#### Abstract

Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.


## BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director.
In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route of a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects.
With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction.
The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

## CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

## MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

## BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion.
In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

Rod gave an update about the Globe District. The district currently has about 95 employees. They operate the maintenance and construction areas in five yards located in Show Low, Springerville, St. Johns, Roosevelt, and the larger one down in Globe. The district services portions of seven counties: Apache, Navajo, Gila, Pinal, Graham, Greenlee, and a little bit of Maricopa. We have approximately 892 centerline miles, which is about 2,700 lane miles of roadways. A unique feature of this district is there are no interstates in Globe; however, we do have a significant amount of scenic highways. More so than any other district. Another unique factor is there are 159 miles of minor collectors, which means those roads are not necessarily available for Federal funding. The Globe District has unique maintenance issues. Of course, there is a lot of snow and a lot of rocks. Some of the challenges are from the flooding from the Wallow Fire. A lot of trees are causing a hazardous condition by falling on the roadways. We are having to remove the fallen trees and getting them out of the right of way.

## ITEM 4: Financial Report - Kristine Ward

Kristine stated that the report would be abbreviated this morning due to the board meeting falling so early in the month. Financial numbers are not in yet for May. She gave a brief HURF Revenues Report. In the month of May, we collected $\$ 95.4$ million in revenues and are $.4 \%$ ahead of 2011, so it is relatively in the black. We are $4.2 \%$ behind the forecast for the month. This is largely due to the gas and use fuel tax. They are the primary drivers behind this decrease. We are $4.6 \%$ behind in this category over 2011 and we are $5.9 \%$ behind forecast. The lagging in those categories was slightly offset by some growth in VLT. We experienced 25\% growth in new car registrations over last year; but the base was small. In 2004, there were more than 406,000 new car registrations and in 2012 to date, we are under 200,000.

Year to date for HURF, we are at $\$ 1.1$ billion in revenues. We are at . $2 \%$ ahead FY11 at this same time and $.7 \%$ behind estimates for 2012 again due to the gas and fuel tax collections. Year to date in the Aviation Fund, we have $\$ 21.7$ million in revenues and 10.4\% below FY2011.

## ITEM 5: Financing Program - Kristine Ward

Kristine gave the financing program update. The last few months have been spent on the GAN Refunding approved by the Board. The refunding closed on May $30^{\text {th }}$. We experienced $\$ 2.5$ million in savings associated with that refunding and it had an effective yield around $.65 \%$. With regards to financing, we are exploring possible HURF refunding opportunities. We have constraints due to some statutory restrictions. There is an additional bonds test that requires revenues that are three
times over our maximum annual debt reserves. The issue is that even though we will save money. We cannot meet that initial bonds test. We are looking at drafting legislation to modify that restriction.

## *ITEM 6: Final approval of the Tentative FY 2013-2017 Statewide Transportation

## 6F. FY 2013-2017 Statewide Transportation Facilities Construction Program Financial Plan - Kristine Ward

Fiscal Constraint: The Federal Highway Administration requires a demonstration of sufficient funds (federal, state and local funds) to implement proposed transportation improvements as well as to operate and maintain the entire system, through the comparison of revenues and costs. Prior to the tentative program being developed Financial Management Services provided the Multimodal Planning Division/Scott and team as well as MAG, revenue estimates on which to base the program. This took place in the fall of last year. The revenue estimates have not changed since those projections were provided. The current program meets the fiscal constraint requirements under current projected financial conditions.
Risks to the Projections-Federal Reauthorization: Federal aid as well as the fuel tax flowing into the Highway Trust Fund is currently set to expire on the $30^{\text {th }}$ of this month. Federal aid represents more than $65 \%$ of the statewide program. We anticipate another extension at current federal funding levels and do not anticipate a new long term reauthorization until sometime after the election. The Highway Trust Fund is forecasted to be insolvent at the end of CY2012 beginning of 2013. Congress will need to pass a new long term reauthorization and deal with the insolvency issue. Depending on how Congress addresses these issues, our current projections could be at significant risk.
State Revenue Forecasts: HURF revenues, as noted earlier, are largely flat and are struggling to meet current projections. In July and August, we begin the next round of forecasting through the Risk Analysis Process. Current forecasts will be re-examined as well as forecasting the new $5^{\text {th }}$ year, 2018. Depending on what the panel forecasts, the current program could be impacted. RARF will go through the same reforecasting process as HURF.
Legislative Action: In FY2012 the Legislature made significant changes to HURF distributions that ultimately resulted in the Department's credit being downgraded by the rating agencies. The FY2013 Budget reverses those actions, but still maintains significant transfers to the DPS. If the Legislature finds itself in a difficult financial position once again, as is currently projected with the FY2014 expiration of the temporary sales tax, and they look again to the Department's fund sources, then the current program could be impacted.
Economic Conditions: The current forecasts count continued recovery of the economy, albeit conservative. If however, we experience a double dip recession, the current program would likely be impacted.

Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5\% are detailed in your board package. Year to date we have finalized 113 projects. The total cost of these 113 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by $6.2 \%$. Deducting incentive/bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to $3.0 \%$.

The Status of Projects Under Construction report for June 2012 shows 113 projects under construction valued at $\$ 991,108,262.30$. The transportation board awarded 7 projects during June valued at approximately $\$ 12.8$ million.

During June the Department finalized 17 projects valued at $\$ 136,260,045.61$. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than $5 \%$ are detailed in your board package.
