Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

#### **BOARD AUTHORITY**

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director. In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route or a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects. With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction. The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

#### **PUBLIC INPUT**

Members of the public may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues.

#### **MEETINGS**

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. Due to potential health risks at large public gatherings, the Transportation Board asks that people attending Board meetings in person take safety precautions they feel appropriate to protect themselves and others. In addition, for the time being the Transportation Board will conduct concurrent telephonic/WebEx virtual meetings. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board may conduct at least one public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

#### **BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE**

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion. In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.


#### ORDER DEFERRAL AND ACCELERATIONS OF AGENDA ITEMS, VOTE WITHOUT DISCUSSION





#### REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

#### TO THE HONORABLE ARIZONA STATE TRANSPORTATION BOARD:

The Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division has made a thorough investigation concerning the establishment and improvement of a portion of Phoenix - Casa Grande Highway, Interstate Route 17 within the above referenced project.

The existing right of way was previously established by various resolutions placed of record over the years by the Arizona State Highway Commission, and/or its successor, the Arizona State Transportation Board, which became the governing body of the State Transportation System on July 01, 1974.

New right of way is now needed to encompass fiber optic cable as an integral part of State Transportation System, necessary to enhance convenience and safety for the traveling public.

Accordingly, it is necessary to acquire and establish the additional right of way for this improvement.

The additional right of way to be acquired and established for this improvement is depicted in Appendix "A" and delineated on maps and plans on file in the office of the State Engineer, Infrastructure Delivery and Operations Division, Phoenix, Arizona, entitled: "Right of Way Plans of the PHOENIX - CASA GRANDE HIGHWAY, Project I-IR-10-3(91)".

In the interest of public safety, necessity and convenience, I recommend that the area depicted in Appendix "A" be established as an integral part of State Transportation System and be designated part of the State Highway System.

#### RESOLUTION OF ESTABLISHMENT

GREGORY D. BYRES, Deputy Director for Transportation and State Engineer of the Arizona Department of Transportation, on June 20, 2025, presented and filed with the Arizona State Transportation Board his written report under Arizona Revised Statutes § 28-7046, recommending the establishment and acquisition of additional right of way for the improvement of a portion of the Phoenix - Casa Grande Highway, Interstate Route 17, as set forth in the above referenced project.

Brief Description	The new roadway cross section will include two lanes in each direction separated by a curbed median sixteen feet wide. A five-foot landscaped buffer will be placed outside of curb and gutter, attached with a five-foot directional bike lane and six-foot sidewalk on both sides of the road. The existing pavement will be completed removed and a new full-depth reconstruction will occur. New aggregate base and asphaltic concrete will be placed upon newly compacted subgrade. New signage and striping will be placed in accordance with the MUTCD and ADOT standards. All crosswalks will implement high visibility patterns defined in City of Flagstaff standards. Several utilities will require relocation prior to the start of construction. The City of Flagstaff has prior rights within the limits of the project. A drainage study is being performed to satisfy City of Flagstaff and Army Corps of Engineers requirements. Unclassified excavation (approx. 10,000 CY) and rock excavation (approx. 5,000 CY) are anticipated. Fill material will be required to be imported, requiring approximately 16,000 CY. Guardrail will be reconstructed with some areas fully removed due to new slopes. Left turns will be restricted through the corridor using the raised median and roundabouts. New midblock crossings will incorporate PHBs. Two new roundabouts will help decrease speeds and reduce conflict points. The Butler-Fourth signalized intersection will be replaced with a roundabout. All horizontal alignments and vertical profiles are being designed to AASHTO guidance. The Butler-Fourth intersection will be raised to flatten approaching road profiles.	The project will prepare a Design Concept Report (DCR) for the Yuma County Elimination of Three UPRR Crossings Project. This project addresses at-grade Union Pacific Railroad (UPRR) crossings at Avenue 9E in the City of Yuma, Fortuna Road in Yuma County, and Avenue 29E in the Town of Wellton. The DCR will evaluate feasible alternatives to eliminate these crossings, aiming to improve mobility, reduce congestion, and enhance safety. The consultant will gather data, coordinate with utility companies, and assess right-of-way constraints. Alternatives, including grade-separated structures, will be analyzed for each location, with a matrix used to determine the preferred solution.  The project includes developing reports on utilities, traffic engineering, drainage, bridge and alignment alternatives, geotechnical conditions, pavement design, and railroad coordination. Traffic analysis will assess existing and projected vehicle volumes, level of service, and crash data to support safety improvements. The drainage report will consider watershed impacts, infiltration rates, and necessary drainage structures. Design standards will align with local and state guidelines, ensuring consistency with transportation regulations. A consultant will prepare an initial and final DCR incorporating agency and public feedback.  The consultant will manage project scheduling, invoicing, and coordination with stakeholders, including the County, City of Yuma, and Town of Wellton. Public engagement will involve open house meetings to present findings and gather community input. The project schedule is estimated at 300 calendar days from the notice to proceed. Deliverables include draft and final reports, an engineer's estimate, and presentations to the Board of Supervisors. Through this effort, Yuma County seeks to enhance safety, reduce traffic delays, and support future growth by eliminating at-grade railroad crossings.

