Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director.

In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route of a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects.

With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction.

The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five-year construction program.

CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion.

In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

With respect to all agenda items not accelerated. i.e., those items upon which action has been deferred until later in the meeting, the Chairman will entertain a single motion and a single second to that motion and will call for a single vote of the members without any discussion of any agenda items so grouped together and so singly acted upon. ITEM 1: District Engineer's Report — Todd Emery, Tucson District Engineer

Todd went over their current 5-year program as far as the Expansion, Modernization, and Preservation projects that will be going out to construction by FY14. There are proposed changes in that program. Expansion Projects: Under construction I-10: Prince to Ruthrauff is underway to be complete by November 2013. On the 5-Year Program—FY13, SR86 Valencia to Kinney is currently under design, estimated bid date FY13 timeframe. SR77 Tangerine to Pima County line is currently under design and currently proposed to be moved out to FY14. SR86 I-19 and Ajo is proposed to be moved out to FY17 and currently soliciting for design services. Modernization Projects: Under construction SR86; San Pedro Road Segment estimated complete July 2012. Under construction SR77; Eagle Crest Ranch Road estimated complete April 2012. 5-Year Program—FY12 SR86; Santa Rosa and Kitt Peak Segments estimated bid date June 2012. 5-Year Program-FY12 I-10; Marsh Station Phase III Median Improvements, New Bridges, RR Bridge Removal estimated bid date FY 2012; Bids opened February 2012 I-19; International Border to I10 Sign Replacement Project estimated complete Summer 2012. Preservation Projects: 5yr Program-FY14 I10; Marsh Station to Pima County line Mill & Replace 4" + Friction Course FY14. 5vr Program—FY15 I10, Davidson Canvon Bridge Deck Replacement estimated bid date July 2014.

ITEM 1: A) Individual Topics 1. Frontage Road Improvements

Todd provided an update on the proposed Frontage Road improvements from Country Club to Ruby Road in Nogales. In summary, we need to separate the intersection from the rest of the project and develop a stand-alone project. We need to find a workable solution at the intersection then press forward on obtaining the required environmental clearances. Based on funding, we can look at an interim signal with turn lanes or a more permanent solution. Once the intersection is functioning, we can look at future projects on the frontage road.

ITEM 2: Director's Report — John Halikowski

Mr. Halikowski announced U.S. 93 project received the National Environmental Excellence Award. The project has received national recognition for three wildlife overpasses, designed in collaboration with the Arizona Game and Fish Department, to protect motorists and provide safe crossings of U.S. 93 for the desert bighorn sheep. John commended the Board for their foresight as they authorized those projects forward. That's a piece of good news for Arizona.

ITEM 4: Legislative Report — Kevin Biesty

Kevin provided a report on the legislative process. Starting with the State and the bills of importance to the Board. There are three *corrections* bills as he likes to call them. The first bill, HB2358, Public Private Partnerships; toll facilities. The department has spent countless hours negotiation with the Arizona Truckers Association and has come to an agreement on some language. They will move forward in the proceedings. However, HB2358 is no longer is the bill; it is now theme park legislation. A new bill, SB1519 that just went out of House Transportation yesterday with necessary language on it. They are hoping to move it as quickly as possible. HB2061, HELP Advisory Committee; repeal, it is moving along very well. It's awaiting Senate Rules. Once it gets past Senate Rules, it goes to the floor and then for a vote. SB1200, political signs, that allows signs to be hung on highway fences. We've talked to the sponsor and asked her to please remove that from the bill. SB1402 and SB1403 are companion bills. SB1402, broadband conduit installation, to allow broadband in the open ditch. We continue to work with the stakeholders on that. SB1403 sets up the Digital Arizona Infrastructure Office. Two HURF bills, HB2771, and HCR2058, one setting up a ledger that the department would keep and the other is resolution on the ballot. Those are not moving forward this year.

ITEM 5: Public Private Partnership (P3) Update — Floyd Roehrich

Due to Gail Lewis unable to attend the Board meeting, Floyd requested to have this agenda item postponed until the April Board meeting.

ITEM 6: & ITEM 7: Financial Report and Financing Program Reports — Kristine Ward

Kristine provided summary reports on revenue collections for Highway User Revenues, Maricopa Transportation Excise Tax Revenues, and Aviation Revenues comparing fiscal year results to last year's actuals and forecasts. February year-over-year revenue growth can be attributable to stronger than expected Use Fuel Tax and Vehicle License Tax collections. Also in February, the Use Fuel Tax revenue category posted a 9.6 percent increase over February 2011. The full effect of the recent fuel prices will not be seen until the March and April reports. The Aircraft Registration revenue category continues to benefit from the enhances expired aircraft registration fees collection process. She also provided an update on financing issues including HURF and GAN issuances, and Board funding obligations. There is not a RARF report since there were no changes from last month's report. The HELP Fund is \$75,002,653. \$75 million remains in the month because this program is largely inactive. Kevin alluded to the stats of that legislation remains inactive until an advisory board is appointed or legislation has passed.

ITEM 7A: Direction to Proceed: Grant Anticipation Notes — Kristine Ward

ITEM A: FY2013 – 2017 Statewide Subprograms / ITEM B: FY2013 – 2017 Statewide Highway Construction Program / ITEM C: FY2013 – 2017 PAG Regional Highway Construction Program – Scott Omer

Scott presented the draft 5-year construction program and welcomed members of the audience and thanked them for their interest in transportation for the state of Arizona. He appreciated everyone's interest. This 5-year program is a year-round process. The program is developed collaboratively between ITD, FMS, MPD, and local agencies. It demonstrates how federal and state dollars will be spent over the next five-year period and is approved annually. The fiscal year starts each July 1. The Arizona Department of Transportation holds public hearings in three locations each year. Members of the audience are given the opportunity to address the transportation board on any item of the program. An overview of the following topics was given: Federal-aid programs, Subprograms, Greater Arizona Major Projects, PAG Major Projects, MAG Regional Program, and Airport Development Program.

