Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director. In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route of a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects. With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, decign, development, land accurition, construction and improvement of

from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction.

The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the second Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion.

In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.





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

ITEM 4: Financial Report—Kristine Ward, CFO

Kristine Ward updated the Board on HURF, RARF, and Aviation revenue results, investment earnings, and HELP fund balances.

- HURF status: remains below forecast, but now within forecast goal range of +2%/-1%, revenues now ahead of FY 2012, and fuel tax revenue growth remains negative, but April and May were positive.
- **RARF** status: tracking within forecast goal range of +2%/-1%, contracting strongest performing revenue category: 6.5% ahead of FY2012, and Retail Sales: 6.3% ahead of FY2012.

HURF Revenues continue to be weak. HURF is 1.4% behind forecast. The problem is Gas and Use (diesel) Fuel Tax revenues are running behind. Gas tax revenues are running .7% behind last year and Use Fuel revenues are 5.5% behind last year. We are not meeting forecast. At this point, we are just watching, it is about a \$10 million hit to revenues but we are hoping to make it up in the latter half of the year.

RARF Revenues are in the green and at forecast just a little behind at -.6%. Retail Sales are +5.8% above last year as well as Restaurant & Bar +7.1% above last year's. There is healthy growth at this time. Contracting is still lagging a bit behind.

ITEM 8: State Engineer's Report—Jennifer Toth, Deputy Director of Transportation/State Engineer

Jennifer gave an update on with the Status of Projects under Construction Report for May 2013 shows 102 projects under construction valued at \$984.4 million. The Transportation Board awarded 4 projects during May valued at approximately \$7.2 million. During May the Department finalized 18 projects valued at \$32.2 million. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package. Year to date we have finalized 241 projects. The total cost of these 241 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 6.7%. Deducting incentive, bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to 4.3%.

Jennifer gave an update of US 89T reconstruction activities. ADOT participated in the groundbreaking ceremonies last Sunday to start the paving project on Navajo Route 20, the detour route. It has taken three months, which is incredible speedy process and in conjunction with Federal Highway Administration, BIA, Navajo Nation, Navajo Division of Transportation, and Coconino County. We could not have done that had not everyone been on the same page in moving that project forward as quickly as possible. Now, we are starting to look at what is the long term solution for 89 and we are beginning a GEO Technical report hopefully by next month's Board meeting. Jennifer will brief the Board on what the long term strategy will be for 89.

<u>*ITEM 5: Final approval of the FY 2014 - 2018 Statewide Transportation Facilities Construction Program</u> <u>Kristine Ward, Chief Financial Officer and Scott Omer, Assistant Director, Multimodal Planning Division</u>

A. FY 2014 - 2018 Statewide Transportation Facilities Construction Program Financial Plan

Kristine gave a presentation regarding the financial policy. It is the policy of the Board to maintain a fiscally conservative financial policy with respect to the planning and execution of the Board's Five-Year Transportation Facilities Construction Program. The Board's Program will be developed on a cash flow basis, ensuring reasonable cash balances, be based on conservative estimates of reasonably expected revenues, be inflation adjusted, be judicious in its use of bonding authority to accelerate critically needed projects, and fiscally constrained at all times. Board policy requires a fiscally conservative approach toward the development of the 5 Year Program funding.

The primary revenue sources used in the FY2014-FY2018 Program are as follows:

Revenue Sources: Highway User Revenue Fund (HURF), Regional Area Road Fund (RARF), and Federal Aid.

Financing Mechanisms: Bonding, HURF Bonds, RARF Bonds, and Grant Anticipation Notes.

The forecasting process: RAP session for HURF and RARF, risk analysis process, gathering of economists and experts,

Review and estimation of several variables, population and personal income growth, and non-farm employment.

