u>. If ADOT does not make other funds available, the City shall file a notice of deficiency ("Initial Notice of Deficiency") with ADOT identifying:
 - a. the Future Project(s) in dispute;
 - b. the actions the Board needs to take to facilitate the completion of the Future Project(s); and
 - c. a demand that the ADOT petition the Board to take those actions necessary to facilitate the completion of the identified Future Project(s) or take the Transferred Segment back into the State Highway System. ADOT shall have 30 days to file such a petition with the Board from the time it receives such Initial Notice of Deficiency.
 - 3. <u>Cure</u>. If, within 30 days of ADOT's petition, the Board agrees to take those actions necessary to facilitate the completion of the identified Future Project(s), then the Parties agree that this Agreement will continue to be in full force and effect as contemplated herein.

- 4. Accept Transfer Segment. If the Board agrees to take the Transfer Segment into the State Highway System, the City shall return, within 60 days of notification of the Board's decision, any remaining unobligated funds in the City Account to ADOT; provided that the City will retain the investment earnings in the City Account plus \$1,125,000, which amounts shall be considered the liquidated damages due to the City for the Board's refusal to fund its portion of the Future Projects. The Parties agree that "unobligated funds" shall mean funds that were not used by the City on the ownership, control or maintenance of the Transfer Segment at the time the Board refuses to fund the Future Projects. In such an event, after the City's repayment all other duties and obligations contemplated under this Agreement will be considered by ADOT and the City as satisfied, with the exception of Sections 1.8 and 1.9, which will remain in full force and effect for five years after the repayment is made.
- 5. <u>Deficiency Payments</u>. If the Board within 90 days after receipt of the Initial Notice of Deficiency by ADOT does not either take those actions necessary to facilitate the completion of the identified Future Project(s) or agree to take the Transfer Segment into the State Highway System, then after receipt of a second notice of deficiency (the "Final Deficiency Notice") from the City, ADOT shall make the following payments ("Deficiency Payments") to the City as liquidated damages:
 - (a) <u>Andante Traffic Signal Project</u>. The difference between the then current engineering construction cost estimate and the construction cost actually paid by ADOT on the Andante Traffic Signal Project.
 - (b) <u>Pavement Preservation Project</u>. The difference between the then current engineering construction cost estimate and the construction cost actually paid by ADOT on the Pavement Preservation Project, less any match funds not yet paid to ADOT by the City.
 - (c) <u>Transportation Enhancement Project</u>. The difference between the engineering construction cost estimate (not to exceed \$250,000) and the construction cost actually paid by ADOT on the Transportation Enhancement Project, less any match funds not yet paid to ADOT by the City.
- 6. <u>Independent Calculation</u>. Deficiency Payments shall be determined for each Project separately and independently.

7. <u>Resolution of Deficiency Disputes</u>. If ADOT disagrees with the issuance of a Final Deficiency Notice from the City, the Parties agree to resolve the disagreement pursuant to Section 5.9 of this Agreement.

Article III. Remedies Upon City's Failure to Prepare Future Projects

- 3.1 <u>Notice of Potential Default</u>. In the event that the City has failed to take any action contemplated under Article II for a Future Project, ADOT may file with the City a notice of potential default ("ADOT Notice of Potential Default"), outlining the matter not completed and actions the City needs to take to facilitate the completion of the Future Project.
- 3.2 <u>Cure of Potential Default</u>. If, within 60 days of the receipt of the ADOT Notice of Potential Default, the City has taken the actions outlined in such ADOT Notice of Potential Default, such ADOT Notice of Potential Default shall be deemed satisfied, and ADOT shall provide the City with a written acknowledgment of same. ADOT agrees that the City may cure any default with respect to funding any portion of a Future Project by taking steps necessary to provide alternative funding (i.e., calling for a bond election to fund a project in the absence of federal funding).
- 3.3 <u>Final Default Notice</u>. If, after 60 days following the City's receipt of the Notice of Potential Default, the City has failed to take the actions indicated, ADOT shall be entitled to issue a final default notice (the "ADOT Final Default Notice"). Upon receipt by the City of the ADOT Final Default Notice:
- A. <u>ADOT Relieved of Responsibility</u>. ADOT and the Board shall be relieved of any financial or other responsibility related to the Future Project(s) referenced in the ADOT Final Default Notice.
- B. <u>City Default Payments</u>. The City shall pay ADOT the estimated Federal match amount related to the Future Project(s) referenced in the ADOT Final Default Notice in amounts not to exceed: \$250,800 for the Payement Preservation Project, or \$14,250 for the Transportation Enhancement Project.
- 3.4 <u>Mediation</u>. If the City disagrees with the issuance of an ADOT Final Default Notice from ADOT, the Parties agree to resolve the disagreement pursuant to Section 5.9 of this Agreement.