Summary of the Program FY13-FY17: Updated project costs—Moved \$112M in Major Projects out of program; Programmed PE and Design Phase—Large Projects greater than \$20M Two Phases; Small Projects Single Phase. Programmed Subprogram Projects—Pavement Preservation and Bridge FY13-15; Several other Programs FY13 and FY14. **Summary of Subprograms**: Total FY17 funding at \$350M. Pavement Preservation, \$145M FY16 and \$116M FY17. District Minor, \$22.5M FY16 and \$17.5M FY17. Numerous programs will be phased out over the 5-year Program due to design costs being programmed. **Greater Arizona Major Projects**: Numerous Project Changes, Schedule, and Budget Changes. **PAG Regional Program Major Projects**: Numerous Project Changes, Schedule, and Budget Changes.

ITEM D: FY2013 – 2017 MAG Regional Highway Construction Program – Kwi Sung Kang

Kwi reported on the MAG Regional Program changes to the project budgets and schedules within the 5-year program. The proposed Tentative Five-Year Program starting with FY13-15: Carry projects forward from the current approved 5-Year Program. FY16-17: Projects will be determined based on the rebalancing efforts. Cost and Revenue for the MAG RTP Freeway Program must be in balance through 2026. Negative cash flow balances will require deferring some FY13-15 projects to future years. MAG has completed the rebalancing process.

ITEM E: FY2012 – 2016 Airport Development Program – Scott Omer

Scott reported on the airport development program. All primary revenue streams will remain flat in growth. Federal Aviation Administration Reauthorization will pass this summer (2012). Arizona airports receipt of federal funding will remain at approximately \$70 to \$80 million. Any additional sweeps will hinder ADOT's ability to advance this recommended program. On February 6, 2012 the U.S. Senate passed Senate Bill 223. This puts an end to the series of 23 continuing resolutions for FAA funding to Arizona airports. Changes to the FAA program described in the Bill may involve changes to ADOT's projected 5-year program.

A portion of Buffalo Soldier Trail is no longer needed for state transportation purposes. The City of Sierra Vista has agreed to accept jurisdiction, ownership and maintenance of the right of way in accordance with Joint Project Agreement 06-107-I, dated March 5, 2008. Accordingly, I recommend that the State's interest in the right of way be abandoned.

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EIGHTH SUPPLEMENTAL RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Arizona enacted Sections 28-7611 through 28-7617, Arizona Revised Statutes, as amended (the "Act"), granting authority to the Arizona Transportation Board (the "Board"), after the Director of the Department of Transportation (the "Department") has entered into one or more grant agreements with the Federal Highway Administration for funding highway projects, to issue notes in anticipation of revenues to be received under such grant agreements and other available moneys and to use proceeds of such notes to pay costs of such projects; and

WHEREAS, on June 9, 2000, the Board adopted that certain resolution (the "Original Resolution") pertaining to the authorization and issuance of its Grant Anticipation Notes Series 2000A (the "Series 2000A Notes"), which were issued in an original aggregate principal amount of \$39,405,000 and which have been paid; and

WHEREAS, the Series 2000A Notes were payable from and secured by a pledge of "Pledged Funds" as defined in the Resolution (defined herein), which consists of all Grant Revenues, Federal Aid Revenues and other moneys that are deposited in the Grant Anticipation Note Fund and Note Proceeds Account, all as provided in the Resolution; and

WHEREAS, under the Act and the Resolution, the Board has authority to issue Additional Notes (defined herein), which are payable from Pledged Funds on a parity with the Outstanding Notes (defined herein); and

WHEREAS, on April 20, 2001, the Board adopted a First Supplemental Resolution pertaining to the authorization and issuance of its Grant Anticipation Notes, Series 2001A (the "Series 2001A Notes"), which were issued in an original aggregate principal amount of \$142,890,000 and which have been paid; and

WHEREAS, on April 18, 2003, the Board adopted a Second Supplemental Resolution pertaining to the authorization and sale of its Grant Anticipation Notes, Series 2003A (the "Series 2003A Notes"), which were issued in an original aggregate principal amount of \$148,955,000; and

WHEREAS, on April 16, 2004, the Board adopted a Third Supplemental Resolution pertaining to the authorization and sale of its Grant Anticipation Notes, Series 2004A (the "Series 2004A Notes"), which were issued in an original aggregate principal amount of \$51,000,000 and which have been paid; and

WHEREAS, on September 17, 2004, the Board adopted a Fourth Supplemental Resolution pertaining to the authorization and sale of its Grant Anticipation Notes, Series 2004B (the "Series 2004B Notes"), which were issued in an original aggregate principal amount of \$104,385,000 and which are payable from the Pledged Funds on a parity with the Series 2003A Notes; and

WHEREAS, on November 16, 2007, the Board adopted a Fifth Supplemental Resolution pertaining to the authorization and sale of its Grant Anticipation Notes, Series 2008A (the

"Series 2008A Notes"), which were issued in an original aggregate principal amount of \$68,000,000 and which are payable from the Pledged Funds on a parity with the Series 2003A Notes and the Series 2004B Notes; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2009, the Board adopted a Sixth Supplemental Resolution pertaining to the authorization and sale of its Grant Anticipation Notes, Series 2009A (the "Series 2009A Notes"), which were issued in an original aggregate principal amount of \$60,000,000 and which are payable from the Pledged Funds on a parity with the Series 2003A Notes, the Series 2004B Notes and the 2008A Notes; and