Estimates provided to consultant, HDR Decision Economics,

Results: Growth rates for various revenue sources with associated probability

Since the 2006 forecast, we have experienced significant declines in the anticipated revenues available for the program. Revenue estimates for HURF have declined almost \$3 Billion since the September 2006 forecast and unfortunately those estimates were correct in some cases and a little too optimistic in others. The 5 Year program is based on HURF average growth of 3.1%, RARF average growth of 5.6%, and federal aid growth of 0% (flat). Reasoning is a very short authorization period and insolvency of the Federal Highway Trust fund.

The result of the diminishing revenues has led to the program needing to be reduced by \$350 Million. More specifically the reduction is made up of the following changes.

The program you are considering today will be funded from the following fund sources dedicated for ADOT ROW. The program anticipates bonding of: HURF= \$275M; RARF= \$600M; GANs = \$100M in addition to proceeds available from the recent issues. (2011A & 2013A) The scenarios presented to you today all meet

the policy of fiscal constraint. Any significant changes to those scenarios will require review by staff and possibly a re-gathering of the Board for approval prior to July 1st.

Scott reported on the common themes of Five-Year Comments:

- modernization and expansion of highway corridors
- highway pavement and bridge preservation
- alternate transportation and bike options
- traffic management systems
- Loop 202 South Mountain
- rail between Phoenix and Tucson
- Tucson roadway improvements

Scenario A – Focus on Preservation. This scenario focuses the most investment on keeping the existing highway system in good repair with the least investment in programmed major projects in greater Arizona. There would be 81 preservation projects from 2014 to 2016, 39 bridge projects, one major project, and 690 miles of pavement projects. An average of \$194 million per year in preservation from 2014 through 2018 would be allocated. Arizona's interstate system is projected to fall below federal performance measures for pavement quality in 2031 with this scenario. Note change: SR-89, Deep Well Ranch Road to South Chino Valley Limits (\$18 M) is moved to FY-13.

Scenario B – Focus on Programmed Major Projects. This scenario focuses the most investment on major projects that are programmed in greater Arizona with the lowest investment in keeping existing highways in good repair. There would be seven major projects from 2014 to 2017. From 2014 to 2016, there would be 25 bridge projects and 458 miles of pavement projects. An average of \$152 million per year in preservation from 2014 to 2018 would be allocated. Arizona's interstate system is projected to fall below federal performance measures for pavement quality in 2017 with this scenario. Note change: SR-89, Deep Well Ranch Road to South Chino Valley Limits (\$18 M) is moved to FY-13.

Department Recommendation

Scenario C – Combination of Preservation and Major Projects. This scenario focuses on some investment in major projects that are programmed in greater Arizona with less investment in keeping existing highways in good repair. There would be four major projects from 2014 to 2017, 39 bridge projects from 2014 to 2018, and 524 miles in pavement projects. An average of \$149 million per year in preservation from 2014 to 2018 would be allocated. Arizona's interstate system is projected to fall below federal performance measures for pavement quality in 2021 with this scenario.

Board Member Anderson's changes to the Department's Recommendation Scenario C – Modified

Board Member Kelly Anderson moved to go into Executive Session to receive legal advice for approval of the Five-Year Program. Deanna Beavers seconded the motion. In a voice vote, the motion to go into Executive Session passed unanimously.

The public meeting was recessed at this time.

Once reconvened, the Board's public meeting proceeded as follows:

Chairman Flores asked Board Member Kelly Anderson to restate his motion and explain his reasons for it.

Board Member Kelly Anderson stated that the motion was to approve Staff's Recommendation C with the following changes.