Article IV. Remedies Upon Other Default under this Agreement

4.1 <u>Notice of Potential Default</u>. In the event that either Party defaults on its obligations under this Agreement, except for a deficiency or default as provided in Articles II and III above, the other Party may file with the alleged defaulting Party a notice of potential default (the "Notice of Potential Default"), outlining the matter(s) not

completed and actions the alleged defaulting Party needs to take to cure the Potential Default.

- 4.2 <u>Cure of Potential Default</u>. If, within 120 days of the receipt of the Notice of Potential Default, the defaulting Party has taken the actions outlined in such Notice of Potential Default, such Notice of Potential Default shall be deemed satisfied, and the other Party shall provide the defaulting Party with a written acknowledgment of same.
- 4.3 <u>Final Default Notice</u>. If, after 120 days following ADOT's receipt of the City Notice of Potential Default, the defaulting Party has failed to take the actions indicated, the other Party shall be entitled to issue a final default notice (the "Final Default Notice"). Disputes concerning the Final Default Notice will be resolved as set forth in Section 5.9 below.

Article V. Miscellaneous Provisions

5.1 <u>Indemnification</u>.

- A. Related to Lighting, Signage and Maintenance. To the extent permitted by law, after the Transfer Date, the City shall indemnify, defend and save and hold harmless ADOT for, from and against any and all claims, losses, liability, costs or other expenses related to the Transfer Segment (including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees) (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Claims") arising out of bodily injury of any person (including death), property damage and other Claims (including, but not limited to claims of derivative or vicarious liability) relating to, or in any way including, lighting conditions, signage and roadway maintenance along the Transfer Segment.
- B. Related to Pre-Existing Design and Future Projects. The Parties agree that, with respect to any Claims arising out of bodily injury of any person (including death), property damage and other Claims (including, but not limited to claims of derivative or vicarious liability) relating to, or in any way including, (1) design defects for portions of the Transfer Segment designed and constructed prior to the Transfer Date or (2) ADOT's work with respect to the Future Projects, neither Party shall be indemnified or held harmless by the other Party. The Parties agree that each Party shall be responsible for its own negligence. The provisions of this Subsection 5.1(B) shall be in effect for a period of five years, beginning on the Transfer Date.
- C. Related to Certain Matters after Five Years. To the extent permitted by law, from and after five years after the Transfer Date, the City shall indemnify, defend and save and hold harmless ADOT for, from and against any and all claims, losses, liability, costs or other expenses related to the Transfer Segment (including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees) (hereinafter referred to as "Claims") arising out

of bodily injury of any person (including death), property damage and any other Claims (including, but not limited to claims of derivative or vicarious liability); including claims, allegations or findings that ADOT is or was negligent.