WHEREAS, on December 17, 2010, the Board adopted a Seventh Supplemental Resolution pertaining to the authorization and sale of its Grant Anticipation Notes, Series 2011A (the "Series 2011A Notes"), which were issued in an original aggregate principal amount of \$158,585,000 and which are payable from the Pledged Funds on a parity with the Series 2003A Notes, the Series 2004B Notes, the 2008A Notes and the 2009A Notes; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds and determines that not to exceed \$68,000,000 principal amount of Arizona Transportation Board, Grant Anticipation Refunding Notes, Series 2012 (the "Series 2012 Notes"), in one or more series, should be authorized, sold, issued and delivered for the purpose of refunding the Notes Being Refunded (defined in Section 102 hereof), such Series 2012 Notes to be in the denominations and have such maturities and bear such interest rates, be secured by and payable, together with all Outstanding Notes and all Additional Notes, from the Pledged Funds, all as hereinafter provided; and

WHEREAS, prior to the sale of the Notes Being Refunded, the Director of the Department entered into one or more Grant Agreements (defined in Section 201 hereof) relating to such Notes Being Refunded, which Grant Agreements identified the Project or Projects relating to each series of such Notes Being Refunded, and such Grant Agreements constituted the "Grant Agreement" (within the meaning of the Act) related to the Series 2012 Notes; and

WHEREAS, the Board will by separate resolution or resolutions choose a group of investment bankers as the underwriters (the "Underwriters") for each series of Series 2012 Notes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Arizona Transportation Board as follows:

ARTICLE I

DEFINITIONS; AUTHORITY; AND APPLICATION OF ORIGINAL RESOLUTION

SECTION 101. Supplements to Original Resolution, Application of Original Resolution.

(a) This Eighth Supplemental Resolution is supplemental to the Original Resolution, as supplemented and amended by the Second Supplemental Resolution, the Third Supplemental Resolution, the Fourth Supplemental Resolution, the Fifth Supplemental Resolution, the Sixth Supplemental Resolution and the Seventh Supplemental Resolution (collectively, with any subsequent amendment or supplement, the "Resolution"), and is adopted

to provide for issuance of the Series 2012 Notes, in accordance with Sections 203 and 901(e) of the Original Resolution and in accordance with the Act.

(b) Except as expressly set forth herein, each and every term and condition contained in the Original Resolution, as amended by the Second Supplemental Resolution and the Seventh Supplemental Resolution, apply to the Series 2012 Notes with such omissions, variations and modifications thereof as may be appropriate to reflect the terms of the Series 2012 Notes as set forth herein.

(c) As set forth in Section 103 of the Original Resolution, the Resolution shall be deemed to be and shall constitute a contract between the Board and the Owners from time to time of the Notes; and the pledge and the covenants and agreements set forth in the Resolution to be performed on behalf of the Board and Department shall, as provided in the Resolution, be for the equal benefit, protection and security of the Owners of any and all of the Notes.

SECTION 102. Definitions. All terms which are defined in Section 101 of the Original Resolution shall have the same meanings, respectively, in this Eighth Supplemental Resolution as such terms are given in said Section 101 of the Original Resolution, and in the Second Supplemental Resolution, the Third Supplemental Resolution, the Fourth Supplemental Resolution, the Sixth Supplemental Resolution and the Seventh Supplemental Resolution.

In addition, the following terms used in this Eighth Supplemental Resolution shall have the following meanings:

"<u>Certificate of Award</u>" shall mean the Certificate of Award relating to each series of the Series 2012 Notes, which determines certain matters and the financial terms of the Series 2012 Notes within the standards and parameters set forth herein, as authorized by Section 301(e) hereof.

"<u>Grant Agreement</u>" means, collectively, (i) the Grant Agreement for the Series 2003A Notes to be refunded, as defined in the Second Supplemental Resolution, and (ii) the Grant Agreement for the Series 2004B Notes to be refunded, as defined in the Fourth Supplemental Resolution.

"<u>Notes Being Refunded</u>" means, collectively, (i) all or a portion of the Series 2003A Notes maturing on July 1 in the years 2014 and 2015, and (ii) all or a portion of the Series 2004B Notes maturing on July 1 in the years 2015 and 2016, as identified in the Certificate of Award.

"<u>Series 2012 Notes</u>" means the Arizona Transportation Board, Grant Anticipation Notes, Series 2012, issued pursuant to this Eighth Supplemental Resolution.

SECTION 103. Statutory Authority for this Eighth Supplemental Resolution. This Eighth Supplemental Resolution is adopted pursuant to the provisions of the Act.

ARTICLE II AUTHORIZATION AND ISSUANCE OF SERIES 2012 NOTES; AMENDMENT OF GRANT AGREEMENT

SECTION 201. Principal Amount, Designation and Series.

(a) Pursuant to the provisions of the Resolution, one or more Series of Additional Notes entitled to the benefit, protection and security of the Resolution are hereby authorized in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$68,000,000.

(b) Such Series of Additional Notes shall be designated as, and shall be distinguished from the Notes of all other Series, by the title "Arizona Transportation Board, Grant Anticipation Refunding Notes, Series 2012." If the Series 2012 Notes are issued in more than one series, each series shall be identified by the addition of the number 1, 2, 3, etc. in the name "Series 2012-."

SECTION 202. Purpose. Each series of the Series 2012 Notes are issued to provide moneys to refund all or a portion of the Outstanding Notes Being Refunded and to pay Note Issuance Costs for that series.

SECTION 203. Date, Maturities and Interest Rates.

(a) The Series 2012 Notes shall be dated the date of delivery (the "Dated Date") as specified in the Certificate of Award relating to that series, and shall bear interest from the Dated Date, except as otherwise provided in Section 301 of the Original Resolution.

