Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director. In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route of a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects. With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction.

The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the second Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion.

In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

All such accelerated agenda items will be individually considered and acted upon ahead of all other agenda items. With respect to all agenda items not accelerated. i.e., those items upon which action has been deferred until later in the meeting, the Chairman will entertain a single motion and a single second to that motion and will call for a single vote of the members without any discussion of any agenda items so grouped together and so singly acted upon. ITEM A: Overview of the Tentative FY14-18 Transportation Facilities Construction Program

Scenario A – Focus on Preservation. This scenario focuses the most investment on keeping the existing highway system in good repair with the least investment in programmed major projects in greater Arizona. There would be 81 preservation projects from 2014 to 2016, 39 bridge projects, one major project, and 690 miles of pavement projects. An average of \$184 million per year in preservation from 2014 through 2018 would be allocated. Arizona's interstate system is projected to fall below federal performance measures for pavement quality in 2031 with this scenario.

Scenario B – Focus on Programmed Major Projects. This scenario focuses the most investment on major projects that are programmed in greater Arizona with the lowest investment in keeping existing highways in good repair. There would be nine major projects from 2014 to 2017. From 2014 to 2016, there would be 25 bridge projects and 458 miles of pavement projects. An average of \$142 million per year in preservation from 2014 to 2018 would be allocated. Arizona's interstate system is projected to fall below federal performance measures for pavement quality in 2017 with this scenario.

Scenario C – Combination of Preservation and Major Projects. This scenario focuses on some investment in major projects that are programmed in greater Arizona with less investment in keeping existing highways in good repair. There would be four major projects from 2014 to 2017, 39 bridge projects from 2014 to 2018, and 524 miles in pavement projects. An average of \$149 million per year in preservation from 2014 to 2018 would be allocated. Arizona's interstate system is projected to fall below federal performance measures for pavement quality in 2021 with this scenario.

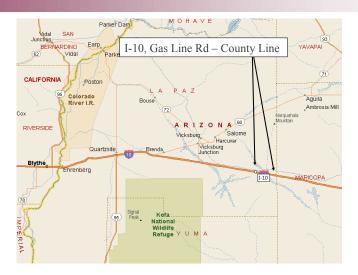

<u>ITEM 4: Legislative Report — Ralene Whitmer, Government Relations Specialist</u>

Ralene gave a briefing on a few State Legislative bills.

HB 2172, ADOT Administration, there is a portion of the bill that would allow more flexibility for parity bonds when we need to refinance those bonds. Signed by the Governor on April 9, 2013.

HB 2477, Photo Radar on State Highways that basically incorporates what we currently have in the contract with the cities into State Law. Signed by the Governor on April 10, 2013.

HB 2621, Funds, State Parks, Roads, Fees, this bill would require a voluntary fee from individuals that would be collected at the time of registration to help fund state park projects. The bill is waiting for Senate Committee of the Whole.

SB 1283, County Boundary Change Study Committee, this bill establishes Joint Committee on County Boundary Changes to study the feasibility of changing county boundaries, including the fiscal and related TPT distribution of equity impacts. The bill passed the both houses.

SB 1317, Tribal Airports, State Aviation Fund, that would allow publicly owned and operated airport facilities to receive State Aviation Fund monies and those airports would be on Indian reservations. The bill is awaiting Rules in the House.

As was mentioned earlier today, SB 1080, Highway Construction Projects; Joint Committee on Capital Review (JCCR) requires the JCCR to review all Arizona Department of Transportation highway construction projects costing more than \$15 million. SB 1080 has language proposed to it relating to the underground storage tank state tax account. The bill would extend the account for two years. That bill and the proposed amendments for the underground storage fees is awaiting the votes in the Senate Committee of the Whole. The bill also establishes a 15-member Study Committee.

ITEM 5: Financial Report—Kristine Ward

Kristine updated the Board of financial presentation. The status of the **HURF** fund is a decrease of 0.6 percent below the same period last year and 1.4 percent below the estimate. March HURF collections amounted to \$100.3 million, a decrease of 2.8 percent from March 2012 and 0.9 percent below the estimate. Gas is 1.2% behind FY2012 and Use (Diesel) is 5.2% behind FY2012. One bright area, Vehicle License Tax (VLT) revenue category has posted positive year-over-year growth in five of the last six

months. VLT is 2.1% ahead of FY2012. In terms of the tentative program, we still maintain physical constraints. There is a concern of the impacts of future forecasts. Because if we do not reach the revenue base that we had intended and the growth from a lower revenue base, that will be a problem. If we experience lower growth rates than we originally anticipated, that is also an issue. We are watching and going forward.

In regards of the **RARF** fund, we are tracking within forecast goal range of +2%/-1%. Retail Sales was 6.5% ahead of FY2012 and Restaurant & Bar were also stronger at 6.9% ahead of FY2012. Overall we are a bit below forecast.

Director Halikowski also made a quick point on diesel fuel. There is a lot of talk by some major trucking companies to use compressed natural gas instead of diesel. And they are talking about building a CNG highway across the country so that they have refueling infrastructure. One point to the Board, we don't collect anything for CNG. So as we move forward in this new world of alternative fuels, just realize that it continues to eat away at our fuel tax revenues.

ITEM 6: Multimodal Planning Division Report—Scott Omer

Scott said there is no real update of the I-11 Corridor Profile study; it continues the same. Scott gave a status report on Arizona's three new Metropolitan Planning Organizations. First, the Lake Havasu MPO was designated by the Governor on March 26, 2013 and the process is complete. He said that by complete, he means that it is designated and there are a couple of years on the development of that new MPO. The LHMPO includes just Lake Havasu City. We will work with the LHMPO to establish a work program and assist them in their formation. Second is the Casa Grande (Sun Corridor MPO). The packet was transmitted to the Governor's Office on March 25th. The Sun Corridor MPO includes Casa Grande, Coolidge, Eloy, and Pinal County. Third is the Sierra Vista MPO. The packet was transmitted to the Governor's Office on March 27th. The Sierra Vista MPO includes Sierra Vista and Cochise County. The Sun Corridor and Sierra Vista packets are together waiting on the Governor's signature. We assist the last two MPO's up and running as soon as possible as well. All the MPO's will generally have a State Transportation Board Member as part of their makeup. We will be contacting each and every one of the Board in that formation process and how involved you want to be.

The MAG Boundary Smoothing is in process and will be transmitted to the Governor next week. The new MAG boundaries include Maricopa, Florence, a portion of Pinal County around San Tan Valley, and the rest of the Gila River Indian Community (GRIC). A portion of the GRIC (Maricopa County) is currently in MAG. The GRIC have decided to move all of their boundaries under MAG.

Board Member Steve Christy said he was given a list of a committee of community leaders in an advisory capacity for I-11. There are seventeen names. He wanted to make note that of the seventeen names, none are from Southern Arizona. Today we have been speaking in depth of the necessity to include the southern region and the area south of the Gila in the conversation at the table and on the planning stages of I-11. It is very difficult to do that when we have a formalized list of advisory members or consulting members on the I-11 project and none are from southern Arizona. He would like some way to be included in the entire project and input can be given on this expansion.

