Welcome to a meeting of the Arizona State Transportation Board. The Transportation Board consists of seven private citizen members appointed by the Governor, representing specific transportation districts. Board members are appointed for terms of six years each, with terms expiring on the third Monday in January of the appropriate year.

BOARD AUTHORITY

Although the administration of the Department of Transportation is the responsibility of the director, the Transportation Board has been granted certain policy powers in addition to serving in an advisory capacity to the director. In the area of highways the Transportation Board is responsible for establishing a system of state routes. It determines which routes are accepted into the state system and which state routes are to be improved. The Board has final authority on establishing the opening, relocating, altering, vacating or abandoning any portion of a state route or a state highway. The Transportation Board awards construction contracts and monitors the status of construction projects. With respect to aeronautics the Transportation Board distributes monies appropriated to the Aeronautics Division from the State Aviation Fund for planning, design, development, land acquisition, construction and improvement of publicly-owned airport facilities. The Board also approves airport construction. The Transportation Board has the exclusive authority to issue revenue bonds for financing needed transportation improvements throughout the state. As part of the planning process the Board determines priority planning with respect to transportation facilities and annually adopts the five year construction program.

PUBLIC INPUT

Members of the public may appear before the Transportation Board to be heard on any transportation-related issue. Persons wishing to protest any action taken or contemplated by the Board may appear before this open forum. The Board welcomes citizen involvement, although because of Arizona's open meeting laws, no actions may be taken on items which do not appear on the formal agenda. This does not, however, preclude discussion of other issues. MEETINGS

The Transportation Board typically meets on the third Friday of each month. Meetings are held in locations throughout the state. Due to potential health risks at large public gatherings, the Transportation Board asks that people attending Board meetings in person take safety precautions they feel appropriate to protect themselves and others. In addition, for the time being the Transportation Board will conduct concurrent telephonic/WebEx virtual meetings. In addition to the regular business meetings held each month, the Board may conduct at least one public hearings each year to receive input regarding the proposed five-year construction program. Meeting dates are established for the following year at the December organization meeting of the Board.

BOARD MEETING PROCEDURE

Board members receive the agenda and all backup information one week before the meeting is held. They have studied each item on the agenda and have consulted with Department of Transportation staff when necessary. If no additional facts are presented at the meeting, they often act on matters, particularly routine ones, without further discussion. In order to streamline the meetings the Board has adopted the "consent agenda" format, allowing agenda items to be voted on en masse unless discussion is requested by one of the board members or Department of Transportation staff members.

1	have your attention, let's get the Ridge Road overpass completed
2	as soon as they can get it get the studies completed. The
3	design seems to be completed.
4	So thank you for everything you do. We
5	understand how the sausages are made, and we want you to believe
6	that we are a team player. We're an advocate with you and for
7	you, and that we can get these projects moved forward. Thank
8	you for the work you do, and you all have a great day and a
9	great weekend coming up.
10	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you, Mr. Robertson.
11	Appreciate that.
12	Ms. Tara Dugan, you are up next, with Mr. Ron
13	Angerame on deck. And just a quick reminder that there is a
14	three-minute limit.
15	Bryce, do you see
16	WEBEX HOST: Yeah. Mr. Angerame (inaudible)
17	sorry. I have requested to unmute your line.
18	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: I think we have Ms. Tara
19	Dugan first, Bryce, and Mr. Angerame second. Do you see
20	Ms. Tara Dugan there?
21	WEBEX HOST: I'm still scrolling (inaudible).
22	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Okay. I don't see her
23	either, so let's put her on the box, and we'll go to
24	Mr. Angerame, and then on deck would be Mr. Devin Pitcher.
25	WEBEX HOST: All right. And you are now unmuted,

