Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director. In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route or a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects. With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction. The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

CITIZEN INPUT

Citizens may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board also conducts three public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion. In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

The existing alignment was previously established as a state route and state highway, designated U.S. Route 80, by Resolution of the Arizona State Highway Commission, dated September 09, 1927, entered on Page 26 of its Official Minutes, and depicted on its Official Map of State Routes and State Highways, incorporated by reference therein. The Resolution dated August 29, 1945, shown on Page 188 of the Official Minutes established additional right of way as a state highway for the location, relocation and alteration of this segment of the Benson-Douglas Highway. Thereafter, the remaining portion of U.S. Route 80 within the State of Arizona was redesignated and renumbered as State Route 80 by Arizona State Transportation Board Resolution 89-12-A-96, dated December 15, 1989.

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the establishment and improvement of a portion of State Route 95 within the above referenced project.

The existing alignment was previously established as a state route by Arizona State Highway Commission Resolution 61-100, dated January 10, 1961, and designated State Route 172. It was established as a state highway by Resolution 62-3, dated July 14, 1961. The highway was renumbered and redesignated as State Highway #95 by Resolution 62-121 of August 17, 1962. Additional right of way for improvements was established as a state route by Resolution 71-56, dated June 21, 1971; and thereafter as a state highway by Arizona State Transportation Board Resolution 75-17-A-69, dated October 10, 1975. The State Route Plan for State Route 95 was adopted by Resolution 2001-11-A-078, dated November 16, 2001, approving the location and improvement of the alignment, and establishing it as a state route. Prior to construction, this portion of State Route 95 was established as a state highway by Resolution 2005-05-A-031, dated May 20, 2005.

This project involves reinforcement of the existing roadway. Temporary construction easements outside the existing right of way are needed for the rehabilitation of drainage slopes and facilities to enhance convenience and safety for the traveling public. Accordingly, it is now necessary to establish and acquire the temporary construction easements needed. The areas of temporary construction easement required for this improvement are depicted in Appendix "A" and delineated on maps and plans on file in the office of the State Engineer, Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division, Phoenix, Arizona, entitled: "60% Design Plans, dated April 22, 2016, PARKER - TOPOCK HIGHWAY, MP 165.8 and MP 183.6, Project 095 MO 165 H8811 / 095-C(218)T".

In the interest of public safety, necessity and convenience, I recommend that the temporary construction easements depicted in Appendix "A" be acquired in order to improve this portion of State Route 95.







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REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the abandonment of right of way along Thompson Ranch Road temporarily acquired for improvement of the Thunderbird Road Traffic Interchange at U.S. Route 60 within the above referenced project.

This alignment was previously established as a state route and state highway, designated U.S. Route 89, by Resolution of the Arizona State Highway Commission, dated September 09, 1927, entered on Page 26 of its Official Minutes, and depicted on its Official Map of State Routes and State Highways. The highway was incorporated into the alignment of U.S. Route 60 through the Resolution of October 29,1930, on Page 36 of the Official Minutes, and its administrative redesignation by the American Association of State Highway Officials. Additional right of way for the relocation and alteration of the route was established as a state highway by the Resolution of May 23, 1941, on Page 202 of the Minutes; and later by State Transportation Board Resolution 88-01-A-02 of January 18, 1988; and Amended Resolution 90-04-A-26 of April 20, 1990. The U.S. Route 89 designation was eliminated by Resolution 92-08-A-56 of August 21, 1992. Additional right of way for widening improvements was established by Resolution 2009-07-A-051 of July 17, 2009. Under the above referenced project, new right of way was established as a state route by Resolution 2014-12-A-048 of December 12, 2014; and Resolution 2015-05-A-025 of May 15, 2015; and then as a controlled access state route and state highway in Resolution 2016-05-A-025, dated May 20, 2016.

The right of way is no longer needed for state transportation purposes. The City of El Mirage has agreed to accept jurisdiction, ownership and maintenance of the right of way in accordance with that certain Intergovernmental Agreement No. 15-0005361, dated February 17, 2016. Accordingly, I recommend that the State's interest in the right of way be abandoned, subject to appurtenant, existing access control, which shall remain intact and under ADOT control, as depicted in Appendix "A".

The right of way to be abandoned is delineated on the maps and plans on file in the office of the State Engineer, Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division, Phoenix, Arizona, entitled: "Right of Way Plans of the WICKENBURG - PHOENIX HIGHWAY, Thunderbird Road T.I., Project 060 MA 145 H8374 / 060-B(208)T" between the engineering stations shown in Appendix "A" attached hereto. The abandoned right of way is subject to appurtenant, existing access control, which shall remain intact and under ADOT control, as depicted in Appendix "A" and on said maps and plans.

I further recommend that the right of way depicted in Appendix "A" be removed from the State Highway System and abandoned to the City of El Mirage, as provided in Arizona Revised Statutes Sections 28-7207 and 28-7209, and subject to appurtenant, existing access control, which shall remain intact and under ADOT control, as depicted in Appendix "A" and on said maps and plans.

All other rights of way, easements and appurtenances thereto, subject to the provisions of Arizona Revised Statutes Section 28-7210, shall continue as they existed prior to the disposal of the right of way depicted in Appendix "A".

After review, staff recommends the scope of the project be clarified which will decrease the overall estimated cost. However, some items were underestimated and portions of items were underestimated. Examples of each are given. Asphaltic Concrete was underestimated. Earthen Shoulder Build-up, Aggregate Base, and Cover Material were underestimated in haul and placement costs. STATE ENGINEER'S REPORT March 2017

The Status of Projects Under Construction report for March 2017 shows 104 projects under construction valued at \$1,556,471,956.82. The transportation board awarded 10 projects during March valued at approximately \$15.5 million.

During March the Department finalized 22 projects valued at \$67,525,493.22. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package.

Year to date we have finalized 101 projects. The total cost of these 101 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 2.9%. Deducting incentive/bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to - 0.3%.

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