Scott answered that for clarification, the committee that Board Member Christy refers to is the I-11 Coalition and it is not the ADOT Study. Scott said they do have some ADOT members that are on the I-11 Coalition. We can reach out to the I-11 Coalition and Executive Director Scott Higginson and let them know that the Tucson Region is asking to be involved. The overall ADOT study process is in two phases

and that there is a more detailed phase and it is from the Casa Grande area and the Phoenix Metro area up to Las Vegas and then there is the rest of the study area, which covers the southern portion. The entire part of the state will be actively involved and engaged in that part of the study. We have been out in Pinal and Pima Counties and we encourage their engagement and their active involvement. You as a Board Member can be involved in anytime you would like to. Or, any of the stakeholders committees and those processes or if you are contacted by specific interests, local communities, or different types of government, just let us know and we can reach out to them to get them involved in any of the stakeholder focus groups.

Board member Steve Christy thanked Scott for the clarification.

Scott explained that the items 7-1a-7-1h are to reduce, defer, or transfer Subprograms Funds to establish the funds for construction of the 89T (N-20) Project.

Jennifer referred to the last Board meeting, the update on the US 89 emergency situation. We are going after a three-prong approach. The first prong being the geotechnical investigation, which will be wrapping up soon. The second prong is the temporary detour route on N-20, and the third prong being the longrange solution for US 89. The N-20 project is being contracted as a Construction Manager at Risk process. This allows the Department the opportunity to hire a contractor early in the design phase. The Contractor and the Department can negotiate multiple Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) for constructing the project or portions thereof. We have identified three GMP milestones for the N-20 project. The first being for crushing operations because of the time needed to crush enough materials to pave the 27 miles. Second is the actual paving and construction. Third is the operation of the detour in the short-term lifecycle. Normally we would come to the Board at each of the GMP points to award that portion of the contract. Because of the emergency nature of the project and the need to move quickly, and based on the authority provided to the Department under ARS §28-364 and ARS §28-7362, when a State of Emergency declared by the Governor, the Department is able to award a contract. We are asking the Board to program the \$28 Million which will cover the three GMPs and will allow the Department to move forward with a very critical link in restoring mobility to the area while we work on the long-term solution to US 89. We will continue to update the Board on the project and especially at those GMP milestone dates. So at this time, we are asking for approval to move forward with moving the funding to establish the N-20 project for \$28 Million at this time.

And lastly Brent mentioned that the Gila River Indian Community (GRIC) had recently approached the Department reinitiating discussions of widening of about a 20-mile segment through that area. We are

setting up meetings. The GRIC boundary is essentially north of Casa Grande and ends at Wildhorse Pass Road. We are in the initial stages since they just contacted us.

Director Halikowski asked Brent if he was familiar with the frontage road issue and the Gila River Indian Community, which Brent said that he was not. The Director pointed out that he did not think that those costs were in the estimate. The issue goes back to the 1960's where the GRIC believed that they were promised frontage roads by ADOT along I-10 and that has been a point of discussion and negotiation through the years soon involving my predecessor Victor Mendez. As we enter into negotiations, and I do not know if that issue has come up or not, that may add some costs depending on how the financing and negotiations work out.

ITEM 9: State Engineer's Report & ADOT Dust Task Force Update—Jennifer Toth

ADOT Dust Task Force Update, Jennifer gave an update on the Review of the 2012 Dust Storm Public Safety Program. In June 2012; ADOT launched "Pull Aside, Stay Alive" to educate motorists about the dangers of driving through dust storms. A campaign in partnership with DPS, the National Weather Service, and the Governor's Office of Highway Safety. We continue to use the overhead message boards and our 511 system to get alerts out. We have had successful results, worldwide media coverage: CNN, NPR, BBC, and major daily newspapers around the world. Haboob contest was highly successful as well. There was a Dust Storm Workshop in March 2013. On March 5 in Casa Grande, more than 50 experts from the National Weather Service, and local air quality, public safety and transportation agencies met at the second-annual Southern Arizona Dust Storm Workshop sponsored by ADOT and the National Weather Service. There were 25 dust storm warnings across Arizona in 2012; twenty-two warnings in the Phoenix and Tucson regions and three warnings in the Flagstaff region. The National Weather Service offices in Phoenix and Tucson have made efforts to increase the number of spotters in the dust-prone regions by 20 percent. The goals for the 2013 Dust Storm Public Safety Program are to reinforce the overall safety tips so drivers know what to do if they are caught in blowing dust, and to capitalize on the larger audience of new followers of ADOT's social media by continuing to broadcast the "Pull Aside, Stay Alive" message.

Technology Partnership with the University of Arizona Dust Storm Smartphone Application (APP), the University of Arizona recently created a "Dust Storm" APP for the iPhone that provides active dust storm alert information and safety tips for motorists. Dust storm alerts are displayed in the APP based on the phone's geographical location. Safety tips from ADOT's "Pull Aside, Stay Alive" dust storm safety campaign are featured in the APP.

DUST (Dual Use Safety Technology) Warning System, ADOT is currently in the second year of a pilot project (started in August 2011) with the Federal Highway Administration that is testing a DUST (Dual Use Safety Technology) warning system on Interstate 10 in the Bowie and San Simon areas of Cochise County. The goal is to deliver real-time safety warnings to drivers and alert ADOT maintenance crews during adverse weather conditions in a highway corridor that experiences dust storms and blizzards. While the \$600,000 pilot project shows promise, it is still under evaluation and undergoing adjustments.

ADOT's Twitter account surpassed 20,000 followers in March 2013, and continues to use Facebook and blog to get the messages out. There will also be a round 2 of the Haboob Haikui challenge because of the success of reaching national attention. In addition Jennifer will be going to Washington DC at the end of May to speak about extreme weather events at AASHTO Climate Change and Extreme Weather Challenges Conference that she will be covering.

State Engineer's Report

Jennifer gave an update on with the Status of Projects under Construction Report for March 2013 shows 94 projects under construction valued at \$917.3 million. The Transportation Board awarded 9 projects during March valued at approximately \$16.7 million. During March the Department finalized 13 projects valued at \$15.3 million. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package. Year to date we have finalized 185 projects. The total cost of these 185 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 6.4%. Deducting incentive, bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to 4.3%.

PUBLIC HEARING

<u>ITEM A: FY2014 - 2018 Statewide Subprograms—Greater Arizona and Statewide Subprograms</u> <u>Scenarios—Scott Omer</u>

Scott presented the tentative five-year program. Scott provided an overview of the five-year plan. He advised everyone to please make their formal comments whether it is online, or in writing, or in person today. You can make comments on the ADOT webpage at www.azdot.gov/FiveYearProgram.

Scott welcomed the two new Board members, Ms. Beaver and Mr. Cuthbertson. He said that he would reach out to each one individually to bring them up to speed on the five-year programming process.

The background on the five-year program is developed collaboratively every year with Intermodal Transportation Division (ITD) our engineering side, Financial Management Services (FMS) our finance side, Multimodal Planning Division (MPD) planning side, and our Regional Partners. It demonstrates how federal and state tax dollars will be spent over the next five years. We approve the five-year program annually. We adopt the program in June and it starts the next fiscal year on July 1. It must be fiscally constrained, which means we cannot program more funding than we have the ability to expect to proceed. Our Chief Financial Officer approves our program each year for fiscal constraint.