MR. ANGERAME: Okay. Can everybody hear me?
CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Yes, sir.
MR. ANGERAME: Oh, great. Good morning, study
group, Board Members. Thank you for your time today. My name
is Ron Angerame, and I'm here today as a representative of the
Concerned Citizens of Maricopa.
Our community, our families, our livelihoods
depend on the safe and efficient operation of State Route 347.
For too long, this roadway has been plagued by congestion
delays, and most critically, preventable accidents. The time
for action is now. We understand that funding and planning take
time. However, we're not asking for a miracle. We're asking
for prioritization. We urge you to make State Route 347
expansion and safety improvements a top priority in the five-
year plan. We ask you to allocate the necessary resources to
expedite critical changes, ensuring the safety and well-being of
every Maricopan who travels this road.
Additionally, in the accident reporting that ADOT
publishes, there are the following categories: Accidents
without injury, possible injury accidents, suspected minor
injury accidents, suspected serious injury accidents, and fatal
accidents. There's another category I think we should consider:

24 Unthinkable. It is easy to contemplate this to being actually25 worse than death.
-	10
1	On January 24th, Katrine Enriquez had a
2	devastating crash on State Route 347. Her injuries were
3	substantial. She suffered multiple vertebrae fractures, a
4	broken leg, a broken back, broken ribs, a bucket handle injury
5	that required the removal of 20 inches of her intestines. She
6	also had a lacerated kidney, multiple facial fractures and
7	ongoing pain due to digestive issues resulting from the crash.
8	She has lost 25 pounds and now weighs just 98 pounds. Although
9	she claims she is not suicidal, she wishes she had died instead
10	of living with the constant pain, burdening her family with her
11	care, and facing the crushing debt of \$5 million in medical
12	expenses.
13	Another unthinkable I'd like to bring to ADOT's
14	attention is the fact that we have over 1,000 children who
15	commute daily on State Route 347 to attend school. Both the
16	Kyrene School District and Temple Union High School District
17	serve Maricopa students, with over 600 children commuting via
18	school bus. If something were to happen, this would be another
19	unthinkable tragedy.
20	The need to accelerate the safety and expansion
21	of 347 has never been greater. Today you have the opportunity
22	to save lives, protect families and invest in the future of
23	America. We ask you, how many more accidents, how many more
24	injuries, how many more tragedies will it take before
25	accelerated action is taken? The time to act is now. Let's

1	work together and make 347 safer for everyone. Please include
2	an accelerated State Route 347 in your five-year plan. Thank
3	you.
4	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you very much,
5	Mr. Angerame.
6	Mr. Devin Pitcher, you're up next, with Mr. Luis
7	Pedroza on deck.
8	MR. PITCHER: All right. Good morning. My name
9	is Devin Pitcher, and I am a resident of the wonderful city of
10	Maricopa, which means you already know what I'm going to talk
11	about today: State Route 347. The 347 is the most important
12	road for tens of thousands of residents who live in Maricopa and
13	travel that road every single day. Ask anyone who lives in
14	Maricopa, and they'll tell you how scary it is to travel on that
15	road.
16	In my nearly six years of living in Maricopa, I
17	personally have spent a lot of time on that road, essentially
18	the only road in and out of the city. Do you know what happens
19	when there's an accident? Because I do. Prepare to spend hours
20	trying to get home. The last thing any of us want to do after a
21	long workday is sit in traffic, yet that's a common reality for
22	Maricopans. If the accident is fatal, which, according to the
23	public record, has happened at least 22 times since I moved to
24	Maricopa in 2019, and the road is completely shut down. Can you
25	imagine not being able to get home because you're stuck in miles

of traffic for an unknown amount of time? Maricopans do, and
 for some of those who are involved in these accidents, they
 never get home.

4 For those of you who don't know what makes this 5 road so dangerous, let me ask you a question. Can you imagine 6 having four-way intersections in the middle of the I-10? What 7 about the 101? 202? That would be insane, right? Well, the 8 347, a highway, has four intersections on it, four intersections 9 that might turn yellow while you're cruising down the road at 65 10 miles per hour, where you have to decide, do you slam on the 11 brakes and hope that you don't get rear ended? Do you keep 12 going and risk hitting someone who wanted to get that left-hand 13 turn at the last second. Four intersections where you pray that 14 nobody has run their red and T-boned you.

Maricopans need a free-flowing highway without having to worry about stopping or getting hit from the side at intersections. I think I can speak for all Maricopans when I say that we need your help and desperately ask that you make SR-347 one of your top priorities. Every single day this road puts more lives at risk. Everyone just wants to...

