Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director. In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route or a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects. With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction. The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion. In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

And so what we have been working on and reporting year 4 after year now, this is annual performance report where we look at the performance of our bridges, pavement, safety, mobility 5 6 and map those out so that people can clearly see where our performance lies, and when we come to you in January with the 8 tentative program, we'll be bringing you a package of these --9 of this performance report along side that.

Here's an example of the type of information that 11 you'll find in the performance report. This is a map of our 12 bridge conditions around the state, and you can see the State of 13 Arizona and the current condition of our bridges on the state 14 highway system in red, yellow, green for poor, fair and good. 15 And then you can see the trend up in the upper left-hand corner 16 from 2001 to 2014 and see where the trend of our bridge 17 condition has been going over that period of time, and you can 18 see the fair condition growing and how what's some concern is 19 the poor condition has been growing over the last few years.

I did want to (inaudible) remind the Board that as there's a lot of discussions about funding available from (inaudible) and additional funding, we do intend to look at all of our needs and look at where those fundings -- funds might be most appropriate, and we do believe that the preservation category is something that the Board still needs to remember and

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Intermodal Transportation Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the establishment and improvement of State Route 86 within the above referenced project.

The existing alignment, previously a county road running from Tucson to Sells, thence from Sells to Ajo, was established as a state route by Resolution of the Arizona State Highway Commission dated May 14, 1943, entered on Page 64 of its Official Minutes; and was established as a state highway by the Resolution dated June 21, 1943, as shown on Page 75 thereof. Through the Resolution of August 28, 1945, as set forth on Page 181 of the Official Minutes, additional right of way for relocation and alteration of the Tucson - Ajo Highway was established as a state highway under Project F.A.S. 110 (FL-5).

New right of way is now needed for drainage improvements necessary to enhance convenience and safety for the traveling public. Accordingly, it is necessary to establish and acquire the new right of way as a state route for this improvement project.

The new right of way to be established as a state route and acquired for the improvements is depicted in Appendix "A" and delineated on maps and plans on file in the office of the State Engineer, Intermodal Transportation Division, Phoenix, Arizona, entitled: "95% Design Plans, dated July, 2015, WHY - TUCSON HIGHWAY, Fresnal - MP 123.9, Project 086 PM 120 H8469 / 086-A(217)T".

RES. NO. 2016-02-A-010 PROJECT: 086 PM 120 H8469 / 086-A(217)T HIGHWAY: WHY - TUCSON SECTION: Fresnal - MP 123.9 ROUTE NO.: State Route 86 ENG. DIST.: Southcentral COUNTY: Pima

In the interest of public safety, necessity and convenience, I recommend that the new right of way depicted in Appendix "A" be established and improved as a state route, and that prior to construction the new right of way shall be established as a state highway.

I further recommend the acquisition of the new right of way, pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes Sections 28-7092 and 28-7094, an estate in fee, or such other interest as required, to include advance, future and early acquisition, exchanges, donations or such other interest as is required, including material for construction, haul roads and various easements necessary for or incidental to the improvements as delineated on said maps and plans.

Pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes Section 28-7046, I recommend the adoption of a resolution making this recommendation effective.

- The Economic Strengths Program (ESP) is a competitive grant program designed to enhance the economic strength and competitiveness of Arizona's rural communities by providing funding for highway projects that foster job growth.
- The grant is administered jointly between the Arizona Commerce Authority (ACA) and the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT).
- The ESP reimburses specified costs of qualifying rural road and/or highway projects that are projected to accomplish one or more of the following:
 - Retain a significant number of jobs,
 - o Create a significant number of new jobs,
 - Foster significant private capital investment, otherwise make a significant contribution to the regional economy, particularly in base industries.
- The total available funds are \$1 million annually, with a \$500,000 cap per grant with a 10% match requirement
- Pursuant to A.R.S. §41-1505, recommendations on ESP awards are made by the ACA's Rural Business Development Advisory Council (RBDAC) and reviewed by the ACA Board (no Board action is required).
- The CEO of ACA then transmits the recommendation to ADOT for ADOT Transportation Board Approval and subsequent administration

Below is a summary of the evaluation process of the proposals submitted for the Fiscal Year 2016 Economic Strengths Project (ESP) Grant. Per A.R.S. § 41-1505(E), the Rural Business Development Advisory Committee (RBDAC) of the ACA has conducted the evaluations and is hereby submitting the priority list to you for presentation to the state transportation board.

Overview of the Evaluation Process

- 1. Two (2) proposals were received on or before the due date: November 6, 2015.
 - a. Note: It is believed that there is significant interest in this program, however due to the dormancy of the program, few communities were prepared to respond.
- 2. ACA internally reviewed each of the submitted proposals to determine the eligibility of the Applicant, Project, Fund Matching and Costs according to RFP §§ 1.3., 1.4., 1.5. and 1.6.
- 3. Two (2) applications were determined eligible. The total grant request of the two (2) eligible projects amounts to \$1,000,000.
- 4. The two (2) eligible projects have projected outcomes for 36 months after project completion of:

5. Eligible applications were presented to the Evaluation Committee for review and scoring based on the evaluation criteria in RFP § 3.2. The Evaluation Committee included four (4) members from the Rural Business Development Advisory Council and one (1) ACA representative.

Review of Evaluation Criteria [RFP § 3.2.]

Proposals were scored by the Evaluation Committee based on the criteria described below:

- [14.5% total] The overall projected cost and amount of expenditures required for the project;
- [19.0% total] The number quality jobs that the project will cause to be retained or created;
- [19.0% total] The nature and amount of capital investment or other contribution to the economy of the State as a result of the Project;
- [9.5% total] Demonstrated local support including the amount and percentage of funding for the project that will come from sources other than the program;
- [9.5% total] The magnitude of the project and its relative value to the State as compared to other proposed projects
- **[19.0% total]** The extent to which the project would contribute to achieving an equitable distribution of monies and projects among the various regions of the State and throughout the State as a whole; and
- [9.5% total] The schedule for completion of the project.

A contract modification/cost proposal has been submitted for Phase II which includes Stage III plans through final PS&E. The contract mod was negotiated with a final cost of \$241,000. During development it was discovered that the tie-ins to the existing roadway required an adjustment in the grades and transition from the roadway approaches to the bridge. FHWA advised that the annual appropriation for FY 16 has been exhausted and only \$658,446 has been allocated (on December 7, 2015) at this time. The remaining ER funds will be available in October or sooner if Congress chooses to appropriate additional funds for distribution. This request will reimburse Northcentral District maintenance for costs associated with emergency repair of US89A.

STATE ENGINEER'S REPORT January 2016

The Status of Projects Under Construction report for January 2016 shows 123 projects under construction valued at \$796,021,774.92. The transportation board awarded 4 projects during January valued at approximately \$46.1 million.

During January the Department finalized 7 projects valued at \$41,330,185.71. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package.

Year to date we have finalized 84 projects. The total cost of these 84 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 3.9%. Deducting incentive/bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to -0.3%.