MAP-21, which is our enabling legislation for transportation, was approved in October last year. It requires that in the interest of the United States to focus the Federal-aid highway program on the following national goals: safety, infrastructure condition, congestion reduction, system reliability, freight movement and economic vitality, and environmental sustainability. In addition to the five-year program, it is actually supported by ADOT's Long Range Program, our asset management system, as well as the linking Planning to Programming process that we are working on today. The Transportation Board approved the funding scenario in our Long Range plan and it really focused on a combination of preservation, modernization, and expansion. This funding scenario is based on the fact that the Department does not have the amount of revenue that is needed to support the entire infrastructure that for the State of Arizona. In the past the Department has spent approximately 76 percent of the total funding available on expansions including the MAG and PAG regions. The Department does not have the ability to continue in this manner. It was easier when there were transportation funds to invest heavily in expansion. In 2007 everything changed in the matter of revenue that was coming in, the funds

were drastically reduced. The CFO will speak later today of how ADOT's revenue has been impacted throughout the year. The transportation revenue in 2013 is really at the 2004 level, which is a huge statement. ADOT has had to adjust the program accordingly throughout the last couple of years. By reducing the program in the of \$350 million, \$250 million coming out of FY 2016 and \$100 million coming out of FY 2017, that reduction in the program is shared across Greater Arizona. In the MAG and PAG regions, both reduced their programs by \$87 million and \$35 million, respectively. ADOT staff will be meeting next week with PAG and the Tucson District Engineer to discuss ways to look at creatively to help with the regional concerns in Tucson for the PAG region.

Since there was such a large reduction in the amount of funding available for Greater Arizona, the Transportation Board asked staff to develop three separate scenarios. Staff made a recommendation of which one they felt was appropriate, the Board felt it was important to bring the three scenarios forward to the public hearings.

Scott referred to the FY 2009-2013, the Department had about a \$2.5 billion program. In the FY 2014-2018, that number is about \$1.9 billion. This is a \$600 million reduction in revenue available for transportation projects in Arizona. The preservation investment would be 65-80 percent, which appears high. The actual amount available to invest is quite low. The Department is investing \$140-150 million on preservation. ADOT staff recommends funds for transportation preservation should be at least \$260-270 million per year and does not have the ability to do that. Overall there is a 30 percent reduction in revenue available for programming. The State Highway System Infrastructure is valued currently at \$18.4 billion; however, if the Department needs to replace the transportation infrastructure, the system would cost more than \$100 billion. For every dollar invested today in preservation will be five to seven dollars down the road for replacement of it. The Department's recommendation has always been to focus heavily on preservation.

The three separate scenarios are specifically for Greater Arizona. They are not affected by the amount of funding that we provide to the MAG and PAG regions. MAG and PAG program their own funds. In Greater Arizona, ADOT does that for them specifically, the Transportation Board. While in Greater Arizona, in Scenario A is focusing just on preservation. This scenario removes all the major projects out of the existing five-year program except for a couple of cases, which is the SR 89 Deep Well Ranch Road in the Prescott District. It is an \$18 million dollar project in FY 2014 because we are so far along on this project. The other project is the \$10 million US 60 Oak Flats Miami passing lane project. Those two projects stayed in every one of the scenarios.

Scenario A – Focus on Preservation. This scenario is investing very heavily in preservation of our existing system. There are 81 preservation projects from 2014 to 2016, 39 bridge projects, one major project, and 690 miles of pavement preservation projects. An average of \$184 million per year in preservation from 2014 through 2018 would be allocated. Arizona's interstate system will maintain our existing interstate highways to acceptable levels until 2031 with this scenario.

Scenario B – Focus on Programmed Major Projects. This scenario focuses on major projects; leaving in all of the existing projects that are in the current five-year program FY 2013 to 2017 in addition to the 89 project and the passing lane project on US 60 that was mentioned earlier. ADOT also has 25 bridge projects and only preserves about 458 miles of pavement in the State. This scenario would be investing only \$142 million in preservation. With this scenario, the pavement condition would maintain an acceptable level until 2017. The pavement condition on the interstate would fall below the acceptable levels. The Greater Arizona projects that remain would be US95 Fortuna Wash Bridge (FY 15) \$13.5 M in

Yuma County; the I-10 Ehrenberg Port of Entry (FY 16) \$20 M in La Paz County; the US93 Carrow to Stephens (FY 17) \$22 M in Mohave County; the I-8, Mohawk Rest Area (FY 15) \$20 M; US60, Silver King Project (FY 15) \$45M; SR89, Jct. 89A to Deep Well Ranch Road (FY 16) \$15 M; and lastly, SR260, Lion Springs Project (FY 17) \$40 M.

Scenario C – Combination of Preservation and Major Projects. Scenario C is a hybrid of the two Scenarios A and B and focuses on preservation and maintains some of the major projects in the program. There are four major projects remaining, in addition to two that were mentioned earlier, the 89 project and the US 60. Scenario C would keep 39 bridge projects and 524 miles in pavement preservation and investing about \$150 million in preservation. The interstate system would at acceptable levels until about 2021. Staff would recommend keeping the four projects, the SR89, Deep Well Ranch Road to Chino Valley (FY 14) \$18 M; the US95 Fortuna Wash Bridge, (FY 15) \$13.5 M; the I-10 Ehrenberg POE, (FY 16) \$20 M; and the US93 Carrow to Stephens, (FY 17) \$22 M. However, Staff would defer the other projects that were listed earlier: I-8, Mohawk Rest Area \$20 M, US60; Silver King Project \$45M; SR89, Jct. 89A to Deep Well Ranch Road \$15; and the SR260, Lion Springs Project \$40 M out of the existing five-year program.

ITEM B: FY 2014 - 2018 Statewide Highway Construction Program (Excluding MAG and PAG)—Scott Omer

Scott compared the scenarios A, B, and C. Scenario A is heavily in preservation of the existing transportation system and a small amount in expansion and modernization compared to the other two scenarios. To summarize Greater Arizona's recommended program in FY2014—2018, Staff updated all the project costs, which is done every year. The overall program amount is reduced by \$350 million in FY 2016 and FY 2017, and then programmed all of the subprogram projects out in the FY 2014-2016 timeframe. These are line items in the program.

ITEM C: FY 2014 - 2018 PAG Regional Highway Construction Program—Scott Omer

Scott said there were not a lot of changes in the PAG regional program. Of the \$350 million that had to be reduced out of the program, PAG's share was \$35 million spread over two years, FY 2016 and FY 2017. The amount of revenue that is distributed to the regions across the State is by the Revenue Allocation Advisory Committee (RAAC) formula. That agreement in the Casa Grande Accord is how is determined the amount of funding that is available in MAG and PAG. MAG and PAG appropriates their Referring to the presentation, in the FY 2014-2018, PAG is projects in collaboration with ADOT. programming about 93 percent of their overall funding in the five-year program into expansion. What is not seen is preservation, because it is programmed by ADOT and that would not be seen in PAG's share. The specifics of projects that are changing either on schedule or budget are the I-10, Ina Road TI, defer it to FY 2017 from FY 2016. ADOT is working with PAG to make sure the RTA funds of \$34 million, can be maintained in FY 2016. In FY 2017 there is \$52 million in federal aid. The other project is the I-19, Ajo Way TI, defer it to FY 2018 from FY 2017 and reduce the amount by \$6M. The total cost of the project is about \$80.5 million. There is approximately \$6.5 million in FY 2017 in utility relocations, environmental, and right-of-way costs. Then in FY 2018 there is \$74 million programed. That total project is funded with federal aid. Currently there is no other funding involved in that project. Scott said that the I-10 Ruthrauff Road TI is still in the program in FY 2015 and it is about a \$91 million project. There is almost \$60 million in RTA funds in that project.