- 1. Move Carrow Stephens out and use the \$22 Million for Preservation in FY14
- 2. Move Silver King from FY16 to FY15
- 3. Allocate \$35 Million to State Route 260 to the Thousand Trails in FY16
- 4. Move the Lion Springs \$3.5 Million allocated in FY16 to FY18; and increase to \$5 Million
- 5. Move the \$40 Million allocated to Lion Springs in FY18 out and allocate to Preservation
- 6. State Route 347 \$10 Million in FY15; \$30 Million in FY16

Mr. Anderson further stated to direct the Department to study this deviation and make a recommendation to the Board and to bring a final plan to the Board for approval by June 26, 2013. Mr. Anderson submitted the following letter as an explanation. (See letter next page, dated June 14, 2013)

June 14, 2013

Dear Chairman Flores,

Per state statute, any changes to a proposed 5 year state wide construction plan shall be in writing for the director's review. Below are the explanations for my motion and changes to the plan which passed by a 7-0 vote at our June 14, 2013 board meeting.

It is an honor to serve on the ADOT transportation board and I was humbled when Governor Brewer called a few years ago to say that she was putting my name forth to the State Senate for confirmation.

One thing which I have learned is that the plan is organic, in that it changes almost every board meeting. For example the PPAC recommendation for board approval today we are advancing project, identifying new projects, increasing project costs and deleting projects from the FY2013 – 2017 construction program. My changes to the draft plan has been a combination of:

the hearing process

- communication with local elected officials and stakeholders
- my perspective on economic development

US 93 CARROW TO STEPHENS: DEFER OUT AND MONEY GO TO PRESERVATION

I saw minimal support or opposition for the project.

SILVER KING: MOVE TO FY 15 FROM FY 16

This has been in the plan for many years and I believe that it needs to move ahead due to the prospects of the mining sector advancing in the region.

ALLOCATE \$35,000,000.00 TO SR 260 TO THOUSAND TRAILS

I had the opportunity to drive this section last weekend and see the need. In fact, in the local Maricopa paper there was an advertisement for the Out of Africa Park. There is one thing which does concern me with the project is that the reason is was not completed along with the rest of 260 was access issues. I still see the fragmented voice which was evident at the public hearing in Flagstaff when Chairman Flores asked if there were many to speak on the same topic if there could be one spokesman. All of you chose to speak. If there is not a clean and documented access management plan a year from now, then I would not hesitate to move the project out. You have some great leadership in the area, so I would use it.

MOVE THE \$3,500,000.00 ALLOCATED TO LION SPRINGS IN FY 16 TO FY 18 AND INCREASE TO \$5,000,000.00.

I would like to see the project continue, and think the money will help Gila County in its grant applications. LION SPRINGS \$40,000,000.00 IN FY18 DEFER OUT AND ALLOCATE TO PRESERVATION

With the \$5,000,000.00 in FY 16 to help with grant I think this money should go to preservation.

SR 347 GRADE SEPARATION AT THE UNION PACIFIC RAIL ROAD

Many in this room are very familiar with this project. In fact the city of Maricopa hosted the board in February of 2007 and again in November of 2012. Last November Ak Chin Vice Chairman William Antone talked about their aggressive economic development projects one of which is their entertainment complex which had its grand opening this same evening as the board reception. The city of Maricopa has \$10,000,000.00 in its CIP program allocated for the separation project and have spent countless hours lobbying the state's congressional delegation for federal aid. I also had a meeting last week with Maricopa Mayor Price and Ak Chin Chairman Manual about the project and their commitment to working together on the project. The Ak Chin community recently donated \$10,000,000.00 to the city and the Maricopa Unified School district to advance a city park project and help with school budget issues. The chairman wanted the board to know that they are financially committed to at least the \$10,000,000.00 and probably greater to the grade separation project.

Chairman Flores thank you for the time to speak to my changes to the plan.

Board Member Joe La Rue stated that he appreciates all of the work staff has done these last four months. Going back to the February meeting when we kicked this off, we realized that this was going to be a labor intensive planning year. Those three scenarios were going to invite a lot of public comment and a lot of discussion. Today, Mr. La Rue will support this motion, which says pushing staff back to take a look at these projects. He is not here to say he supports these projects because he thinks there is a lot of information that needs to be looked at how make these changes in a very short amount of time.