The purpose of the Butler Ave and Fourth St Safety and Multimodal Improvements Project is to address safety, multimodal mobility, and infrastructure deficiencies along the corridor. Roadway deficiencies, stormwater management problems exacerbated by recent wildfires, and aging utility infrastructure will be mitigated. Specific improvements involve adding off-street bike lanes, ADA-compliant sidewalks, modern roundabouts, improved business driveways, and strategically placed mid-block crossings. Furthermore, the project aims to improve access management through the addition of a raised median and increase drainage capacity in the storm system. By addressing these key areas, the project will create a safer, more efficient, and more sustainable transportation network for all users. The project will alleviate existing safety deficiencies related to truck traffic and conflict points for pedestrian and vehicle interactions.

This project is needed to address urgent transportation and drainage issues impacting the Butler Ave and Fourth St corridor. Given high traffic volumes and deficient roadway infrastructure, the need to improve safety for all users, including pedestrians, cyclists, and motorists, is critical. The corridor suffers from capacity constraints, especially with traffic growth from ongoing residential development, leading to congestion and delays. The area is prone to flooding due to increased runoff from wildfire burn scars and undersized culverts, causing safety hazards and frequent road closures. Implementing modern traffic management solutions, expanding ADA-compliant pedestrian and bicycle facilities, and upgrading stormwater infrastructure will mitigate these issues. These roadway improvements will also provide safer pedestrian routes to nearby schools and improved access to essential services and grocery stores for adjacent lower income neighborhoods and the assisted living facility.

The new roadway cross section will include two lanes in each direction separated by a curbed median sixteen feet wide. A five-foot landscaped buffer will be placed outside of curb and gutter, attached with a five-foot directional bike lane and six-foot sidewalk on both sides of the road. The existing pavement will be completed removed and a new full-depth reconstruction will occur. New aggregate base and asphaltic concrete will be placed upon newly compacted subgrade. New signage and striping will be placed in accordance with the MUTCD and ADOT standards. All crosswalks will implement high visibility patterns defined in City of Flagstaff standards. Several utilities will require relocation prior to the start of construction. The City of Flagstaff has prior rights within the limits of the project. New right of way will be required to allow for the new roundabouts. Roadway drainage will be captured in new closed drainage systems and treated per City of Flagstaff LID requirements. The Spruce Avenue Wash crossing at the intersection of Butler Ave and Fourth St will be upgraded to convey current flooding events. A drainage study is being performed to satisfy City of Flagstaff and Army Corps of Engineers requirements. Unclassified excavation (approx. 10,000 CY) and rock excavation (approx. 5,000 CY) are anticipated. Fill material will be required to be imported, requiring approximately 16,000 CY. Guardrail will be reconstructed with some areas fully removed due to new slopes. Left turns will be restricted through the corridor using the raised median and roundabouts. New midblock crossings will incorporate PHBs. Two new roundabouts will help decrease speeds and reduce conflict points. The Butler-Fourth signalized intersection will be replaced with a roundabout. All horizontal alignments and vertical profiles are being designed to AASHTO guidance. The Butler-Fourth intersection will be raised to flatten approaching road profiles.