ITEM D: FY 2014 - 2018 MAG Regional Highway Construction Program—Scott Omer

MAG's regional share of the adjustment was about \$87 million. They have the same revenue distribution with the same process that Greater Arizona and PAG does. MAG has about 88 percent of their total program invested in expansion. Some of the updated project costs and schedules affected are the I-10, SR101L to I-17, reducing it by \$73.2M to move to another project. The other project US60, Meridian Rd, TI Design, increased by \$120K.

Projects that are being deferred to FY 2015 from FY 2014:

- 1. SR85: Warner St, Bridge, defer to FY 15;
- 2. SR303L/I-10 TI & Thomas to Camelback, Landscape Const., defer to FY 15,
- 3. I-10, SR101L to I-17, Utilities, defer to FY 15,
- 4. SR101L, Pima Rd, Extension, JPA, defer to FY 15.

The South Mountain Corridor is deferring the entire corridor 1 Year. Every project that was originally programed from FY 2014 to FY 2019 is being deferred from FY 2015 to FY 2020.

The new traffic interchange projects that are programed in the MAG region system wide:

- 1. Grand Ave at Bell Rd;
- 2. Grand Ave at Thompson Ranch (Thunderbird);
- 3. SR303Loop to El Mirage Rd.

They are increasing maintenance funds by \$400K preservation funds from FY 14 to FY18 and \$170K in new message signs for posting travel times.

ITEM E: FY 2014 - 2018 Airport Development Program—Scott Omer

The overall revenue we have available is about \$22 million. Most of the revenue collected is from flight property taxes. The proposed five-year program in FY 2014 is Federal Match Grants (FSL) \$ 4.5 million; State-Local Grants (SL) \$15.8 million; the Airport Pavement Preservation (APMS) \$ 6.5 million; Airport Development Loans, \$2 million; and State Planning Services \$2.6 million. The total program is \$31 million for FY 2014.

Scott added that Staff has received 405 comments on the five-year program to date. Of those comments more than 300 were emailed to the Department. Almost 300 comments were related to alternative transportation and 83 comments were in support of the three scenarios.

Chairman Flores asked Scott to provide copies of the three Scenarios A, B, and C slides to the Board members and especially the two new Board members.

Member Joe La Rue acknowledged all the comments heard today from Tucson's many organizations regarding the revenue issues that ADOT is facing. He said that those associations and organizations want to be part of the discussion and his view on it is that those organizations need to be the lead on that discussion. He asked how does the Department link all those great associations in Tucson and also in Maricopa County to bind together to lead the discussion today and carry this revenue model.

Director Halikowski at this time answered Member La Rue's question by referring the Board to a copy of a letter which was placed at each Board member's seats today. The Director had scripted this letter to the Legislature shortly after taking over ADOT in January 2009. In the opening paragraph, the Department were warning the legislators of the proposed legislative fund sweeps and declining transportation revenues. Representative Farley read the letter to the members of the House. The

Department had a lot of concerns what the fund sweeps were going to do to the bond ratings. Fund sweeps are nothing new. He brought this letter to the Board's attention because ADOT cannot make this cliff alone. The Director has been speaking to the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House, and the Transportation Chairman. ADOT has been meeting with many businesses and government stakeholders not just about the fact that there is a funding problem but from the many comments you heard here today, transportation has an economic investment and it is a wise place to put your dollars. ADOT has been out there talking about possibilities of what could be done do if more funding was available. There has been a broad sweep across the State and ADOT has met with more than 288 businesses and government stakeholders. In Tucson Staff met with several groups. The presentation focuses in investing in transportation for economic development, the financial realities ADOT's facing, impacts to the capital budget, infrastructure, and global competiveness. There are organizations working on what is going to happen to transportation and trade. Chairman Flores and the Director sit on the Trade and Transportation Corridor Alliance (TTCA). Chairman Flores is a longtime supporter of trade with Mexico and Arizona and of improving Arizona's port system. The bottom line is ADOT can show the different ways that can fund transportation. There are probably 25 or 30 potentially revenue sources. He stated it will take a lot of partnerships and outreach but essentially a need for a champion to pull this effort together.

A motion to adjourn the Public Hearing meeting was made by Kelly Anderson and seconded by Steve Christy. In a voice vote, the motion carries.

PUBLIC HEARING

ITEM A: FY2014 – 2018 Statewide Subprograms—Greater Arizona and Statewide Subprograms Scenarios—Scott Omer

Scott addressed the Board and thanked the public audience in attendance who came to listen to the discussion about the five-year program. Scott provided an overview of the five-year plan. The tentative program is on the ADOT website www.azdot.gov/FiveYearProgram. Every year the five-year program is developed collaboratively with Intermodal Transportation Division (ITD) our engineering side, Financial Management Services (FMS) our finance side, Multimodal Planning Division (MPD) planning side, and our Regional Partners. It demonstrates how federal and state tax dollars will be spent over the next five years. It has to be approved annually and the fiscal year starts each July 1 and must be fiscally constrained.

This year, ADOT adopted MAP-21, which is the new Federal Transportation Reauthorization. It was enacted on October 1, 2012. MAP-21 sets aside how we should be moving forward into the 21st century. It has some areas that we should be focusing on which includes, safety, infrastructure condition, congestion reduction, system reliability, freight movement and economic vitality, and environmental sustainability. In preparation for how we move forward into the 21st century not only with MAP-21, but with a performance-based program, we utilized ADOT's Long Range Plan.

The new study we are working on which links our Long Range plan to the capital program or P2P. We will be focusing very heavily on asset management as an agency. The Long Range program that the Board adopted in 2011 really set us up very well for moving into the performance-based planning and programming arena that we are today. The Board adopted a recommended investment choice which really focused our program not just investing in expansion but investing heavily in preservation and modernization of the existing transportation system. From 2006 to 2012, the way we used to invest in the program was about 76 percent of all of our funds went into expansions into the system. That included the projects in the MAG and PAG region. Then 2007 happened. In 2007 we saw a drastic reduction in the amount of revenues that we had available to put into the transportation program. Basically now we are back at the 2004 level and staying at that level. We have to adjust the program accordingly. In 2016 and 2017, we are reducing our program by about \$350 million in those two years. That reduction is shared not only in Greater Arizona but with all of our regional partners; MAG and PAG both reduced their programs by \$87 million and \$35 million, respectively.

At the Board's direction, we developed three separate investments and scenarios for Greater Arizona of how we are going to program out our limited funds available for this five-year program. In the past, we would have brought forward one scenario. This year is different in that we have brought forward three scenarios.

Scenario A – Focus on Preservation. This scenario is investing very heavily in preservation of our existing system. However, there are two major projects we are keeping in the program for FY2014 because we are so far along on this project, SR 89 Deep Well Ranch Road in the Prescott District. The other project is in FY 2014 that we will keep on all three scenarios is the US60 Oak Flats passing lane project between Superior and Globe. The rest would be 81 preservation projects from 2014 to 2016, 39 bridge projects, one major project, and 690 miles of pavement preservation projects. An average of \$184 million per year in preservation from 2014 through 2018 would be allocated. Arizona's interstate system will maintain our existing interstate highways to acceptable levels until 2031 with this scenario.