Floyd Roehrich, Deputy Director for Policy suggested that there be a Study Session and then follow with the Board Meeting when staff comes back to the Board. MAG is a component in this modification.

Chairman Flores stated that Scott had approached him to have a study session. Mr. Flores said he could not see to have that discussion and it not be what is occurring here. It would basically be a fourth public process or a preliminary to the meeting that we are having today. Perhaps we need to move the meetings up so there are more opportunities than the thirty days that we have now to come up with a final resolution.

Scott Omer stated that when they go into to develop the final draft program to present to the Board for consideration. His department takes the same issues into consideration that Board Member Anderson did. They take the public hearing process that he spoke of that earlier today. They not only consider the 100 or so comments that they received in the open meetings here in the three public meetings; they also take into consideration the 900 comments that they received. They talk to the stakeholders, specifically use PAG as an example. They spent a lot of time and effort reaching out to the regions to make sure we are gathering their input and we work with them specifically on coming up with a final approved program. His department also takes economic development into consideration and that department's main function is not economic development. However, they have been given the charge by the Director to make that is something we do take into consideration. It is also one of the areas that is in the priority programming process. We consider economic development in freight as a key component and actually prioritized in the projects that we did. He represents the department and that they take those same things into consideration. He supports the Board's position that they want the department to go back and look at other projects. He mentioned earlier today that he recommended a project for a certain year that is not for any other reason than just to make sure that first, they have the funding for it; and second, that they can deliver the project in those years. That is how they are slated where they are. Talking about moving projects forward, the concern is that to make sure they reach back to staff that project development level all the way up through the State Engineer's office and his office to make a recommendation for the Director that they can actually deliver the project in the year they are recommending.

Scott further stated that they do take the same things into consideration as staff moves forward in developing the final program.

Chairman Flores stated there is motion. The motion states to approve Staff's Recommendation C with the following changes.

1. Move Carrow Stephens out and use the \$22 Million for Preservation in FY14

- 2. Move Silver King from FY16 to FY15
- 3. Allocate \$35 Million to State Route 260 to the Thousand Trails in FY16
- 4. Move the Lion Springs \$3.5 Million allocated in FY16 to FY18; and increase to \$5 Million
- 5. Move the \$40 Million allocated to Lion Springs in FY18 out and allocate to Preservation
- 6. State Route 347 \$10 Million in FY15; \$30 Million in FY16

The motion also directs the Department to study this deviation and make a recommendation to the Board, and in addition it directs the Department to bring a final plan to the Board for approval by June 26, 2013. In a voice vote, the motion carries.

PUBLIC HEARING

Presentation of FY 2014 – 2018 ADOT Tentative Five-Year Transportation Facilities Construction Program Recommendations. <u>http://azdot.gov/FiveYearProgram</u>

Scott thanked the City of Flagstaff for hosting the public meeting in their facilities. He stated that to date, in the last three months between Phoenix, Tucson, and the meeting today, the Department has had more than 100 people come in to comment on the five-year program. In the first two-months of the five-year program public comment period, the Department has received more than 700 comments from the public on the website. Comments will still be received up until May 17, 2013. At that time the public comment period will be over. Everyone can submit comments online, in writing, or in person. He said that the Department anticipates more than 1,000 comments will be received for this five-year comment period.

ITEM A: FY2014 – 2018 Statewide Subprograms—Greater Arizona and Statewide Subprograms Scenarios–Scott Omer

Scott provided an overview of the five-year program. The background on the five-year program is developed collaboratively every year with Intermodal Transportation Division (ITD) our engineering side, Financial Management Services (FMS) our finance side, Multimodal Planning Division (MPD) planning side, and our Regional Partners. It demonstrates how federal and state tax dollars will be spent over the next five years. The five-year program must be approved annually. The program is adopted in June and it starts the next fiscal year on July 1. It must be fiscally constrained, which means we cannot spend more than we have. The CFO approves the program each year for fiscal constraint.