(b) Each series of the Series 2012 Notes shall: be in the aggregate principal amount; bear interest on January 1 and July 1 of each year commencing July 1, 2012 (or such other date specified in the applicable Certificate of Award), at the interest rate or rates per annum; and mature on January 1 or July 1, as determined in the applicable Certificate of Award, in principal amounts (whether by stated maturity or mandatory sinking fund redemption), all as set forth in the Certificate of Award for such series; provided that: (i) the true interest rate on each series of the Series 2012 Notes shall not exceed 3.00% per annum; (ii) the Series 2012 Notes shall mature on July 1 in any or all of the years 2013 through 2016; and (iii) the aggregate principal amount thereof, together with the principal amount of the Series 2003A Notes and Series 2004B Notes, if any, which will remain Outstanding after the defeasance of the Notes Being Refunded, shall not exceed the aggregate of the revenues scheduled to be received by the Department under the Grant Agreement for such series of Notes.

SECTION 204. Denomination, Numbers and Letters. The Series 2012 Notes shall be issued in registered form in Authorized Denominations. Unless the Board shall otherwise direct in the applicable Certificate of Award, each series of the Series 2012 Notes shall be numbered consecutively beginning with the number one.

SECTION 205. Book-Entry-Only System, Place of Payment and Paying Agent.

(a) The Series 2012 Notes shall be initially issued to a Depository (defined below) for holding in a Book-Entry-Only System (defined below), without further action by the

Board. While in the Book-Entry-Only System, there shall be a single note form representing the entire aggregate principal amount of each maturity of the Series 2012 Notes, and such note shall be registered in the name of the Depository or its nominee, as Owner, and immobilized in the custody of the Depository or its designee. While in the Book-Entry-Only System, the Series 2012 Notes shall not be transferable or exchangeable, except for (i) transfer to a successor Depository or its nominee, (ii) withdrawal of the Series 2012 Notes in Book-Entry-Only System from the Depository as provided in the next succeeding paragraph of this Subsection (a), and (iii) exchange of a Series 2012 Note in Book-Entry-Only Form for another Series 2012 Note in Book-Entry-Only Form in an amount equal to the outstanding aggregate principal amount of such Note. While in the Book-Entry-Only System, the beneficial owners of book entry interests in the Series 2012 Notes shall not have any right to receive Series 2012 Notes in the form of physical note certificates.

Pursuant to a request by the Assistant Director for Finance and Accounting of the Department to discontinue the Book-Entry-Only System, the Note Registrar shall remove the Series 2012 Notes from the Book-Entry-Only System after 30 days notice to the Depository. The Depository may determine not to continue to act as Depository for the Series 2012 Notes upon 30 days written notice to the Note Registrar, the Board and the Assistant Director for Finance and Accounting of the Department.

If the use of the Book-Entry-Only System is discontinued, the Note Registrar shall permit withdrawal of the Series 2012 Notes from the Depository and, upon the request of the Depository, shall authenticate and deliver Series 2012 Note certificates in fully registered form and in denominations authorized by Section 204 hereof to the assignees of the Depository or its nominee. Such withdrawal, authentication and delivery shall be at the cost and expense (including costs of printing or otherwise preparing, and delivering, such replacement Series 2012 Note certificates) of the Board; provided that if requested by the Depository, the Note Registrar shall register all or any portion of the Series 2012 Notes in the name of the former Depository.

The following capitalized terms used in this Section 205(a) shall have the meanings set forth below:

"Book-Entry-Only Form" or "Book-Entry-Only System" means, for the Series 2012 Notes, a form or system, as applicable, under which (i) physical note certificates in fully registered form are issued only to a Depository or its nominee as Owner, with the physical note certificates "immobilized" in the custody of, or on behalf of, the Depository and (ii) the ownership of book entry interests in the Series 2012 Notes and principal of, premium, if any, and interest thereon may be transferred only through a book entry made by entities other than the Board or the Note Registrar. The records maintained by entities other than the Board and the Note Registrar constitute the written record that identifies the beneficial owners, and records the transfer, of such book entry interests in the Series 2012 Notes and principal of, premium, if any, and interest thereon.

"Depository" means, for the Series 2012 Notes in Book-Entry-Only Form, The Depository Trust Company (a limited purpose trust company), New York, New York, until a successor Depository shall have been appointed pursuant to this Subsection and, thereafter, Depository shall mean the successor Depository. Any Depository shall be a securities depository that is a clearing agency under federal law operating and maintaining, with its participants or otherwise, a Book-Entry-Only System to record ownership of beneficial interests in the Series 2012 Notes or principal of, premium, if any, and interest thereon, and to effect transfers of such beneficial interests in the Series 2012 Notes in Book-Entry-Only Form.

(b) So long as the Series 2012 Notes are held by the Depository, principal of the Series 2012 Notes shall be payable by the Paying Agent directly to the Depository. The principal of the Series 2012 Notes may also be payable at any other place which may be provided for such payment by the appointment of any other Paying Agent or Paying Agents, as permitted by the Resolution.

U.S. Bank National Association, Phoenix, Arizona, is hereby appointed Note Registrar and Paying Agent for the Series 2012 Notes.

So long as the Series 2012 Notes are held by the Depository, interest on the Series 2012 Notes shall be payable by the Paying Agent directly to the Depository for registered owners as shown on the registration books held by the Note Registrar as of the close of business on the 15th day of the calendar month immediately preceding an interest payment date or the date on which the principal of Series 2012 Notes is to be paid, which is the date of the Regular Record Date for the Series 2012 Notes; provided, however, that registered owners of \$1,000,000 or more in principal amount of Series 2012 Notes shall be paid by wire transfer to any bank account located in the continental United States, at the expense of such registered owner, if such registered owner has requested, in writing, payment in such manner to the Note Registrar and has furnished the wire address to the Note Registrar on or prior to the Regular Record Date, which request shall remain effective until revoked or changed in writing.