Scenario B – Focus on Programmed Major Projects. This scenario focuses on major projects continuing to keep in the nine major projects from FY 2014 to 2017. From 2014 to 2016, there would be 25 bridge projects and 458 miles of pavement preservation projects. An average of \$142 million per year in pavement preservation. Arizona's interstate highways would fall below an acceptable level to the Department in 2017 with this scenario. Remaining in the Program: SR89, Deep Well Ranch Road to Chino Valley (FY 14) \$18M; US95 Fortuna Wash Bridge (FY 15) \$13.5 M; I-10 Ehrenberg POE (FY 16) \$20 M; US93 Carrow to Stephens (FY 17) \$22 M; I-8, Mohawk Rest Area (FY 15) \$20 M; US60, Silver King Section (FY 15) \$45M; SR89, Jct. 89A to Deep Well Ranch Road (FY 16) \$15 M; and lastly, SR260, Lion Springs Section (FY 17) \$40 M. We would maintain all those existing projects in the Greater Arizona portion of the program.

Scenario C – Combination of Preservation and Major Projects. This scenario focuses on some investment in major projects that are programmed in greater Arizona with less investment in keeping existing highways in good repair. The recommendation would be to maintain four major projects from 2014 to 2017, 39 bridge projects from 2014 to 2018, and 524 miles in pavement preservation projects. An average of \$149 million per year. Arizona's interstate system would at an acceptable level until about 2021. The four projects that staff would recommend to the Board are SR89, Deep Well Ranch Road to Chino Valley (FY 14) \$18 M; the US95 Fortuna Wash Bridge, (FY 15) \$13.5 M; the I-10 Ehrenberg POE, (FY 16) \$20 M; and the US93 Carrow to Stephens, (FY 17) \$22 M. We would defer the other projects that were listed earlier out of the existing five-year program.

ITEM B: FY 2014 - 2018 Statewide Highway Construction Program (Excluding MAG and PAG)—Scott Omer

Scott compared the scenarios A, B, and C. Scenario A is heavily in preservation of our existing transportation system and a small amount in expansion and modernization compared to the other two scenarios. To summarize Greater Arizona recommended program FY2014—2018, we updated all the project costs. This is done very year, and we had to reduce the overall program amount by \$350 million in FY 2016 and FY 2017, and we program our subprogram projects out in the FY 2014-2016 timeframe. There are line items in the program.

ITEM C: FY 2014 - 2018 PAG Regional Highway Construction Program—Scott Omer

Scott said they separated the PAG regional program out from the regular Greater Arizona program. This was more efficient and appropriate and should be treated in the same way as the other regional partners by showing their program separately. PAG has a significant Investment in their own funding. PAG reduced the overall share of the program by \$35 million. Of the \$350 million that we had to reduce out of the program, PAG's share was \$35 million. The revenue distributed to PAG is in the requirements that have been set aside by the Resource Allocation Advisory Committee in the Casa Grande accord. PAG and MAG both program their projects out after we provide them their funding. We accomplish that all in collaboration. The PAG regional in FY 2014-2018 program does invest heavily in the expansion of the system. There are two projects affected by the tentative program. It is the I-10, Ina Road TI, defer to FY 2017 from FY 2016. We are working with them to make sure the RTA funds can maintain in FY 2016. And then the I-19, Ajo Way TI, defer to FY 2018 from FY 2017 and reduce the amount by \$6M. The difference on this project. All together it is an \$80 million project and it is completely funded with federal aid.

ITEM D: FY 2014 - 2018 MAG Regional Highway Construction Program—Scott Omer

MAG's regional share of our adjustment was about \$87 million. They follow the same process where ADOT provides the funding and they program in collaboration with ADOT. The MAG regional program invests about 88 percent in expansion of the system. MAG has quite a few updates to their program some were due to costs, schedules, and others are being deferred. There are two updated projects that are affected, I-10, SR101L to I-17, reducing \$73.2M, and US60, Meridian Rd, TI Design, Increased \$120K. Other projects that we updated project costs and schedules are: being deferred to FY 2015 from FY 2014: 1. SR85: Warner St, Bridge, defer to FY 15; 2. SR303L/I-10 TI & Thomas to Camelback, Landscape Const., defer to FY 15, 3. I-10, SR101L to I-17, Utilities, defer to FY 15, 4. SR101L, Pima Rd, Extension, JPA, defer to FY 15. The South Mountain Corridor is deferring the entire corridor 1 Year. So every project that was originally programed from FY 2014 to FY 2019 is being deferred from FY 2015 to FY 2020. The new traffic interchange projects that are programed in the MAG region are Grand Ave at Bell Rd; Grand Ave at Thompson Ranch (Thunderbird); and SR303Loop to El Mirage Rd. They are increasing maintenance funds overall in the region by \$400K preservation funds from FY 14 to FY18. They are looking to post new dynamic message signs, displaying travel times on those at a cost of \$170K.

ITEM E: FY 2014 - 2018 Airport Development Program—Scott Omer

The revenue we have available is about \$22 million. Most of the revenue collected is from flight property taxes. The proposed five-year program in FY 2014 is Federal Match Grants (FSL) \$ 4.5 million; State-Local Grants (SL)\$15.8 million; the Airport Pavement Preservation (APMS) \$ 6.5 million; Airport Development Loans, \$ 2 million; and State Planning Services \$2.6 million. The total program is \$31.4 million for FY 2014.

A motion to adjourn was made by Kelly Anderson and seconded by Hank Rogers. In a voice vote, the motion carries.

ITEM 1: Financing – ADOT Bonding 101; Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) Financial Overview

Kristine Ward introduced Kevin Freund. He gave the presentation to the Board on the Bonding Process.

Board Member Joe La Rue noted that once the Board approves the Direction to Proceed, but before that, there is another process that talks about analyzing what we have out in the market, what the market is doing, and what capacity ADOT has. He assumes there is a Board policy that helps direct that analysis.

Kevin Freund stated that Mr. La Rue is correct and that Staff takes all the financial and fiscal data and looks at that and projects out for the 5-year plan. Kristine Ward gives a monthly revenue report on HURF and RARF at the Board meetings. It is a fundamental issue of what ADOT is about and there is an ongoing process of how much can be borrowed and how much can be appropriated.

Types of Bonds

Direct Debt: Source of payment is general taxes and revenues, i.e., General Obligation (G.O.) Bonds, Leases, and Certificates of Participation.

Revenue Debt: Source of payment is specific revenues or taxes pledged for payment, i.e., sales taxes, highway user revenues, and federal grants

Pledge of specific revenue or tax, must meet covenants set forth in Arizona Statutes and in Bond Resolution. Covenant to maintain the revenue or tax at a level sufficient to pay bonds.

There is a limit on additional bonds. There are provisions that allows Senior vs. Subordinate Bonds.

Tax-Exempt Bonds: Interest is exempt from federal and state income tax for individuals and some corporations, broad market acceptance. The limits and restrictions are private use, investment earnings are subject to rebate to US Treasury. There are limits on advance refunding. Occasionally, taxable bonds are issued when tax-exemption is not available. ADOT's bonds are highly rated. There are no problems selling them.

