Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director. In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route or a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects. With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction. The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion. In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the abandonment of right of way temporarily acquired for the improvement of U.S. Route 60 within the above referenced project.

The right of way to be abandoned was previously established as a state route and state highway, designated U.S. Route 89, by Resolution of the State Highway Commission on September 09, 1927, entered on Page 26 of its Official Minutes and depicted on its Official Map of State Routes and State Highways, incorporated by reference therein. The Commission's request of October 29, 1930, on Page 36 of the Official Minutes, resulted in its designation as U.S. Route 60 by the American Association of State Highway Officials. Additional right of way was subsequently established as a state route and state highway by the Resolution dated February 13, 1935, shown on Page 154 of the Official Minutes; and Resolution 64-4, dated January 07, 1964. On August 21, 1992, State Transportation Board Resolution 92-08-A-56 eliminated the overlapping U.S. Route 89 designation. Through Resolutions 2000-01-A-009 of January 21, 2000; and 2000-10-A-089 of October 20, 2000, the Board approved, adopted and established a State Route Plan for future relocation and improvement, designated U.S. Route 60. Thereafter, additional right of way was established as a controlled access state highway by Resolutions 2001-05-A-041, dated May 18, 2001; 2011-05-A-034, dated May 20, 2011; and by Resolution 2012-10-A-046, dated October 19, 2012.

The right of way is no longer needed for state transportation purposes. The City of Glendale has agreed to accept jurisdiction, ownership and maintenance of the right of way in accordance with Intergovernmental Agreement No. 13-0002457, dated December 29, 2014, any and all amendments thereto, and that certain 120-Day Advance Notice of Abandonment, dated October 21, 2016. Accordingly, it is recommended that the State's interest in the right of way be abandoned, subject to appurtenant, existing access control, which shall remain intact and under ADOT control, as depicted in Appendix "A".

The right of way to be abandoned is delineated on the maps and plans on file in the office of the State Engineer, Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division, Phoenix, Arizona, entitled: "Right of Way Plan of the WICKENBURG - PHOENIX HIGHWAY, 51st Ave. - Bethany Home Road, Project 060 MA 156 H5537 01R / RAM-060-B-801"; and on those entitled: "Right of Way Plans of the WICKENBURG - PHOENIX HIGHWAY, 43rd Avenue - 71st Avenue, Project 060 MA 149 H7292 01R", and lies between the engineering stations shown in Appendix "A" attached hereto. I further recommend that the right of way depicted in Appendix "A" be removed from the State Highway System and abandoned to the City of Glendale, as provided in Arizona Revised Statutes Sections 28-7207 and 28-7209, and subject to appurtenant, existing access control, which shall remain intact and under ADOT control, as depicted in said Appendix "A" and on said maps and plans.

All other rights of way, easements and appurtenances thereto, subject to the provisions of Arizona Revised Statutes Section 28-7210, shall continue as they existed prior to the disposal of the right of way depicted in Appendix "A".

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the abandonment of portions of right of way along Happy Valley Parkway temporarily acquired for the above referenced highway project to the City of Peoria and the County of Maricopa, as their interests may appear of record.

The right of way to be abandoned was previously established as a state route and designated as the preliminary transportation corridor of the Cotton Lane Highway and the Northwest Loop Highway, State Route 517, by Arizona State Transportation Board Resolutions 85-08-A-58 and 85-08-A-59, dated August 16, 1985. Thereafter, Resolution 89-07-A-058 of July 21, 1989; Resolution 98-05-A-015 of May 15, 1998; and Resolution 2007-01-A-006 of January 19, 2007, adopted and approved new refined portions of the State Route Plan Corridor, and authorized advance acquisition. latter designated this segment as the Estrella Freeway portion of the State Route 303 Loop under the above referenced project. Resolution 2006-06-A-025, dated June 23, 2006 established County acquired right of way at this location as an access controlled state route and state highway. Resolution 2008-09-A-042, dated September 19, 2008, established the newly refined portions of the State Route Plan, and additional needed right of way, as a controlled access state highway under the same project. Later in 2008, an administrative action by ADOT finalized the designation of the Northwest Outer Loop as the Bob Stump Memorial Parkway.