## **RESOLUTION NO. 2025-11**

A RESOLUTION OF THE FLAGSTAFF CITY COUNCIL, AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION TO THE STATE OF ARIZONA FOR THE ARIZONA STATE MATCH ADVANTAGE FOR RURAL TRANSPORTATION (AZ SMART) FUND FOR THE BUTLER AVENUE AND FOURTH STREET SAFETY AND MULTIMODAL IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT AND AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE UPON AWARD

### RECITALS:

WHEREAS, in Chapter 322 of the Laws of 2022 ("the Act"), the Arizona Legislature established the AZ SMART Fund and program, and authorized the State Transportation Board, among other things, to award grants to Eligible Applicants for design and other engineering services ("DOES"), grant development and submission ("GDS"), and Match for a surface transportation project for which the Applicant will submit a Federal Grant application; and

WHEREAS, ARS §28-399.Q.1 as amended in Chapter 120 of the Laws of 2024 defines "Federal grant" to mean a federal discretionary grant program administered by any federal agency for surface transportation purposes; and

WHEREAS, the AZ SMART Fund Request for Grant Applications and Agreement ("RFGAA") defines "surface transportation purposes to mean a road, bridge, transit or rail infrastructure project, study or plan document that is eligible for a Federal Grant; and

WHEREAS, Applicants for AZ SMART Fund must apply in accordance with the requirements of the Act and the RFGAA; and

WHEREAS, the City of Flagstaff has determined that it will apply to the AZ SMART Fund for match to the US Department of Transportation (USDOT) RAISE GRANT program for the Butler Avenue and Fourth Street Safety and Multimodal Improvements Project (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the City of Flagstaff has applied for and been awarded a U.S. Department of Transportation federal discretionary grant identified in the RFGAA; and

WHEREAS, the RFGAA requires that applications include a resolution from the governing body of the Applicant stating the Project is in the best interests of the residents of the municipality or county in which the Project is or will be located and requires the resolution to state the commitment of Applicant funds, if applicable; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized upon award to accept the Grant Agreement from the AZ SMART Fund and program, authorized by the State Transportation Board.

### **ENACTMENTS:**

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FLAGSTAFF AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: That the City of Flagstaff Project described above is in the best interests of the residents of Flagstaff, Arizona.

SECTION 2: That the City of Flagstaff requests \$3.8 M for match from the AZ SMART Fund.

SECTION 3: That \$3.8 M of cash monies of the City of Flagstaff are committed to the Butler Avenue and Fourth Street Safety and Multimodal Improvements Project.

SECTION 4: That City of Flagstaff has applied for and received an award of the USDOT RAISE Grant identified in the RFGAA.

SECTION 5: That the City of Flagstaff is authorized to submit and sign the RFGAA.

SECTION 6: That the City of Flagstaff is authorized to accept the AZ SMART Fund grant award, if awarded, and the Mayor, City Manager, and City Attorney are authorized to execute the corresponding Grant Agreement and any other documents necessary to facilitate the acceptance of the award.

SECTION 7: Effective Date. This resolution shall be immediately effective upon adoption.



The Yuma County Elimination of Three UPRR Crossings Project will address the safety, mobility, and emergency response challenges caused by three at-grade railroad crossings in Yuma County—Avenue 9E, Fortuna Road, and County 29E. These lack active warning devices or grade separation, creating hazardous conditions for motorists, pedestrians, and bicyclists. These crossings are located in rapidly growing residential and commercial areas, with high volumes of local, agricultural, and military traffic. The existing infrastructure cannot safely accommodate current or future demand. Eliminating these at-grade crossings will reduce collision risk, improve traffic flow, enhance evacuation routes, and support the safe movement of goods and people throughout the region. The Project will develop a Design Concept Report (DCR) to identify solutions for eliminating these crossings and improving public safety, traffic flow, and regional connectivity.

Yuma County has experienced population growth of over 9% in the past decade, increasing demand on its transportation network. Three at-grade railroad crossings are vital connections between residential, commercial, agricultural, and military areas. Union Pacific frequently blocks each crossing train up to 1.5 miles long, often causing 15–30 minute delays. These blockages delay emergency response times and increase the risk of accidents. In 2011, a 15-year-old pedestrian was fatally struck near Avenue 9E while trying to cross during one such delay. Traffic counts and crash data confirm increasing congestion and heightened safety concerns. The area's limited alternate routes and rural emergency access exacerbate the

problem, making a planning-level study essential to guide future grade separations.