MR. ROEHRICH: Mr. Pitcher, I think you lost your
audio. Bryce, can you hear him?

CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Next up is Mr. Luis Pedroza,

1	with Supervisor Kathleen Gomez on deck.
2	MR. ROEHRICH: Maybe we lost him.
3	MR. PEDROZA: Good morning. Good morning, Madam
4	Chair Daniels, Vice Chair Maxwell and members of the State
5	Transportation Board. For the record, my name is Luis Pedroza,
6	Deputy City Manager representing the City of Douglas.
7	Here today to provide an update on the progress
8	of the two-port solution and the connector road that will
9	service a new port in Douglas. A continued partnership with
10	Cochise County and regional partners, teams keep moving quickly
11	on the design, engineering and construction of the utilities
12	that are needed to service the new port. This includes
13	broadband conduit, electricity, water and wastewater. The
14	contractor for the construction of the port of entry expects to
15	break ground in August of this year.
16	As you have heard me say before, or the city say
17	before, a major component of this project's success is the
18	connector road. We are grateful to ADOT for the continued work
19	on the design concept report and environmental assessment. As
20	we understand it, the final (inaudible) is undergoing internal
21	reviews by ADOT, and once completed, ADOT will transition
22	(inaudible) design.
23	(Inaudible) gap still exists for the completion
24	of this project. Cochise County was recently informed they were
25	not successful in their grant request for 43 and a half million

1 dollars on the INFRA grant process. They are awaiting the 2 debriefing on the grant process to perhaps resubmit for the next 3 site. We're also aware of a pending federal 4 5 appropriation request being advanced by Senator Kelly for \$20 million for this connector road. This is also not 6 7 guaranteed. While in partnership, we continue to pursue ways to 8 fulfill -- I'm sorry -- to fill this funding need. We ask the 9 Board to reconsider any repurpose of funds into your five-year 10 plan or apply any other appropriations that we've secured for 11 the connector road project. If ADOT fulfills this plan and 12 other grant opportunities are also successful, I would think you

14 based on your situation.

13

15 Once again, we want to assure you that we remain 16 committed to the successful completion of the two port solution 17 and the investment of half a billion dollars, making it the 18 largest federal project in the state of Arizona. This has been 19 an effort that has spanned multiple years. I thank you for your continued support, and the City will do its part to ensure that 20 21 the partnership between our city and ADOT remains strong. Thank 22 you.

could, once again, have an opportunity to reshift resources

CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you, Mr. Pedroza.
Moving on now to Supervisor Kathleen Gomez.
MS. GOMEZ: Good morning. Can you hear me now?

1	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: We can.
2	MS. GOMEZ: Okay. Thank you very much. My name
3	is Kathleen Gomez. Thank you very much, Chair Madam Chair
4	and Board Members. This is Kathleen Gomez, newly-elected Board
5	of Supervisors in Cochise County in District 2.
6	I'm a fourth generation native of Douglas. You
7	may have remembered my father was mayor in 2008 to 2012 and was
8	a very big advocate of the port. I want to encourage you to
9	keep this the 2.7 \$27.5 million in your budget over the
10	next five years. You know, our community has been, not just for
11	years, probably 40 years plus, been waiting for this port of
12	entry. It's needed to be able to develop our county, to have
13	economic development, to bring our area back into (inaudible)
14	the golden age when it was.
15	I assure you that having experience on the Hill
16	in D.C., I am going to look everywhere in which I possibly can,
17	outside the box, under rugs, anywhere we can get money to make
18	sure that this connector road gets done, because, as you know,
19	you can't have one of the biggest port of entries, on of the
20	newest, grandest ones operating if we don't have the road that
21	connects it.
22	So I implore you all to please keep this in your
23	five-year plan. I look forward to coming and meeting with all
24	of you. And, you know, my father is 93 years old. He's been
25	looking at this and hearing about this project for probably 40,