SECTION 206. Redemption Price and Terms; Purchase in Lieu of Redemption.

(a) As set forth in the applicable Certificate of Award, each series of the Series 2012 Notes may be: (i) not subject to optional redemption prior to maturity, or (ii) subject to optional redemption prior to maturity at the option of the Board at any time, on and after the earliest optional redemption date set forth in the applicable Certificate of Award, in whole or in part at the redemption price (expressed as a percentage of the principal amount redeemed) set forth in the applicable Certificate of Award (but not in excess of 105%), plus accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

(b) The Certificate of Award shall also set forth the dollar amount and dates, if any, upon which each series shall be subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption and the method of selecting such series notes for mandatory sinking fund redemption.

(c) If any Series 2012 Note is called for optional redemption in whole or in part, the Board may elect to have such Series 2012 Note purchased in lieu of redemption as follows. No notice of the purchase in lieu of redemption shall be required to be given to the Owners other than the required notice of redemptions.

The Authorized Officer of the Board may direct the Paying Agent, or another agent appointed by the Authorized Officer to make such purchase, to purchase all or such lesser
portion of the Series 2012 Notes called for optional redemption. Any such direction must: be in writing; if less than all of the Series 2012 Notes called for redemption are to be purchased, identify those Series 2012 Notes to be purchased by maturity date and outstanding principal amount in authorized denominations; and be received by the Paying Agent no later than 12:00 noon one Business Day prior to the scheduled redemption date thereof. If so directed, the Paying Agent shall purchase such Series 2012 Notes on the date which otherwise would be the redemption date of such Notes. Any of the Series 2012 Notes called for redemption that are not purchased in lieu of redemption shall be redeemed as otherwise required on such redemption date. On or prior to the scheduled redemption date, any such direction to the Paying Agent may be withdrawn by the Authorized Officer by written notice to the Paying Agent and the scheduled redemption of such Series 2012 Notes shall not occur.

If such purchase is directed by the Authorized Officer, the purchase shall be made for the account of the Board or its designee. The purchase price of the Series 2012 Notes shall be equal to the outstanding principal of, accrued and unpaid interest on and the redemption premium, if any, which would have been payable on such Series 2012 Notes on the scheduled redemption date for such redemption. The Paying Agent shall not purchase the Series 2012 Notes if, by no later than the redemption date, sufficient moneys have not been deposited with the Paying Agent or such moneys are deposited, but are not available.

SECTION 207. Application of Proceeds; Escrow Agreement.

(a) The proceeds, including accrued interest, of each series of the Series 2012 Notes shall be deposited with the State Treasurer, who shall give a receipt therefor. Upon receipt of the payment for a series, the State Treasurer shall simultaneously deposit such proceeds of the sale as follows:

(i) for deposit with the Escrow Trustee (identified below) for the Notes Being Refunded thereby, the amount, if any, set forth in the written direction of the Authorized Board Representative to the State Treasurer to deliver such proceeds, which amount shall be sufficient to defease, as of the time of such deposit, the Notes Being Refunded thereby, pursuant to the terms of the Original Resolution, and

(ii) to the Subaccount for that series in the Note Proceeds Account, the balance.

(b) The State Treasurer shall create a Subaccount in the Note Proceeds Account for each series. Moneys in each Subaccount shall be used as provided in Section 505 of the Original Resolution, except that all Note Issuance Costs paid from such Account shall be those related to the Series 2012 Notes.

(c) Any Authorized Board Representative (as defined in Section 301(b) hereof) is authorized and directed, upon behalf of the Board, to enter into an escrow agreement (the "Escrow Agreement"), between the Board and a bank or trust company therein identified as escrow trustee (the "Escrow Trustee"), to provide for the payment, redemption and defeasance of the Notes Being Refunded in accordance with the provisions of the Original Resolution. The Escrow Agreement shall be substantially in the form of the escrow agreement, dated as of

November 1, 2011, with such modifications, changes and supplements as are necessary or appropriate to reflect the Notes Being Refunded and the Original Resolution, approval of all such modifications, changes or supplements to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof. The Escrow Trustee named in the final Escrow Agreement shall meet the requirements for serving in such capacity, as set forth in Section <u>808</u> of the Original Resolution.

SECTION 208. Substitution, Addition and Amendment of Grant Agreements.

(a) At any time prior to or after the issuance of a series of the Series 2012 Notes, the Department may substitute for any existing Grant Agreement relating to that series a replacement Grant Agreement, so long as:

(i) after giving effect to such substitution, the aggregate of the payments scheduled to be made by the Federal Highway Administration under the Grant Agreement for all series of Notes to be paid from such Grant Agreement is at least equal to the aggregate scheduled Debt Service on the Outstanding Notes when due;

(ii) the replacement Grant Agreement qualifies as a "Grant Agreement" under the Act; and

(iii) the representations and warranties of the Board and, as appropriate, the Department, referred to in Section 208 hereof shall also apply to, and shall be deemed to expressly include, such replacement Grant Agreement and the Project therein described.

(b) At any time, the Department may include an additional Grant Agreement in the definition of Grant Agreement for a series of the Series 2012 Notes, so long as the requirements of Subsection (a)(ii) and (iii) are met.

(c) After the execution of a Certificate of Award for a series of the Series 2012 Notes, if the Department adds or substitutes a Grant Agreement for such series, an Authorized Officer (defined in Section 301(g)) shall provide written notice thereof to the State Treasurer which notice shall: (i) identify the new Grant Agreement; (ii) certify that such new Grant Agreement meets the requirements of Subsection (a) or (b), as applicable; and (iii) if the new Grant Agreement replaces a Grant Agreement, identify the replaced Grant Agreement that is no longer included in the definition of the Grant Agreement for such series.