History of Disclosure: Securities Act of 1933 & SEC Act of 1934—Both were enacted with broad exemptions for municipal securities from registration with SEC. However, SEC requirements do prohibit fraud; cannot employ any device, scheme or artifice to defraud; cannot make any material statement of untrue fact or omit a statement that is a necessary material fact; cannot engage in any act, practice or course of business which operates as a fraud or deceit in connection with the purchase or sale of a security.

Disclosure Responsibility: Issuers are primarily responsible for the content of their disclosure documents and may be held primarily liable under the federal securities laws for misleading disclosure. The SEC and other regulatory authorities have increased their focus on the content and quality of disclosure in primary offering documents and have brought enforcement actions against municipal issuers. ADOT staff, financial advisor, bond counsel, underwriters and underwriters' counsel all review the offering documents. It is important for Board members to receive and review a copy of the offering prospectus before it goes out to market.

SEC RULE 15C2 - 12: Adopted in 1989 and broadened in 1995—In response to consistently slow dissemination of information related to municipal security offerings. The rule applies to underwriters and broker-dealers, not to issuers; however, an underwriter cannot purchase or sell municipal securities in a primary offering unless the issuer has committed in writing to provide to the Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board (MSRB) on their Electronic Municipal Market Access (EMMA) system, audited financial statements and specified offering document updates by a set date annually. Timely notice of listed events specified in the Rule (e.g. payment and other defaults, rating changes, bond calls, failure to file the required annual report, etc.).

Internal Team Duties

Identify need, select and assign duties to outside finance team, select the method of sale, negotiate business points of the transaction, ensure proper disclosure, oversight of the process, and interface with State Transportation Board.

Duties Of The Financial Advisor

Assists with capital planning, develops structuring alternatives in consultation with internal staff and identifies potential refunding opportunities, assists with selection of other team members, assists with preparation and review of documents, coordinates with the rating agencies, advises internal team during process and negotiations, prepares post-sale market memorandum, prepares timetable and distribution lists.

Duties of the Bond Counsel

Provides opinion that issuer has the legal authority to issue bonds under State and other laws and under Bond Resolution. Provides opinion that bonds are exempt from federal and state taxes. Monitors compliance with federal, state and local laws. Drafts certain bond documents including Resolution and closing documents.

Other Participants

Registrar and paying agent, keeps record of registered holders of bonds, makes timely payments to bondholders from issuer's funds, underwriters' counsel, works on behalf of the underwriters, prepares Bond Purchase Agreement and other documents, escrow agent, and administers refunding proceeds for refunding transactions.

Competitive Sale

Advantages: Achieves lowest borrowing cost among bids received, possible to realize a below market borrowing cost in certain circumstances, appearance of an open and fair process.

Disadvantages: Less flexibility in structuring and timing, possible "risk premium" and increased financing cost in unstable markets or with new or unusual credits, less control over demand and interest rates, and no control over the distribution of bonds.

Negotiated Sale

Advantages: Pre-marketing efforts prepare the market for unusual structure, size, or special disclosure, flexibility in timing and structuring, control of underwriting syndicate and bond allocations, consistently results in an "at market" borrowing cost.

Disadvantages: Issuer must spend more resources (time) to manage the process and exercise care in preparing for negotiations.

<u>Underwriter</u>

An underwriter is a broker-dealer that purchases a new issue of municipal securities for resale to investors. The underwriter acts in an arm's length transaction with ADOT. The underwriters' interests are not the same as ADOT's interests. Underwriters may acquire the bonds either by negotiation with the issuer or by award on the basis of a competitive bid.

How Underwriters Set Yields

Bond yields are predominantly market driven based on the supply of municipal bonds in the market and the demand to purchase bonds by investors. When pricing a bond issue, underwriters initially set yields to offer bonds to investors in the market based on comparable debt offerings in the primary and secondary markets. The final yields are then established by the specific level of investor orders to purchase or invest in the bonds.

Selection of Underwriters

Important factors in selecting underwriters to achieve the best results for ADOT; distribution capabilities of firm (e.g., number and location of salespeople; investors covered, etc. Capital base to underwrite unsold balances on large financings, particularly in difficult market periods. Their experience and capability to underwrite large financings. Knowledge and expertise concerning State transportation agencies and their issues.

Bond Pricing (prior to sale)

Develop marketing plan to institutional and retail investors, determine the priority for filling orders received, determine how orders will be filled and credited among the underwriting team. Make preliminary structure, decisions, couponing strategy, serial vs. term bonds, call options, etc., determine preliminary interest rates and reoffering levels to offer to potential investors.

Bond Pricing (day of sale)

Approve interest rate and reoffering yield levels, terms of order period, and takedown.

Order period begins

Underwriter informs issuer about order status progress. Order period ends: underwriter reports orders by maturity and confidence about the orders; decisions: re-pricing (can improve or get worse), extend order period, agree to terms, underwriter makes offer to purchase the bonds; issuer and underwriters execute Bond Purchase Agreement.

ITEM 1: Financing – ADOT Bonding 101; Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) Financial Overview

Lisa Danka gave a presentation to the Board on the Federal Aid Overview, Federal Highway Trust Fund Status, and MAP 21 and Arizona Federal Aid.

Federal Aid Overview

The Federal Aid Highway Program is funded from the Federal Highway Trust Fund (along with the Mass Transit Program and the Leaking Underground Storage Tank Trust Fund), revenues from the Federal highway user taxes/fees, fuel (gasoline, diesel, special fuels), tires, truck and trailer sales, heavy vehicle usage, and Federal General Fund deposits. Reimbursement Program—requires a State or local match, which is 5.7% for Arizona (only Nevada has a lower match at 5%). Funding is distributed to States pursuant to a federal transportation program authorization (apportionments) and annual budget bills (obligation authority).

Apportionments vs. Obligation Authority

Apportionments (checks), \$709 million, amount set in program authorization bill, represents upper annual limit, and broken into various categories via formula, earmarks and allocations. Obligation Authority (cash), \$699 million, and ratio results in "excess" apportionments, \$10 million. Amount is set annually in budget bills, generally 90-95% of apportionments. An equal amount of both are required to fund projects.

Federal Highway Trust Fund

February 2013 — Projection for Highway Account of the Federal Highway Trust Fund: General Fund Transfers of \$17 Billion for Federal Fiscal Years 2013 through 2015. A Cumulative Shortfall of \$92 Billion for Federal Fiscal Years 2015 through 2023.

MAP-21 Overview

Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21) was passed in July 2012 after ten extensions of SAFETEA LU (expired on September 30, 2009); it authorizes the Federal Aid Highway Program through FFY 2014; extends Trust Fund taxes and ensures two years of solvency (via General Fund transfers); it simplifies and focuses the Federal program; and it accelerates project delivery and promotes innovation and establishes a performance-based Federal program.

Once reconvened, the Study Session proceeded as follows:

ITEM 2: 2014 – 2018 Tentative Five-Year Program Review

Scott presented a background overview of the five-year plan. It is developed as a team with Intermodal Transportation Division (ITD), Financial Management Services (FMS), Multimodal Planning Division (MPD), and local agencies. The five-year program demonstrates how federal and state dollars will be spent over the next five years and is approved annually and begins each July 1 of the fiscal year.

