Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director. In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route or a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects. With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction. The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

PUBLIC INPUT

Members of the public may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues. MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. Due to the risks to public health caused by the possible spread of the COVID-19 virus at public gatherings, the Transportation Board asks that people attending Board meetings in person take safety precautions they feel appropriate to protect themselves and others. In addition, for the time being the Transportation Board will conduct concurrent telephonic/WebEx virtual meetings. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board may conduct at least one public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion. In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.



REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the establishment of new right of way as a state route and state highway for the improvement of the Phoenix-Casa Grande Highway, Interstate Route 10, within the above referenced project.

The existing alignment was previously established by Resolution of the Arizona State Highway Commission, dated June 08, 1945, shown on Page 70 of its Official Minutes. The Resolution of May 02, 1957, on Page 155 of the Official Minutes declared a controlled access highway. Resolution 61-78 of November 15, 1960, under Project I-10-3 established a controlled access state Resolution 62-72 of January 26, 1962 established highway. Over the years, additional right of way as a state highway. additional rights of way have been established as a state route and state highway by various Resolutions of the State Highway Commission, and thereafter by its successor, the Arizona State Transportation Board, which include numerous recent advance acquisitions for the above referenced improvement project. This section of the Phoenix-Casa Grande Highway was established as a controlled access state route by Resolution 2016-04-A-021 of April 15, 2016; by Resolution 2019-03-A-012, dated March 15, 2019; and by Resolution 2020-02-A-012, dated February 21, 2020. These and supplementary new rights of way were established as a controlled access state route and state highway for the above referenced project by Resolution 2021-03-A-011, dated March 19, 2021.


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

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the vacation and extinguishment of certain portions of easement right of way originally acquired for use within the above referenced Project I-40-2(35)54.

The existing alignment was previously established as a state route designated U.S. Route 93, the Wickenburg-Kingman Highway, by Resolution of the Arizona State Highway Commission, dated December 27, 1940, entered on Page 95 of its Official Minutes. The Resolution dated October 11, 1946, shown on Page 41 of the Official Minutes, established the new right of way as a state New right of way for the location, relocation, highway. alteration, and widening of the Wickenburg-Kingman Highway was established as a state highway under Project S-58 by the Resolution shown on Page 192 of the Official Minutes of July 03, 1953. A refined alignment was thereafter established by the Resolution shown on Page 351 of the Official Minutes of January Along with additional new right of way, on April 02, 20, 1954. 1965, this segment was established as a controlled access state highway and incorporated into the Interstate Highway System by Resolution 65-32. Numerous Resolutions establishing advance acquisitions followed. Resolution 84-10-A-63, dated October 26, 1984, designated the Kingman-Ash Fork Highway as Interstate Route 40, with the overlapping designation of U.S. Route 93 through the City of Kingman. It also eliminated the U.S. Route 66 designation from all portions of state highways throughout Resolution 2021-05-A-017 of May 21, Mohave County. 2021 established new right of way as a state route for the above referenced Rancho Santa Fe Parkway T. I. Improvement Project.


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

The Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the extinguishment and relinquishment of certain highway drainage easement right of way originally acquired for use within the above referenced project. This Resolution is being executed in order to be in compliance with all applicable United States Codes of Federal Regulations regarding the relinquishment and reassignment of this right of way to the Town of Camp Verde.

The right of way to be relinquished, previously a local road known as the General Crook Trail, was established as a state route and state highway by State Transportation Board Resolution 89-08-A-68 of August 18, 1989, and was therein designated State Route 260. A new alignment was adopted and approved as the expanded State Route Plan for the Camp Verde - Bridgeport Highway Corridor, and established as a state route by Resolution 99-01-A-005, dated January 15, 1999. The Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the extinguishment and relinquishment of certain portions of highway easement right of way for right of way originally acquired for use within the above referenced project.

STATE ENGINEER'S REPORT May 2022

The Status of Projects Under Construction report for May 2022 shows 95 projects under construction valued at \$2,020,582,882.59. The transportation board awarded 6 projects during May valued at approximately \$24.8 million.

During May, the Department finalized 7 projects valued at \$94,096,843.71. Projects where the final cost exceeded the contractors bid amount by more than 5% are detailed in your board package.

Fiscal Year to date we have finalized 74 projects. The total cost of these 74 projects has exceeded the contractors bid amount by 1.6%. Deducting incentive/bonus payments, revisions, omissions and additional work paid for by others, fiscal year to date reduces this percentage to -0.7%.