(d) The Department may amend any Grant Agreement relating to a series (including, without limitation, amending the timing and amount of the payments scheduled to be made thereunder by the Federal Highway Administration) so long as, after giving effect to such amendment, the aggregate of the payments scheduled to be made by the Federal Highway Administration under the Grant Agreement for all series of Notes to be paid from such Grant Agreement is at least equal to the aggregate scheduled Debt Service on such Outstanding Notes when due.

After the execution of a Certificate of Award for a series of the Series 2012 Notes, if the Department amends a Grant Agreement for such series, then an Authorized Officer shall

provide written notice thereof to the State Treasurer, which notice shall certify that the amended Grant Agreement meets the requirements of this Subsection (d).

ARTICLE III SALE OF SERIES 2012 NOTES; CERTIFICATE OF AWARD; AND OTHER ACTIONS

SECTION 301. Sale of Series 2012 Notes; Approval of Official Statement, Note Purchase Agreement and Other Documents.

(a) In connection with the issuance and sale of each series of the Series 2012 Notes, the Director of the Department and Assistant Director for Finance and Accounting of the Department shall cause to be prepared forms of the following:

(i) a Preliminary Official Statement (the "Preliminary Official Statement"), to be used in connection with the marketing of each series of the Series 2012 Notes, which shall be substantially in the form of the Official Statement, dated January 12, 2011, for the Series 2011A Notes;

(ii) the Escrow Agreement between the Board and the Escrow Trustee therein named, relating to the defeasance and refunding of the Notes Being Refunded; and

(iii) a Continuing Disclosure Undertaking by the Board and the Department for the beneficial owners of each series (the "Disclosure Undertaking"), concerning disclosure obligations under Securities and Exchange Commission ("SEC") Rule 15c2-12(b)(5), which shall be substantially in the form of the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking on file with the Secretary of this Board.

(b) The use and distribution by the Underwriters of the Preliminary Official Statement in connection with the public offering and marketing of the Series 2012 Notes is hereby authorized, with such changes, insertions or omissions from the Official Statement, dated January 12, 2011 for the Series 2011A Notes as are appropriate to reflect the terms of the Series 2012 Notes and otherwise as are approved by the Chair or Vice Chair of the Board, or the Director of the Department or the Assistant Director for Finance and Accounting of the Department in their official capacities (each an "Authorized Board Representative"). Any Authorized Board Representative, in his or her official capacity, is authorized to deem "final" such Preliminary Official Statement, with such modifications, changes and supplements deemed necessary or desirable and permitted under SEC Rule 15c2-12 for the purposes thereof, which determination may be contained in the Note Purchase Agreement (identified in (d) below).

(c) The Department is hereby authorized to prepare, on behalf of the Board, a final Official Statement, in substantially the form of the deemed "final" Preliminary Official Statement, for use in connection with the public offering and sale of each series of the Series 2012 Notes, with such changes, insertions and omissions as may be approved by an Authorized Board Representative, in his or her official capacity. The Chair or Vice Chair of the Board and the Director of the Department are each hereby authorized and directed, in their official capacities, to execute the Official Statement and any amendment or supplement thereto,

in the name of and on behalf of the Board and the Department, with such changes therein as shall be approved by an Authorized Board Representative, and thereupon to cause the Official Statement and any such amendment or supplement to be delivered to the Underwriters, with approval of any changes, insertions or omissions to be conclusively evidenced by an Authorized Board Representative's execution and delivery thereof.

(d) The Assistant Director for Finance and Accounting of the Department is hereby authorized and directed to negotiate, on behalf of the Board, the sale, in one or more series, of the Series 2012 Notes to the Underwriters chosen by the Board for such series, upon terms, which shall be consistent with this Eighth Supplemental Resolution, as set forth in a note purchase agreement (the "Note Purchase Agreement") with the Underwriters for each series, which Note Purchase Agreement shall be substantially in the form of the Note Purchase Agreement, dated January 12, 2011 for the Series 2011A Notes, with such changes therein which are consistent with the provisions of this Eighth Supplemental Resolution and are approved by the Chair or Vice Chair of the Board, or if the Chair or Vice Chair is not available to sign at the time of the sale, by the Director of the Department or the Assistant Director for Finance and Accounting of the Department, with the approval of any such changes, insertions or omissions to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.

The Underwriters' compensation and fees (whether paid (i) as a result of their purchase of a series of the Series 2012 Notes at a discount from the par amount thereof or (ii) by the Department to the Underwriters from the proceeds of a series of the Series 2012 Notes as part of the Note Issuance Costs) shall not exceed 1.0% of the principal amount of such series (exclusive of any original issue discount).

Such sale of each series of the Series 2012 Notes shall be evidenced by the (e) Certificate of Award signed by the Chair or Vice Chair of the Board, or if the Chair and Vice Chair are not available to sign at the time of the sale, by the Director of the Department or the Assistant Director for Finance and Accounting of the Department, which shall be consistent with the provisions of this Eighth Supplemental Resolution and shall specify with respect to each series of the Series 2012 Notes the following: whether there shall be one or more series and the designation (-1, -2, -3, etc.) of the series if there are more than one series; the interest rate or rates; the maturity date or dates and mandatory sinking fund redemption amounts, if any; whether such series is subject to optional redemption and, if so, the terms of the optional redemption; the method of selecting the notes to be redeemed, if different from the procedures in the Original Resolution; whether all, or any maturity of, such series will be insured and, if so, the Note Insurer; whether there is any capitalized interest deposited into the Grant Anticipation Note Fund; the Notes Being Refunded by such series, together with such additional information as required by the terms of the Resolution, this Eighth Supplemental Resolution or the Note Purchase Agreement. The Note Purchase Agreement shall be consistent with the provisions of this Eighth Supplemental Resolution and the Certificate of Award.

