


Revenue Report:

- GAS TAX Strong growth month (6.0%), strong growth FY 2022 (9.8%)
- DIESEL TAX Strong decline month (-7.6%), strong growth FY 2022 (8.5%)
- VLT Moderate growth month (7.7%), strong decline FY 2022 (-6.6%)
- REGISTRATION Moderate growth month
 (2.4%), moderate growth
 FY 2022 (5.7%)



Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill (BIL) formerly IIJA:

Funding

- What we <u>Do</u> know...
 - -Authorizes 5 years of funding, FFY2022 FFY2026.
 - -Arizona's estimated apportionments = \$5.3B, or approximately \$1B annually.
 - -If estimates are correct, then Arizona would receive approximately \$200M more per year in apportionments.
- \star -FFY2022 apportionments = \$969M.
- -Continuing Resolution (CR) provides limited FFY2022 funding through February 18th, and prohibits new programs starting.
- -Funding provided through the CR will not be available until first half of January.




Bipartisan Infrastructure Bill (BIL) formerly IIJA: Funding

- What we <u>Don't</u> know...
 - Level of Obligation Authority (OA), aka, funding.
 - Amounts sub-allocated to the MPOs.
 - Project/Funding qualifications, awaiting rules and guidance.
 - Bridge & Electric Vehicle Programs formula funding.
- When will we know more...
 - Funding for the Bridge and Electric Vehicle formula programs is expected in the "near future."
 - The Continuing Resolution, and therefore funding, expires February 18th.



BIL Apportionment Estimates


FFY 2021 - FFY 2026