1	50 years. I would love to be able to tell him that we're
2	definitely on the path to having this new reality, and for the
3	community, too. We need this port of entry to increase our
4	international trade, to bring economic development, and to give
5	us, Cochise County, opportunity to prosper.
6	So thank you very much for allowing me to speak
7	to you, and I look forward to seeing you and meeting with you
8	next year. Thank you.
9	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you, Supervisor Gomez.
10	And last but not least on my list is
11	Ms. Priscilla Behnke.
12	WEBEX HOST: You are now unmuted.
13	MS. BEHNKE: Hello?
14	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Ms. Behnke?
15	MS. BEHNKE: Yes. Oh, sorry.
16	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: You're good.
17	MS. BEHNKE: All right. My name is Priscilla
18	Behnke. Thank you, Board, for considering my thoughts today.
19	I'm here representing the families that my
20	agency, Be Awesome, serves here in Maricopa. Our families are
21	facing a significant challenge due to the long commutes. 75
22	percent of our commuters or yeah, 75 percent of the city's
23	commuters rely on SR-347 as their primary route, resulting in
24	heavy congestion and extended travel times. These prolonged
25	commutes have far reaching effects on families and broader

	1,
1	community, particularly in the terms of reducing protective
2	factors like parental involvement and neighborhood attachment.
3	Parental involvement is a critical protective
4	factor in preventing youth risk behaviors and fostering positive
5	development. However, parents in Maricopa who return home late
6	after long commutes, often by themselves, with limited time to
7	engage meaningfully with their children. Dinner becomes rushed,
8	homework help is squeezed into a few remaining hours before
9	bedtime, and opportunities for deeper family connections are
10	lost. For some families, even grocery shopping begins at 7:00
11	or 8:00 p.m., further compounding the lack of quality family
12	time. This lack of parental engagement leaves youth
13	unsupervised for extended periods of time, increasing
14	vulnerability and risky behaviors and diminishing the sense of
15	security that strong family connections provide them.
16	In addition to impacting families, long commutes
17	also (indiscernible) neighborhood attachment, another key
18	protective factor. Maricopa's unique infrastructure, including
19	cinder block fences and garage-oriented homes, already present
20	challenges to neighborly interaction. Extended commute times
21	exasperate this issue, leaving residents with little energy or
22	opportunity to connect with their community.
23	Many families retreat into their homes at night,
24	closing their garage doors and unintentionally
25	unintentionally isolating themselves from their neighbors. This

1	lack of social interaction is undermining the sense of belonging
2	and shared responsibility that strengthens neighborhoods and
3	supports our youth development.
4	Investing solutions to reduce congestion on the
5	SR-347 will not only improve commute times, but also create a
6	ripple effect that strengthens families and neighborhoods.
7	Shorter commutes allow parents more time to be present in their
8	children's lives, participate in school and community events,
9	and engage with their neighbors, increasing parental involvement
10	and stronger neighborhood connections, foster a safer, healthier
11	environment for Maricopa's youth, ultimately building a more
12	resilient community. On behalf of the families and parents of
13	Maricopa, I urge you to make the SR-347 your top priority.
14	Thank you.
15	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you, Ms. Behnke.
16	All right. Floyd, I just want to confirm there
17	are no additional requests to speak.
18	MR. ROEHRICH: No, ma'am. There are no other
19	requests to speak. I do want to quick check. I noticed there
20	were four people who just called in to the meeting. So if
21	Ms. Tara Dugan had just called in to the meeting, please use
22	star three on your keypad to raise your hand. I just want to
23	double-check to make sure she isn't just on the phone. So,
24	Ms. Dugan, if you are on the phone, please use star three on
25	your keypad to raise your hand.