The new Federal Transportation Authorization worked under as MAP-21. It requires the national highway performance program and, in the interest of the United States, to focus on the following national goals: safety, infrastructure condition, congestion reduction, system reliability, freight movement and economic vitality, and environmental sustainability. In addition to the five-year program, it is actually supported by ADOT's Long Range Program, our asset management system, as well as the linking Planning to Programming process that we are working on today. The Transportation Board approved the funding scenario in our Long Range plan and it recommended choices with the limited amount of resources that focused on a combination of preservation first, modernization, expansion, and non-highways last. In the past, the Department has spent approximately 76 percent of the total funding available on expansions including the MAG and PAG regions of the State. And that is not something the Department can continue to do. The Department was told the transportation revenues were drastically reduced and it had to cut \$350 Million out of the five-year program. In this programming cycle \$250 Million coming out of FY 2016 and \$100 Million coming out of FY 2017. The transportation revenues in Arizona are derived from the gas tax, sales tax, and VLT and registration fees. In 2007 the revenue stream changed. Now in 2013 the revenues are at about the 2004 level. The reduction in the program is shared across Greater Arizona and in the MAG and PAG regions, each reduced their programs by \$87 Million and \$35 Million, respectively.

In the FY 2009-2013, the Department had about a \$2.5 billion program. In the FY 2014-2018, that number is about \$1.9 billion. This is a \$600 Million reduction in revenue available for transportation projects in Arizona. The preservation investment would be 65-80 percent, which appears high. The actual amount available to invest is quite low. The Department is investing \$140-150 Million on preservation. ADOT staff recommends funds for transportation preservation should be at least \$260-270 Million per year and does not have the ability to do that. Overall there is a 30 percent reduction in revenue available for programming. The State Highway System Infrastructure is valued currently at

\$18.4 billion; however, if the Department needs to replace the transportation infrastructure, the system would cost more than \$100 billion. For every dollar invested today in preservation will be five to seven dollars down the road for replacement of it. The Department's recommendation has always been to focus heavily on preservation.

The three separate scenarios are specifically for Greater Arizona. They are not affected by the amount of funding that we provide to the MAG and PAG regions. MAG and PAG program their own funds. In Greater Arizona, ADOT does that for them specifically, the Transportation Board. While in Greater Arizona, in Scenario A is focusing just on preservation. This scenario removes all the major projects out of the existing five-year program except for a couple of cases, which is the SR 89 Deep Well Ranch Road in the Prescott District. It is an \$18 Million dollar project in FY 2014 because we are so far along on this project. The other project is the \$10 Million US 60 Oak Flats Miami passing lane project. Those two projects stayed in every one of the scenarios.

Scenario A – Focus on Preservation. This scenario is investing very heavily in preservation of our existing system. There are 81 preservation projects from 2014 to 2016, 39 bridge projects, one major project, and 690 miles of pavement preservation projects. An average of \$184 Million per year in preservation from 2014 through 2018 would be allocated. Arizona's interstate system will maintain our existing interstate highways to acceptable levels until 2031 with this scenario.

Scenario B – Focus on Programmed Major Projects. This scenario focuses on major projects; leaving in all of the existing projects that are in the current five-year program FY 2013 to 2017 in addition to the 89 project and the passing lane project on US 60 that was mentioned earlier. ADOT also has 25 bridge projects and only preserves about 458 miles of pavement in the State. This scenario would be investing only \$142 Million in preservation. With this scenario, the pavement condition would maintain an acceptable level until 2017. The pavement condition on the interstate would fall below the acceptable levels. The Greater Arizona projects that remain would be US95 Fortuna Wash Bridge (FY 15) \$13.5 M in Yuma County; the I-10 Ehrenberg Port of Entry (FY 16) \$20 M in La Paz County; the US93 Carrow to Stephens (FY 17) \$22 M in Mohave County; the I-8, Mohawk Rest Area (FY 15) \$20 M; US60, Silver King Project (FY 15) \$45M; SR89, Jct. 89A to Deep Well Ranch Road (FY 16) \$15 M; and lastly, SR260, Lion Springs Project (FY 17) \$40 M.

