## **Tribal Transportation Update**

#### **Transportation Working Group**

 ADOT Tribal Liaisons and Inter Tribal Council of Arizona have been working to put together a schedule of events which will provide a forum for state and federal transportation information sharing with Tribal representatives and obtain feedback. The first of these meetings has now been scheduled for February 3rd.

#### **2022** Indian Nations and Tribal Legislative Day (INTLD)

- The Governor's Office on Tribal Relations facilitated the INTLD on January 12th (first week of the regular legislative session).
- Discussion items included I-10 widening (SR 202 to SR 387), Water and drought issues, Covid-19 and related healthcare needs, Rural remote education funding needs, Indian Child Welfare Act issues, Navajo coal and energy issues, missing and murdered indigenous people in Arizona, and voter law impacts.

### **Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)**

- Additional guidance has been issued by FHWA. The latest guidance pertains to the Bridge Program, formula funding.
- Funding amounts to the state have been set at \$45M for FY 2022 and a total of \$225M for the 5 year duration of the BIL program.
- A minimum of 15% must be utilized for off-system bridges.
- Eligibility for the Bridge Funds includes preservation, reconstruction and new bridges. There are a total 132 bridges in Arizona rated in poor condition, (system and off-system based on the National Bridge Inventory).
- ADOT is currently reviewing the eligibility requirements and looking at priority bridges to include in the five year program.