- 5.2 <u>Contingent Funding</u>. The obligations of ADOT and the City under the terms of this Agreement are contingent upon the existence and availability of legally available funds that may be used for the purposes of this Agreement. In the case such funds are not available, the Parties shall meet and confer to arrive at an equitable adjustment pursuant to Article II of this Agreement.
- 5.3 <u>Budget Law</u>. Every obligation of ADOT and the City under this Agreement is predicated upon the availability of funds appropriated or allocated for the payment of such obligation. If funds are not allocated and available for the continuance of this Agreement, this Agreement may be terminated by either party at the end of the period for which the funds are available or modified by mutual agreement between ADOT and the City. No liability will accrue to the ADOT or the City in the event this provision is exercised, and ADOT and the City will not be obligated or liable for any future payments or for any damages as a result of termination under this Subsection.
- 5.4 <u>Applicable Safety Standards</u>. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as a statement or opinion of either the City or ADOT that any portion of the Transfer Segment fails to meet applicable safety standards at the time of this Agreement.
- 5.5 No Joint Exercise of Powers. The Parties acknowledge that this Agreement does not constitute a joint exercise of powers.
- 5.6 <u>Additional Agreements</u>. The Parties acknowledge that additional agreements between the Parties will be necessary to effectuate the construction of the Future Projects as contemplated in this Agreement, and the Parties agree to enter into such agreements.
- 5.7 <u>Additional Documents</u>. The Parties agree to prepare and complete such other documents that may be necessary to effectuate the provisions of this Agreement.
- 5.8 <u>Right of Way, Utility Relocation.</u> On the Andante Traffic Signal Project and the Pavement Preservation Project ADOT shall be responsible for any right of way acquisition, relocation, and utility relocation at ADOT's expense. Other than the Andante Traffic Signal Project and the Pavement Preservation Project, the City shall be responsible, at the City's expense, for all right-of-way acquisition, relocation, and utility relocations on and after the Transfer Date.
- 5.9 <u>Disputes</u>. Any disputes under this Agreement shall be first referred to mediation. If the dispute is not resolved through mediation, a dispute shall be referred to

the Maricopa County Superior Court. The Parties waive any potential objection to venue or jurisdiction in the Maricopa County Superior Court.

- 5.10 <u>No Employee/Agent/Joint Venture</u>. Neither Party to this Agreement shall be deemed to be the employee or agent of the other Party to the Agreement. This Agreement does not create a partnership or joint venture.
- 5.11 <u>Severability</u>. The provisions of this Agreement are severable. Any term or condition deemed illegal or invalid shall not affect any other term or condition of the Agreement, except where the overall intent of the Parties requires an adjustment to other terms or conditions.
- 5.12 <u>Final Agreement</u>. This Agreement is intended by the Parties as a final and complete expression of their agreement. No course of prior dealings between the Parties shall supplement or explain any terms used in this document and no other understanding either oral or in writing shall be binding.
- 5.13 <u>Statutory Termination</u>. This Agreement may be cancelled in accordance with ARIZ. REV. STAT. § 38-511.
- 5.14 Notices and Requests. Any notice or other communication required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if (A) delivered to the Party at the address set forth below, (B) deposited in the U.S. Mail, registered or certified, return receipt requested, to the address set forth below or (C) given to a recognized and reputable overnight delivery service, to the address set forth below:

or at such other address, and to the attention of such other person or officer, as any Party may designate in writing by notice duly given pursuant to this subsection. Notices shall be deemed received (A) when delivered to the Party, (B) three business days after being placed in the U.S. Mail, properly addressed, with sufficient postage or (C) the following business day after being given to a recognized overnight delivery service, with the person giving the notice paying all required charges and instructing the delivery service to deliver on the following business day. If a copy of a notice is also given to a Party's counsel or other recipient, the provisions above governing the date on which a notice is deemed to have been received by a Party shall mean and refer to the date on which the Party, and not its counsel or other recipient to which a copy of the notice may be sent, is deemed to have received the notice.

- 5.15 <u>E-verify Requirements</u>. Each Party agrees to comply with A.R.S. § 41-4401 in contracting with private entities to perform work in furtherance of this Agreement.
- 5.16 <u>Scrutinized Business Operations</u>. Pursuant to ARIZ. REV. STAT. §§ 35-391.06 and 35-393.06, both Parties certify that they do not have scrutinized business operations in Sudan or Iran. For the purpose of this subsection the term "scrutinized business operations" shall have the meanings set forth in ARIZ. REV. STAT. § 35-391 or 35-393, as applicable.