The right of way is no longer needed for state transportation purposes. The City of Peoria will accept jurisdiction, ownership and maintenance of the right of way lying west of the State Route 303 Loop in accordance with that certain 120-Day Advance Notice of Abandonment, dated October 21, 2016. The County of Maricopa will accept jurisdiction, ownership and maintenance of the right of way lying east of the State Route 303 Loop in accordance with that certain 120-Day Advance Notice of Abandonment, dated October 2016. Accordingly, it is recommended that the State's right of way be abandoned, in the subject appurtenant, existing access control, which shall remain intact and under ADOT control, as depicted in Appendix "A".

The right of way to be abandoned is delineated on maps and plans on file in the office of the State Engineer, Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division, Phoenix, Arizona, entitled: "Right of Way Plans of the BOB STUMP MEMORIAL PARKWAY, Happy Valley Rd. - I-17, Project 303L MA 025 H5946 01R / S 303-A-700", and lies between the engineering stations shown in Appendix "A" attached hereto. The abandoned right of way is subject to appurtenant, existing access control, which shall remain intact and under ADOT control, as depicted in Appendix "A" and on said maps and plans.

I further recommend that the right of way depicted in Appendix "A" be removed from the State Highway System and abandoned to the City of Peoria and the County of Maricopa, as their interests may appear of record, pursuant to the provisions of Arizona Revised Statutes Sections 28-7207 and 28-7209, and subject to appurtenant, existing access control, which shall remain intact and under ADOT control, as depicted in Appendix "A" and on said maps and plans.

All other rights of way, easements and appurtenances thereto, subject to the provisions of Arizona Revised Statutes Section 28-7210, shall continue as they existed prior to the disposal of the right of way depicted in Appendix "A".

The abandonment becomes effective upon recordation in the Office of the County Recorder in accordance with Arizona Revised Statutes Section 28-7213.

Pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes Section 28-7046, I recommend that the Arizona State Transportation Board adopt a resolution making this recommendation effective.





REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the establishment of new right of way as a state route and state highway for the improvement of the State Route 202 Loop within the above referenced project.

The existing alignment was previously established as a State Route Plan for the Southwest Loop Freeway, and designated State Route 218 by Arizona State Transportation Board Resolution 85-04-A-33, dated April 26, 1985. Advance acquisition was provided for by Resolution 86-05-A-37, dated May 16, 1986; and by Resolution 86-12-A-77, dated November 21, 1986. The State Route Plan corridor for the Southwest Outer Loop was refined by Resolution 87-08-A-68, dated August 21, 1987; and was thereafter further refined by Resolution 87-11-A-98, dated November 20, 1987. portion was renumbered and redesignated as part of the State Route 101 Loop in Resolution 87-11-A-105, dated December 18, 1987. was subsequently renumbered and redesignated as part of the State Route 202 Loop in Resolution 91-07-A-56, dated July 19, 1991. Thereafter, Resolution 2011-09-A-062, dated September 15, and Resolution 2015-01-A-005, dated January 09, 2015, allowed for early acquisition of particular parcels necessary for new right of way, and established them as a state route. Transportation Board Resolution 2015-03-A-018, dated March 20, 2015, established the alignment as a state route; and Resolution 2016-07-A-040 of July 15, 2016, established new right of way as a state route and state highway to facilitate the construction phase of this project.

New right of way is now needed to accommodate design change necessary to enhance convenience and safety for the traveling public. Accordingly, it is necessary to establish and acquire the new right of way as a state route and state highway, and that access be controlled as necessary for this improvement project.