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1	And, Madam Chair, I don't see any anything
2	coming up, so I think that is all we have for call to the
3	audience.
4	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you, Floyd.
5	We have one agenda item today. That agenda item
6	is specific to the five-year plan, which is what I think all of
7	us are here for. So we're going to turn the remainder of the
8	time over to Kristine Ward and to Iqbal Hossain for our
9	presentation and also for any dialog with the board members. So
10	we will go ahead and kick it off.
11	MR. ROEHRICH: So, Madam Chair, I am going to use
12	my screen to show the presentations and then share it. So, Dan,
13	I may need you to show that again. Share content. Let's see.
14	We went to the entire screen first.
15	(Inaudible conversation)
16	MR. ROEHRICH: Okay.
17	MS. WARD: Floyd, back up a couple of slides.
18	MR. ROEHRICH: Oh, wait a minute. I started. I
19	was testing
20	MS. WARD: There we go.
21	MR. ROEHRICH: There we go.
22	MS. WARD: I was
23	MR. ROEHRICH: You I have to control it here,
24	so just let me know next slide, please.
25	MS. WARD: No problem.

1	MR. ROEHRICH: Thank you, Dan.
2	MS. WARD: Now it works.
3	All right. Good morning, Madam Chair, Board
4	Members. It's a pleasure to get to talk to you this morning.
5	So we've done this a few times before. This is the point of
6	time in which we define and I present you the financial
7	parameters for the upcoming program, for this tentative program,
8	'26 through '30.
9	What we're going to do is, as we have typically
10	done, we'll review the historicals. Where did we end last year?
11	First we look back. Then we look forward. What do we have as
12	our forecast going forward for the Highway User Revenue Fund?
13	And actually, Floyd, if you could hit the next
14	slide for me, I'd appreciate it.
15	Oh, we'll look at the Highway User Revenue Fund.
16	We'll look at the Regional Area Road Fund. We'll talk about,
17	very briefly, the assumptions that we have made in terms of the
18	federal funds we anticipate coming into the program. We'll talk
19	about our financing, bonding assumptions that are built in the
20	program, and ultimately, we'll get to where we tell you, show
21	you what funding is available for the five-year program.
22	Next slide, please.
23	All right. Well, this shows you where we ended
24	last year. We ended with just over \$1.8 billion collected.
25	That was 3 percent growth over the prior year, and we were a

1	little above forecast. 2 percent above forecast. Not
2	complaining about that.
3	If you can go to the next slide, Floyd.
4	So in terms of the revenue categories that
5	supported flowed in and supported HURF this last year, 2024,
6	45 percent of it, 45 percent of the revenue sources flowing in
7	were associated with fuel tax, and then 32 percent associated
8	with VLT, coming in from VLT.
9	Now, a few of you are going to remember this next
10	slide, and don't again, don't squint. No need to try to read
11	all those numbers. The whole point of this is to kind of show
12	you historically how the composition of HURF revenues has
13	transitioned since the last time the gas tax was raised. Those
14	navy blue bars at the very bottom represent gas tax, and the
15	green bars at the very top represent VLT. And what you're
16	seeing there is since 1991, VLT gas tax has gone to from
17	representing approximately 44 percent of the revenues flowing
18	into HURF, now down to around 30 percent, 30, 31 percent, and
19	VLT, likewise, has been increasing been the increasing
20	category of revenue flowing into HURF, going from approximately
21	14 percent. Now it's up to I can't even I can't read
22	that.
23	MR. ROEHRICH: 34 percent.
24	MS. WARD: 34 percent.
25	So the point being here is, as you are all aware,

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1	you know, with VLT, we have that is indexed for inflation and
2	gas taxes are not, it's a flat tax, and what's happening is we
3	just see an ever-increasing composition coming in from VLT. And
4	then you've got those pesky little alt fuel cars and increased
5	fuel efficiency also leading to this erosion.
6	Next slide, Floyd. I have to get there.
7	So where do we end up in our forecast? What you
8	see here is the result of our RAP panel process, the risk
9	analysis process, and that's where we gather a series of
10	economists and other transportation experts, and we ask them to
11	provide us their estimates on a series of variables that we have
12	found to have a causal relationship to Highway User Revenue,
13	Funds.
14	If you go to the next slide, this is what this
15	is the actual data behind what you just saw, and when the RAP
16	panel got together last year, they said that they estimated that
17	we would experience a 2.8 percent compound growth rate over the
18	period of the previous program. In this year's RAP panel
19	process, they increased that those growth factors to a 3.1
20	percent compound growth rate, and the result of that over that
21	time period is an additional a forecast of an additional
22	\$286 million flowing into the Highway User Revenue Fund that, of
23	course, will then be distributed to all the beneficiaries of the
24	fund.
25	In terms of what this means to the State Highway

