 Next Tuesday, April 22: The 100th day of the legislative session, at which time lawmakers are supposed to wrap up their work





### Transportation Funding Bills of Interest

**HB2101:** Appropriation; match advantage; rural transportation

 Appropriates \$10M from the General Fund in FY25-26 to the AZ SMART fund for rural transportation improvements and maintenance.

**HB2304:** Appropriations; highway and road projects

 Annual RTAC bill with appropriations of varying amounts in FY25-26 to ADOT to complete transportation infrastructure projects designated as regional priorities by multiple governing and planning organizations.





### **Transportation Funding Bills of Interest**

HB2192: Appropriations; Interstate 10; vehicle lanes

 Appropriates \$70M in FY25-26 and \$50M in FY26-27 to ADOT for the design and construction of additional vehicle lanes, separated by a lighted median, on Interstate 10 between State Route 85 and Citrus Rd.

SB1162: Appropriation; highway project; Patagonia; use

 Permits Patagonia to use monies previously distributed to the town by ADOT to reconstruct McKeown avenue between 3rd Ave. West and State Route 82, in addition to any other prescribed use.





### **Transportation Funding Bills of Interest**

#### HB2557/SB1617 - Appropriation; State Route 347; widening

 Mirror bills appropriating a net increase of \$41.4M from the GF for the Riggs Road/SR 347 TI.

#### Other Bills of Interest

**HB2814:** noncustodial federal monies; appropriation

Asserts legislative authority for appropriating non-custodial federal dollars.

**SB1086:** transportation system performance; ADOT

- Eliminates technical scoring for Pavement Projects (i.e. iri, cracking, rutting, deterioration factors, lifecycle factors)
- Eliminates technical scoring for Bridge Projects, which includes critical bridge condition data (i.e. deck, superstructure, substructure, culvert, scour, lifecycle factors).
- Eliminates the technical scoring for Modernization Projects (ADOT Statewide Studies, ADOT Technical Groups, Road Safety Assessments (RSAs), and Design Concept Report (DCRs).