The new right of way to be established as a state route and state highway and acquired for this improvement, to include access control as necessary, is depicted in Appendix "A" and delineated on maps and plans on file in the office of the State Engineer, Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division, Phoenix, Arizona, entitled: "Right of Way Plans of the SOUTH MOUNTAIN FREEWAY, 51st Ave - Salt River Segment, Project 202L MA 000 H5439". Right of way acquisition is being done under Project 202L MA 056 H8827 01R / 202-D(200)S, as noted thereon.

In the interest of public safety, necessity and convenience, I recommend that the new right of way depicted in Appendix "A" be established as a state route and state highway, and that access is controlled.

I recommend the acquisition of the new right of way, pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes Sections 28-7092 and 28-7094, as an estate in fee, or such other interest as is required, including advance, future and early acquisition, access rights, exchanges or donations, including material for construction, haul roads and various easements necessary for or incidental to the improvements, as delineated on said maps and plans.

I further recommend the establishment of existing county, town and city roadways into the state highway system as a controlled access state route and state highway which are necessary for or incidental to the improvement as delineated on said maps and plans. This resolution is considered the conveying document for such existing county, town and city roadways and no further conveyance is legally required.

Pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes Section 28-7046, I recommend the adoption of a resolution making this recommendation effective.

RESOLVED that the Director is hereby authorized to acquire by lawful means, pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes Sections 28-7092 and 28-7094, an estate in fee, or such other interest as is required, to include advance, future and early acquisition, access rights, exchanges or donations, including material for construction, haul roads, and various easements in any property necessary for or incidental to the improvements, as delineated on said maps and plans; be it further

RESOLVED that written notice be provided to the County Board of Supervisors in accordance with Arizona Revised Statute 28-7043, and to the affected governmental jurisdictions for whose local existing roadways are being established as a state route and state highway by this resolution action; be it further

RESOLVED that the Director secure an appraisal of the property to be acquired, including access rights, and that necessary parties be compensated – with the exception of any existing county, town or city roadways being established herein as a state route and state highway. Upon failure to acquire said lands by other lawful means, the Director is authorized to initiate condemnation proceedings.

The request is for additional funding for a design consultant modification, costs associated with utility relocations for right of way cost to cure and costs for APS prior rights relocations.

A design contract modification is necessary because the construction sequencing and phasing for the project required modification after the Stage V submittal and a resubmittal of Stage V. The modifications were necessary because of utility conflicts and the goal to keep construction out of the produce season (November to April) for the food processing businesses located within and adjacent to the project limits. The project was developed originally as a one season construction project but utility conflict resolutions required a two season construction project with the south roundabout being constructed the first season. When it became apparent the utilities clearances were not leaving enough time to construct the south roundabout (longer construction duration), the phasing was shifted to construction the shorter duration roundabout (north) first so we are able to bid the project in FY 2017. Also, the City of Yuma water line relocation work was not able to be constructed before the winter months, their relocations required rephrasing the project so the north roundabout will be constructed first allowing for the City of Yuma to clear their conflicts without affecting the water supply to the agricultural cooling/packing sheds that need a continuous supply of water during the produce season.

Right-of-way Cost to Cure: A driveway relocation was necessary to maintain efficient intersection traffic operations. A temporary construction easement (TCE) was obtained to allow the construction of the new driveway. Due to the property owners' oversight of the necessary utility relocations within the private property which are required for the construction of the new driveway, they are now requesting reimbursement of utility relocation costs.

STATE ENGINEER'S REPORT February 2017

The Status of Projects Under Construction report for February 2017 shows 102 projects under construction valued at \$1,522,511,744.55. The transportation board awarded 18 projects during February valued at approximately \$35.2 million.

During February the Department finalized 13 projects valued at \$22,175,709.52. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package.

Year to date we have finalized 79 projects. The total cost of these 79 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 2.8%. Deducting incentive/bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to 0.1%.