Scenario C – Combination of Preservation and Major Projects. Scenario C is a hybrid of the two Scenarios A and B and focuses on preservation and maintains some of the major projects in the program. There are four major projects remaining, in addition to two that were mentioned earlier, the 89 project and the US 60. Scenario C would keep 39 bridge projects and 524 miles in pavement preservation and investing about \$150 Million in preservation. The interstate system would at acceptable levels until about 2021. Staff would recommend keeping the four projects, the SR89, Deep Well Ranch Road to Chino Valley (FY 14) \$18 M; the US95 Fortuna Wash Bridge, (FY 15) \$13.5 M; the I-10 Ehrenberg POE, (FY 16) \$20 M; and the US93 Carrow to Stephens, (FY 17) \$22 M.

Staff would defer the following projects that were listed earlier: I-8, Mohawk Rest Area \$20 M, US60; Silver King Project \$45M; SR89, Jct. 89A to Deep Well Ranch Road \$15; and the SR260, Lion Springs Project \$40 M out of the five-year program. The Department made these recommendations and followed the prioritization that is used on all projects. These projects were chosen because they were the highest rated and the best projects that fit the need of the system.

ITEM B: FY 2014 - 2018 Statewide Highway Construction Program (Excluding MAG and PAG)—Scott Omer

Scott compared the scenarios A, B, and C. Scenario A is heavily in preservation of the existing transportation system and a small amount in expansion and modernization compared to the other two scenarios. In summary, this year and every year the Department updates all the project costs and uses the most current and update estimates. In FY 2016 and FY 2017 the overall program was reduced by \$350 Million. The Department then programmed out all of the subprograms, each one of those were line items in FY 2014-FY2016.

ITEM C: FY 2014 - 2018 PAG Regional Highway Construction Program—Scott Omer

PAG's share was \$35 Million spread over two years; \$10 Million in FY 2016 and \$25 Million in FY 2017. The revenue that is distributed to the regions across the State is by the Revenue Allocation Advisory Committee (RAAC) formula. That agreement in the Casa Grande Accord is how is determined the amount of funding that is available in MAG and PAG. PAG appropriates their projects in coordination with ADOT. In the FY 2014-2018, PAG is programming about 93 percent of their overall funding in the five-year program into expansion. The specifics of projects that are changing either on schedule or budget are the I-10, Ina Road TI, defer it to FY 2017 from FY 2016. ADOT is working with PAG to make sure the RTA funds of \$34 Million in FY 2016, and in FY 2017, there are \$52 Million in federal aid. The I-10 Ruthrauff Road TI project is another project not listed here. Another project is the I-19, Ajo Way TI project. At this time, the Department is working with the community and PAG to review how this project can be moved up into program. In meetings with the Tucson District staff and PAG, the Department should have an acceptable compromise for everyone. The Department will bring that out in the June meeting. It should be one of the recommended changes to the five-year program.

ITEM D: FY 2014 - 2018 MAG Regional Highway Construction Program—Scott Omer

MAG's regional share of the adjustment was about \$87 Million. They have the same revenue distribution with the same process that Greater Arizona and PAG does. MAG has about 88 percent of their total program invested in expansion. Two updated project costs and schedules affected are the I-10, SR101L to I-17, was reduced by \$73.2 Million due to an error in the program and was corrected. The other project US 60, Meridian Rd, TI Design, was increased by \$120 Million.

Projects that updated the costs and schedules are being deferred to FY 2015 from FY 2014:

- 1. SR85: Warner St, Bridge, defer to FY 15;
- 2. SR303L/I-10 TI & Thomas to Camelback, Landscape Const., defer to FY 15;
- 3. I-10, SR101L to I-17, Utilities, defer to FY 15;
- 4. SR101L, Pima Rd, Extension, JPA, defer to FY 15.