(f) The Chair or Vice Chair of the Board and the Director of the Department are each hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver for each series the Disclosure Undertaking for such series, with such changes, insertions and omissions from the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking, dated January 25, 2011, as are approved, said execution being conclusive evidence of such approval. (g) The Chair and each officer of the Board, the Director of the Department and the Assistant Director for Finance and Accounting of the Department acting in their official capacities (each, an "Authorized Officer") shall be, and each of them hereby is, authorized and directed for each series of the Series 2012 Notes to: (i) execute and deliver any agreement of the Board relating to any Note Insurance Policy for any series of Series 2012 Notes, any letter of representation to The Depository Trust Company and any and all other documents and instruments relating to the Series 2012 Notes and (ii) to do and cause to be done any and all acts and things, in each case as may be necessary or proper for carrying out the transactions contemplated by the Resolution, the Official Statement, the Note Purchase Agreement, the Grant Agreement, the Disclosure Undertaking, any Note Insurance Policy and the Tax Compliance Certificate (identified in Section 303(b)).

(h) All actions taken by the Director of the Department, Assistant Director for Finance and Accounting of the Department or the staff or agents of the Department or the Board preparatory to the offering, sale, issuance and delivery of the Series 2012 Notes are hereby ratified and confirmed.

SECTION 302. Form of Series 2012 Notes, Note Registrar's Certificate of Authentication. The form of the Series 2012 Notes and the Note Registrar's Certificate of Authentication thereon shall be substantially in the form of Exhibit A hereto, with such variations, omissions and insertions as are required or permitted by the Resolution.

SECTION 303. Tax Covenant Relating to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.

(a) The Board covenants that it will use, and will restrict the use and investment of, the proceeds of each series of the Series 2012 Notes in such manner and to such extent as may be necessary so that (i) each series of the Series 2012 Notes will not (1) constitute private activity bonds, arbitrage bonds or hedge bonds under Section 141, 148 or 149 of the Code; or (2) be treated other than as bonds to which Section 103(a) of the Code applies, and (ii) the interest thereon will not be treated as a preference item under Section 57 of the Code.

(b) The Board further covenants (i) that it will take or cause to be taken such actions that may be required of it for the interest on the tax-exempt Series 2012 Notes to be and remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes, (ii) that it will not take or authorize to be taken any actions that would adversely affect that exclusion, and (iii) that it, or persons acting for it, will, among other acts of compliance, (1) apply the proceeds of the Series 2012 Notes to the governmental purposes of the borrowing, (2) restrict the yield on investment property, (3) make timely and adequate payments, from any lawfully available funds, to the federal government of Rebate Amounts, as defined and as required under the Tax Compliance Certificate of the Board and the Department relating to each series of the Series 2012 Notes (the "Tax Compliance Certificate"), (4) maintain books and records and make calculations and reports, and (5) refrain from certain uses of those proceeds and, as applicable, of property financed with such proceeds, all in such manner and to the extent necessary to assure such exclusion of that interest under the Code.

The Director of the Department is hereby authorized (i) to make or effect (c) any election, selection, designation, choice, consent, approval, or waiver, on behalf of the Board, with respect to the Series 2012 Notes as the Board is permitted or required to make or give under the federal income tax laws, including, without limitation thereto, any of the elections provided for in Section 148(f)(4)(B) and (C) of the Code or available under Section 148 of the Code, for the purpose of assuring, enhancing or protecting favorable tax treatment or status of the Series 2012 Notes or interest thereon or assisting compliance with requirements for that purpose, reducing the burden or expense of such compliance, reducing the rebate amount or payments of penalties, or making payments of special amounts in lieu of making computations to determine, or paying, Rebate Amount (as defined in the Tax Compliance Certificate) as rebate, or obviating those amounts or payments, as determined by the Director of the Department, which action shall be in writing and signed by the Director of the Department, (ii) to take any and all other actions, make or obtain calculations, make payments, and make or give reports, covenants and certifications of and on behalf of the Board, as may be appropriate to assure the exclusion of interest from gross income and the intended tax status of the Series 2012 Notes, and (iii) to give one or more appropriate certificates of the Board, for inclusion in the transcript of proceedings for the Series 2012 Notes, setting forth the reasonable expectations of the Board regarding the amount and use of all the proceeds of the Series 2012 Notes, the facts, circumstances and estimates on which they are based, and other facts and circumstances relevant to the tax treatment of the interest on and the tax status of the Series 2012 Notes.

(d) The Board may create, or may direct the State Treasurer to create, such accounts or subaccounts as it shall deem necessary or advisable in order to comply with the foregoing covenants and the Tax Compliance Certificate.

SECTION 304. Further Actions and Authorized Officers. For each series of the Series 2012 Notes, each Authorized Officer acting singly, is authorized and directed, to execute and deliver any and all documents and instruments, and each Authorized Officer and each other appropriate official of the Department are authorized and directed to do and cause to be done any and all acts and things, in each case necessary or proper for carrying out the transactions contemplated by the Resolution, this Eighth Supplemental Resolution, the Official Statement, the Note Purchase Agreement, the Disclosure Undertaking, any letter of representation to The Depository Trust Company, the Grant Agreement related to each series of the Series 2012 Notes, the Project identified in such Grant Agreements, any Note Insurance Policy and any agreement relating to any Note Insurance Policy.

Capitalized terms not defined herein have the meaning set forth in the Resolution.