MAP 21: Federal Transportation Reauthorization; enacted October 1, 2012, Requires a National Highway Performance Program. "It is in the interest of the United States to focus the Federal-Aid highway program on the following National Goals" Safety Infrastructure Condition Congestion Reduction System Reliability Freight Movement and Economic Vitality Environmental Sustainability Preparation for Map-21 Performance Program ADOT's Long Range Plan Linking Planning to programming (P2P) Asset Management.

Scenario A: Focus on Preservation

Major projects programmed in Greater Arizona (excludes MAG and PAG) after 2014 will be removed, greatly increase funding for pavement preservation and bridges, reduction in several statewide subprograms, and maintains interstate highway assets at acceptable level to 2031.

Scenario B: Maintain Greater Arizona Projects

Maintaining major projects contained in the FY13-17 Program, reduction in most subprograms including preservation and bridges, and maintains the interstate highway assets at an acceptable level to 2017.

Scenario C: Preservation and Major Projects

Maintains several major projects in Greater Arizona contained in FY13-17 Program, major projects are selected based on priority and development status, a reduction in several statewide subprograms, and maintains interstate highway assets at acceptable level to 2022. Staff's recommends Scenario C in the FY 14 to FY 18 program (without MAG and PAG projects). Scenario C invests 84 percent into preservation, expansion at 15 percent and modernization at one percent. The recommended program summary is updated project costs, moving \$123 million in major projects out of the program with Greater Arizona and programming subprogram projects, and those FY 14-16 projects are line itemed in the Program.

Remaining in the Program:

SR-89, Deep Well Ranch Road to Chino Valley (FY 14) US-95 Fortuna Wash Bridge (FY 15) I-10 Ehrenberg POE (FY 16) US-93 Carrow to Stephens (FY 17)

Deferring to Out Year:

I-8, Mohawk Rest Area US-60, Silver King Section SR-89, Jct. 89A to Deep Well Ranch Road SR-260, Lion Springs Section

FY 14 to FY 18 Program PAG Regional Program is 2 percent into preservation, 93 percent expansion, and modernization at five percent. PAG appropriates their projects in collaboration with ADOT. PAG program their projects themselves and ADOT provides the revenue necessary to do so. Their overall program was reduced by \$35 million over two years.

Defer I-10, Ina Road TI (Construction) to FY 2017 from FY 2016; ADOT is working with PAG to make sure the RTA funds can be maintained in FY 2016.

Budget change defer I-19, Ajo Way TI (Construction) to FY 2018 from FY 2017 and reducing it by \$6 million; ADOT makes this recommendation in collaboration with PAG.

FY 14 to FY 18 Program MAG Regional Transportation Plan Freeway Program is 5 percent into preservation, 88 percent expansion, and modernization at seven percent. MAG's reduction was about \$87 million in the two years, FY 16 and FY 17. MAG invests heavily into the expansion of the system and uses RTA funds. Early in October and November 2012, ADOT and MAG worked cooperatively to develop the program. Some of the updated project costs and schedules affected are as follows:

Arizona State Aviation Fund, Five-Year Development Program Assumptions

- Arizona airports receipt of federal funding will remain at approximately \$70 to \$80 million per year.
- The Arizona State budget will remain steady and will not require legislative sweeps of the Aviation Fund.

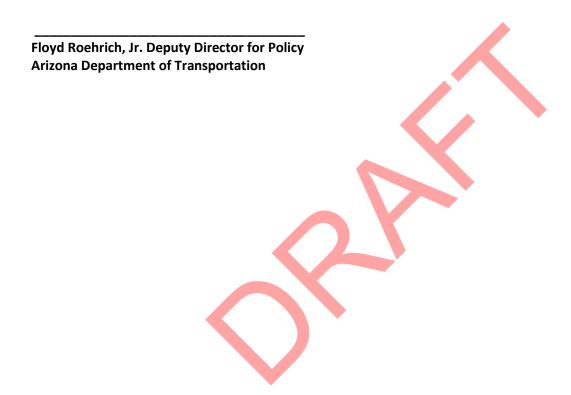
Ehrenburg Port of Entry (POE) Revenue Projections

Scott gave an overview of the Ehrenburg Port of Entry. The benefit of project cannot be measured in just revenue and increases in truck volume. Safety, efficiency, and operations have to be considered. There is not sufficient room to store all the trucks that enter the POE. There is not a safe commercial area for the trucks. Basically the gates are opened to allow the trucks through. By 2032, the situation worsens. The truck count in 2012 was 5,308 and projected for 2032, the count will triple to 15,488. At this time, without a port of entry that is operationally sufficient, the problem of overweight vehicles will continue to damage the roadways, the interstates, and the minor routes. This issue is not only at Ehrenburg but at the other ports of entry. There is not a method to capture the loss revenue without investing more in technology and the overall infrastructure in the ports of entry.

A motion to adjourn was made by Joe La Rue and seconded by Kelly Anderson. In a voice vote, the motion passed unanimously.

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Intermodal Transportation Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the establishment of new right of way as a state route and state highway for the improvement of State Route State Route 92 within the above referenced project.

The existing alignment was previously established by Resolution of the Arizona State Highway Commission, dated February 18, 1936, and entered on Page 495 of its Official Minutes, designating the Bisbee - Fort Huachuca Road as a state route; the Resolution dated May 08, 1936, and set forth on Page 575 of the Official Minutes, designated and adopted the Bisbee - Fort Huachuca Highway as a state highway; and the Resolution dated May 19, 1936, set forth on Page 624 of the Official Minutes, designated the Bisbee - Fort Huachuca Highway, as State Route 92. Thereafter, various resolutions established additional right of way for improvements.

New right of way is now needed to incorporate design changes and facilitate the construction phase. Accordingly, it is necessary to establish and acquire the new right of way as a state route and state highway for this improvement project.

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Intermodal Transportation Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the disposal of a portion of a highway easement for right of way originally acquired for use within the above referenced project.