The South Mountain entire corridor is being deferred one year. Every project that was originally programed from FY 2014 to FY 2019 is being deferred from FY 2015 to FY 2020.

The new traffic interchange projects that are programed in the MAG region system wide:

- 1. Grand Ave at Bell Rd;
- 2. Grand Ave at Thompson Ranch (Thunderbird);
- 3. SR303Loop to El Mirage Rd.

MAG is increasing maintenance funds by \$400K preservation funds from FY 14 to FY18 and invests \$170K in new message signs for posting travel times.

ITEM E: FY 2014 - 2018 Airport Development Program—Scott Omer

The overall revenue we have available is about \$22 Million. Most of the revenue collected is from flight property taxes. The proposed five-year program in FY 2014 is Federal Match Grants (FSL) \$ 4.5 Million; State-Local Grants (SL) \$15.8 Million; the Airport Pavement Preservation (APMS) \$ 6.5 Million; Airport Development Loans, \$2 Million; and State Planning Services \$2.6 Million. The total program is \$31.5 Million for FY 2014.

A motion to adjourn the Public Hearing meeting was made by Steve Christy and seconded by Kelly Anderson. In a voice vote, the motion carries.

The Intermodal Transportation Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the acquisition and establishment of a drainage easement for State Route 77 within the above referenced project.

This portion was previously established as a state route and state highway, designated U. S. Routes 80 and 89, by Resolution of the Arizona State Highway Commission, dated September 09, 1927, and entered on Page 26 of its Official Minutes; additional right of way for relocation purposes was established as a state highway by the Resolution dated March 09, 1949, and shown on Page 123 of its Official Minutes; subsequently, additional right of way for improvements was established as a state highway by Resolution 62-38, dated October 23, 1961, which was later amended by Resolution 63-65, dated September 10, 1963. Thereafter, the U. S. Route 80 designation was eliminated by Arizona State Transportation Board Resolution 77-16-A-48, dated September 16, 1977; and the highway was redesignated and renumbered as State Route 77 by Resolution 92-08-A-056, dated August 21, 1992. Additional right of way for roadway improvements was established as a state route and state highway by Resolution 2003-03-A-017, dated March 21, 2003, which was amended by Resolution 2003-06-A-038, dated June 20, 2003.

Transportation improvements by Pima County along Ina Road require the relocation of drainage facilities needed to accommodate State Route 77, at no cost to the State of Arizona. To facilitate the county project, it is necessary to acquire and establish a drainage easement for relocation of the existing facility in an area lying beneath a portion of the existing Pima County roadway known as Giaconda Way.

The drainage easement right of way to be acquired and established is depicted in Appendix "A" and delineated on maps and plans on file in the office of the State Engineer, Intermodal Transportation Division, Phoenix, Arizona, entitled: "Right of Way Plans of the TUCSON - ORACLE JCT - GLOBE HIGHWAY, River Rd -Ina Rd, Project 077 PM 072 H6000 01R / S 077-A-700".

In the interest of public safety, necessity and convenience, I recommend that an easement for drainage lying beneath the existing Pima County roadway known as Giaconda Way, depicted in Appendix "A" be acquired, at no cost to the State of Arizona, and established as an integral part of the state highway system, to be effective upon signing of this recommendation. This Resolution is considered the conveying document for such existing Pima County right of way and no further conveyance is legally required.

STATE ENGINEER'S REPORT June 2013

The Status of Projects Under Construction report for June 2013 shows 105 projects under construction valued at \$1,037,912,596.55. The transportation board awarded 8 projects during June valued at approximately \$21.9 million.

During June the Department finalized 16 projects valued at \$135,825,642.18. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package.

Year to date we have finalized 257 projects. The total cost of these 257 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 7.4%. Deducting incentive/bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to 4.8%.