1	Fund discretionary that two of that 286 mil, approximately
2	114 million of that goes into the State Highway Fund for the
3	purposes of ADOT's budget, as well as the cap the five-year
4	program.
5	We can go to the next slide.
6	So let's talk about the Regional Area Road Fund.
7	Of course, this is specific for the MAG region, and when we
8	ended last year, we had 751.6 million in revenues. That's
9	that was 4 percent growth over the preceding year, and we were
10	pretty much dead on forecast. So there's not much to say there.
11	When you're only .8 percent off the forecast.
12	You can go to next slide. Oops.
13	Oh, wow. We're speeding through this
14	presentation.
15	MR. ROEHRICH: Wow.
16	MS. WARD: I mean, we are rolling.
17	MR. ROEHRICH: Is this the slide?
18	MS. WARD: One more. Should be a pie chart.
19	MR. ROEHRICH: You sure it's a pie chart?
20	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: There.
21	MR. ROEHRICH: There's the RARF. That's the RARF
22	pie chart.
23	MS. WARD: Okey-doke. All right. Well, you can
24	see the big dog in the room is retail taxes, retail sales taxes,
25	at 54 percent of the revenues flowing in to the Regional Area,

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1	Road Fund. Contracting and restaurant and bar, those are
2	another the next major sources flowing in.
3	But let's go on to the to the next slide.
4	Let's talk about those forecasts. Now, we've got
5	an you know, we've got an interesting situation this year,
6	because we are in the during this program, we will be
7	transitioning from Prop 400 to Prop 479 revenues. So that's why
8	you see this chart looks a little funky, and we got very
9	colorful as we got out our Crayolas for this one, and you can
10	see where the green is. Those green bars represent the
11	forecasts for Prop 400, the remaining duration of Prop 400. It
12	expires at the end of 2025, and then you can see those purple
13	bars pick up. That's where Prop 479 moves forward.
14	Now, while the allocations underneath Prop 479
15	have changed, remember, we're doing these forecasts at the
16	highest level for all of the Regional Area Road Fund, and you
17	let's go to the numbers next, Floyd. That would be very
18	cool. Thank you.
19	So as of the last forecast, when we did this in
20	September '23, we were the panel came back with compound
21	growth rates of about 4.8 percent. They have increased and
22	become more optimistic in this most recent forecast, except in
23	September of 2024. Now, you might say, okay. Hold on. They
24	became more optimistic, and you're about to tell me that that
25	meant that the forecast diminished by 49.5 million over the

	25
1	entirety of the period, and that's because we've got we're
2	growing off of a lower base. So you'll see that 783 in FY '25
3	to the 765 million in the '24 forecast. So, essentially, you
4	know, a \$49 million decrease over the over a five, six-year
5	period is de minimis when you're talking these kind of numbers.
6	If we can go to the next slide.
7	So we've covered the revenue assumptions with
8	regards to the estimates for HURF. We've covered the revenue
9	assumptions that are flowing in for RARF. Now the what I'm
10	presenting to you next is one of the revenue assumptions that
11	we've made in terms of our federal funds, and you'll note that
12	this this chart goes shows you all of IIJA, the hold
13	on. I should I should I should get the acronym, the
14	Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, the long-term
15	authorization from the Federal from Congress that we are
16	currently operating under.
17	Now, that expires at the end of federal fiscal
18	2026, and our program goes beyond the end of federal fiscal year
19	2026. So you might ask, well, what in the heck did you assume
20	in terms of federal revenues going forward? And I will tell you
21	that we assumed flat. We just assumed flat revenues, because we
22	have never gained the wizardry to predict what Congress might
23	do, and that has become even more exciting of late.
24	So what has been built into the program is in
25	FY '26 is the last year of IIJA. Those numbers we assume going

forward and will be the federal funds available, the
 apportionments available to us going forward for the balance of
 the '26 to '30 program.
 Okay. Let's head on to the next slide.