The existing alignment was previously established as the Coronado Trail, a county highway, and became a state highway by Resolution of the Arizona State Highway Commission, dated May 10, 1928, and entered on Page 186 of its Official Minutes. A relocated right of way was established as a state highway by the Resolution dated September 09, 1949, and set forth on Page 253 of its Official Minutes, designated State Route 666, under Non Federal Aid Secondary Project 101(1950); and was subsequently placed on the Federal Aid Primary System, designated U. S. Route 666, by Resolution 65-33, dated April 02, 1965. Resolution 72-93, dated October 20, 1972, established the relocated Morenci Bypass as a state route; which was later established as a state highway by Resolution 73-72, dated September 07, 1973, thereafter amended by Arizona State Transportation Board Resolution 81-07-A-23, dated July 17, 1981. This segment was designated as U. S. 666 Temporary by Resolution 74-10-A-29, dated November 07, 1974; and was subsequently established as an Arizona Scenic Roadway, officially designated as the Coronado Trail Scenic Road by Resolution 89-01-C-05, dated January 16, 1989. 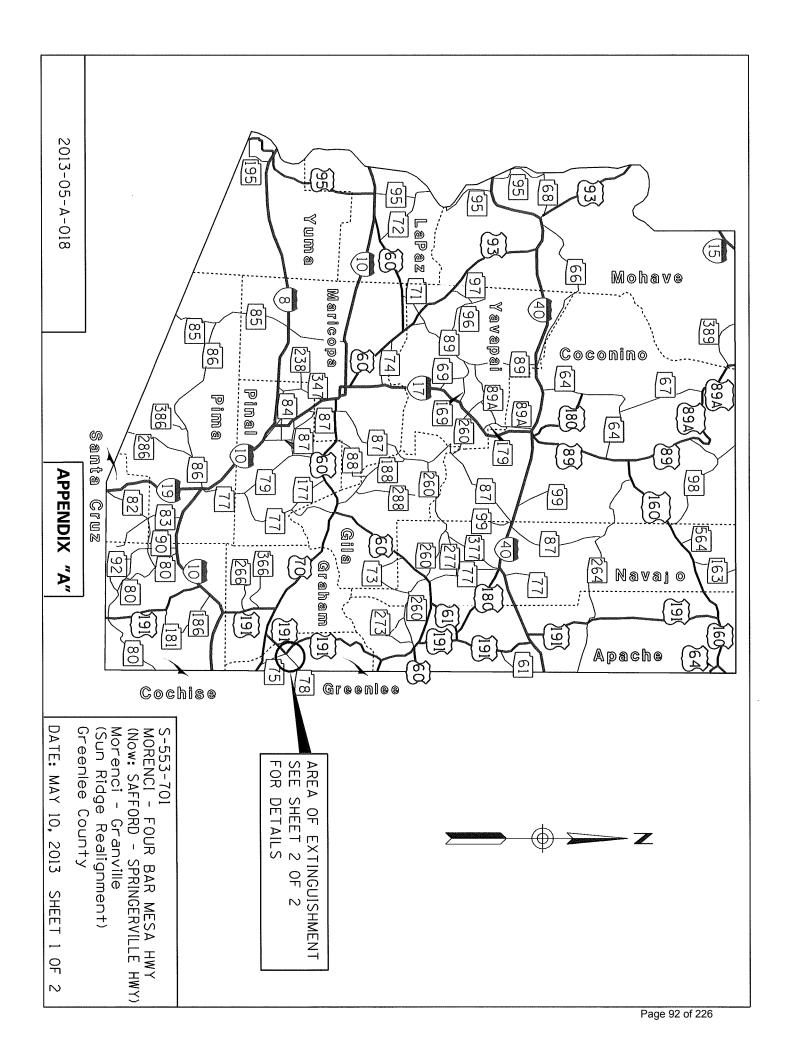

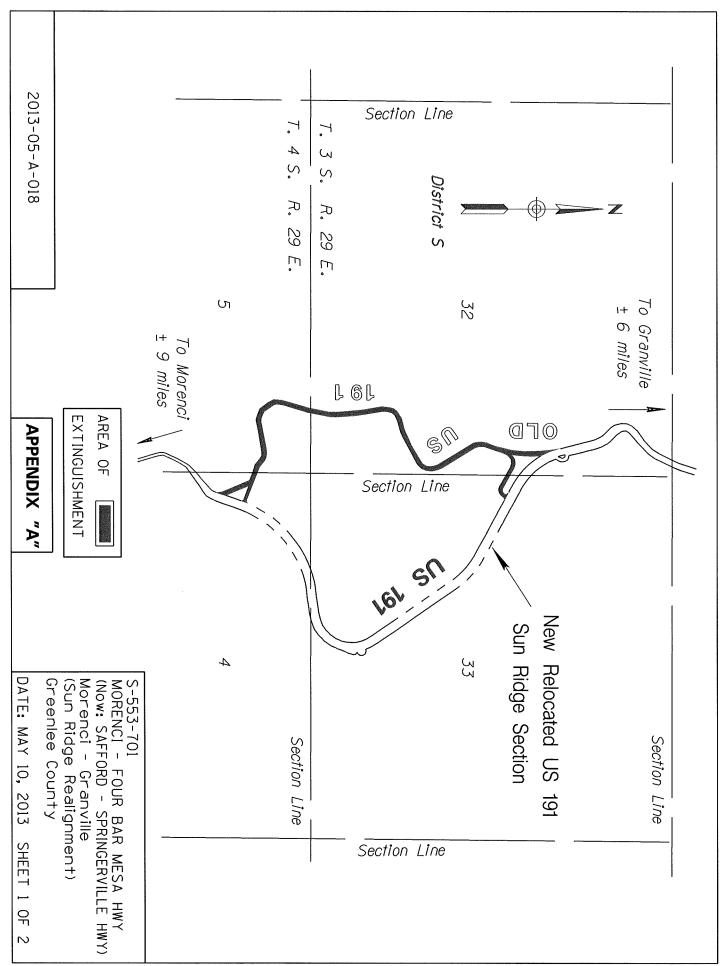

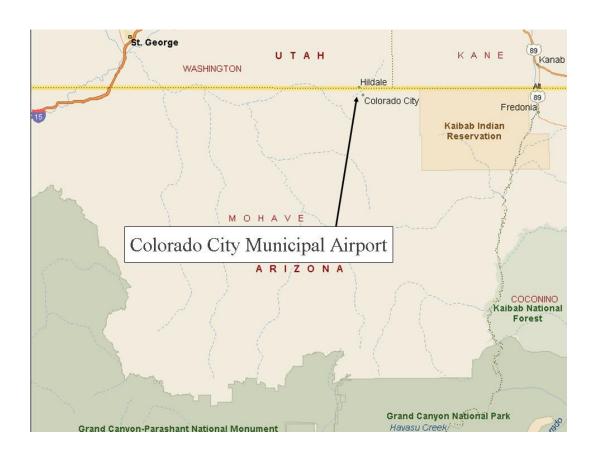

The Noise Study Technical Reports referenced above are part of the official record used for the environmental clearance on the I-10 Auxiliary Lane Project, 91st Avenue to 59th Avenue (project H5910 01C). The construction of that sound barrier was not completed as recommended by the reports, apparently due to a typographical error. In order to assure NEPA compliance, the sound barrier to Sta. 7255+00 should be constructed.

STATE ENGINEER'S REPORT April 2013

The Status of Projects Under Construction report for April 2013 shows 96 projects under construction valued at \$955,557,625.98. The transportation board awarded 14 projects during April valued at approximately \$49.4 million.

During April the Department finalized 38 projects valued at \$175,345,640.47. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package.

Year to date we have finalized 223 projects. The total cost of these 223 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 6.8%. Deducting incentive/bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to 4.5%.

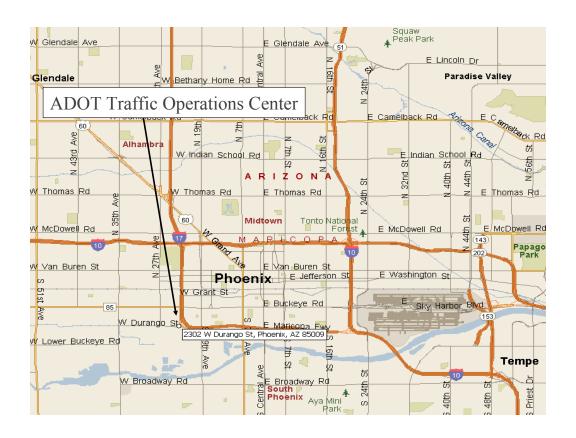