As provided in the Resolution, the Outstanding Series 2003A Notes, the Series 2004B Notes, the Series 2008A Notes, Series 2009A Notes, the Series 2011A Notes and the Series 2012 Notes together with any Additional Notes that may subsequently be issued pursuant to the Resolution (herein collectively called the "Notes"), are special and limited obligations of the Board, and the payment of the principal, redemption price, and interest thereon are payable in accordance with their terms and the provisions of the Resolution from, and are secured solely by a pledge of, the Pledged Funds (being the amounts on deposit in the Grant Anticipation Note Fund and the Note Proceeds Account, both as defined in the Resolution). Pledged Funds include: (a) revenues received by the Arizona Department of Transportation from the Federal Highway Administration and deposited into the Grant Anticipation Note Fund, including Grant Revenues received under the Grant Agreements with the Federal Highway Administration related to highway projects therein defined, and (b) moneys transferred into the Grant Anticipation Note Fund, as provided in the Resolution.

Reference is hereby made to the Act, the Resolution and any and all supplements thereto and modifications and amendments thereof for a description of: the pledge and covenants securing the Notes; the nature of such pledge; the rights of the Registered Owners of the Notes; the terms and conditions upon which the Series 2012 Notes are issued and Additional Notes may be issued on a parity therewith; the terms and provisions upon which this Note shall cease to be entitled to any pledge, benefit or security under the Resolution; and for other terms and provisions thereof, to all of which the Registered Owner assents, by acceptance hereof.

THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THIS NOTE ARE PAYABLE FROM THE PLEDGED FUNDS AND NO REGISTERED OWNER HEREOF SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO COMPEL ANY EXERCISE OF ANY TAXING POWER OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA TO PAY THIS NOTE OR THE INTEREST HEREON. THIS NOTE IS NOT A GENERAL OBLIGATION OF THE BOARD OR THE DEPARTMENT. THIS NOTE IS A LIMITED AND SPECIAL OBLIGATION OF THE BOARD AND IS PAYABLE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TERMS HEREOF AND SHALL NOT BE A GENERAL, SPECIAL OR ANY OTHER OBLIGATION OR ANY OTHER INDEBTEDNESS OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA. THIS NOTE SHALL NOT BE ENFORCEABLE AGAINST THE STATE OF ARIZONA NOR SHALL PAYMENT HEREOF BE ENFORCEABLE OUT OF THE MONEYS OF THE BOARD OR THE DEPARTMENT, OTHER THAN THE PLEDGED FUNDS. THIS NOTE IS NOT A DEBT OF THE STATE OF ARIZONA, THE BOARD OR THE DEPARTMENT WITHIN THE MEANING OF ANY CONSTITUTIONAL OR STATUTORY LIMITATION.

All covenants, agreements and obligations of the Board and under the Resolution may be discharged and satisfied at or prior to the maturity or redemption of this Note if moneys or certain specified Defeasance Obligations shall have been deposited in a separate trust to provide for payment thereof.

There shall be a single Note representing each maturity which shall be immobilized in the custody of DTC with the beneficial owners having no right to receive notes in the form of physical securities or certificates. Ownership of beneficial interests in the Notes shall be shown by book-entry-only system maintained and operated by DTC and its participants, and transfers of ownership of beneficial interests shall be made only by DTC and its participants and by book entry, and the Board and the Note Registrar shall have no responsibility therefor. DTC is expected to maintain records of the positions of participants in the Notes and the participants and persons acting through participants are expected to maintain records of the purchasers of beneficial interests in the Notes. During March the Department finalized 6 projects valued at \$2,301,514.85. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package.

Year to date we have finalized 84 projects. The total cost of these 84 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 4.3%. Deducting incentive/bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to 1.8%.

COMMENTS:

Recommend rejection of the bid from Cholla Pavement Maintenance, Inc. (Cholla) for failure to comply with DBE requirements for the project. Recommend award to Cactus Transport, Inc. (Cactus) contingent upon review by ADOT Civil Rights to confirm that Cactus has complied with the DBE requirements. The State Engineer will provide an update at the Board Meeting.

In its bid documents, Cholla certified that it had not met the stated DBE goal of 4.12% for this project but had made a good faith effort to do so as required by the special provisions. The special provisions clearly state that to claim good faith effort, a bidder having trouble meeting the DBE goal must contact ADOT Civil Rights for assistance before the bids open. Cholla failed to contact Civil Rights for assistance as required before bids opened. Cholla has done so on other past projects, and so should be well acquainted with this requirement and the assistance that Civil Rights can provide, but failed to do so on this project.

The special provisions also state that for a contract to be awarded on the basis of good faith efforts, a bidder must show that it took all necessary and reasonable steps to solicit, assist and use DBE firms to meet the DBE goal prior to the bid and that it actively and aggressively sought DBE participation in the project. Cholla submitted documentation to show that it contacted three DBE firms, but all for the same type of work. If Cholla had contacted Civil Rights it would have found that there were other areas of work that could have been performed by DBE firms. Further, while Cholla claims to have made a good faith effort, it was unable to find even one DBE firm to help meet the goal on the project. All four other bidders on this project certified with their bids that they were able to meet the goal. Review and analysis by ADOT Civil Rights concludes that Cholla did not use all necessary and reasonable means to solicit, assist and use DBEs for this project prior to the bid and did not actively and aggressively seek DBE participation.

*ITEM 13g: COMMENTS continued

Because Cholla failed to contact Civil Rights for assistance before bids opened, and failed to demonstrate compliance with the requirements necessary to show good faith effort, its bid must be rejected. The result is that Cactus becomes the apparent low bidder and has until 4:00 P.M. on April 16, 2012, to submit its DBE Intended Participation Affidavit and required information to the Civil Rights Office for review.

In accordance with the Standard Specifications, bidders may file a protest on these recommended actions but must do so on or before 5:00 P.M. on April 16, 2012. At the time this agenda was prepared, no protests had been received but the deadline had not passed. An update will be provided at the Board Meeting to advise if any protests have been received, the State Engineer's response to any protest, and an update on the findings of the Civil Rights Office DBE compliance review of the bid from Cactus Transport, Inc.