5 So in terms of what was our -- what have been our 6 bonding assumptions? We will be coming to you when we reach the 7 appropriate cash levels, and we will say, dear board members, we 8 are going to -- we are coming to you to request authorization to 9 issue bonds. This is the -- this is what we currently estimate 10 as the bonding needs to support the '26 to '30 program, and 11 these are the bonding levels we foresee during that time. And 12 they, in their total, equate to \$2.5 billion over the entire 13 period.

Now, you will notice that there is one of our credits -- remember, we have three bonding credits. We can issue bonds against our HURF revenues, we can issue bonds against our RARF revenues, and we can issue bonds against federal revenues, and those -- those bonds are -- notes, are referred to GANS, or grant anticipation notes. You might have heard them as GARVEEs for the rest of the country.

So you'll notice that for the Regional Area Road Fund, there's that little TBD. That means we don't know yet because of the transition from 400 to 479. We are working with MAG right now in terms of that whole transition. We have monthly meetings with them to walk through the financial

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1	transitions. In that time between now and the time it goes
2	live, we will work with MAG to find out what their what their
3	programming is to assess what kind of bonding we might want to
4	implement there. So exciting times. You just wait. We'll be
5	coming back to you on that.
6	All right. Next slide.
7	Okay. This should be probably the drum roll
8	slide, if there if there is a drum roll slide in a financial
9	presentation. This is this slide tells you the when you
10	take all of those fund sources, and you compile them together to
11	say what is, in totality, available for the tentative program
12	for this next five-year program, and that's what you see
13	depicted on this screen. And the new fifth year, as we commonly
14	refer to it, which would be 2030, you'll see that we have
15	revenues and financing mechanisms that can support us to a level
16	of a \$1.4 billion program.
17	You might say to me, hold on. Hold on. Why am I
18	seeing a progression down there? We had post-COVID, and we
19	are still we are still living some of the experiences post-
20	COVID we had when we had that delay associated with COVID,
21	we had a buildup of bonding capacity. I have been building that
22	capacity back into the program. You guys don't you guys
23	don't pay me to sit on bonding capacity. So as we have it, you
24	know, our job you know our mission. So here's the money to
25	fulfill that mission, and that includes utilizing all of our

1 bonding capacity to a prudent leve

2	With that, I have to talk about some of the more
3	fun stuff. If you could go to well, I should say the less
4	fun stuff. Those are all forecasts. All that was forecasts,
5	what we estimate to occur, and there are risks to the forecast.
6	We have been in a very it has been a flurry of
7	activity in the department here of late. One of the potential
8	risks to the forecast is executive orders, Congressional action,
9	legislative action, changing economic conditions. Ultimately,
10	with regards to the executive orders, at this point, it's
11	we we've had a lot of activity, but the actual impact has
12	been business as usual. What's to say going forward with
13	Congressional action as we've come into the end of the
14	continuing resolution, we've got a new Congress. That
15	continuing resolution ends on March 14th. We wait to see what
16	comes out of that. We've got the Legislature in session right
17	now. These things are always a mystery. And then you've got
18	the economic conditions that could result from any of the three
19	above. So have to point those lovely little things out.
20	And with that, I'll take any questions you might
21	have.
22	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you, Kristine. I look
23	to the rest of the Board, if you have any comments or questions.
24	Yeah. Ted Maxwell.
25	VICE CHAIRMAN MAXWELL: Thank you, Madam Chair.

1	A great brief, as always, on the financials. I've just got a
2	couple of follow-up questions.
3	You talked about some of the risks, but at the
4	same time that there's risks, do you believe, Kristine, that
5	your flat investment in infrastructure coming from the federals,
6	federal government, could that also possibly be seen as the most
7	conservative action on that front? Because we hope that they'll
8	at least recognize that prices are going up, and so those
9	numbers could go up as well.
10	MS. WARD: Mr Madam Chair, Mr. Maxwell, in
11	my yes. Could there be an upside? Could there be upside?
12	Absolutely. We saw upside, oh, I don't know if you want to call
13	it a risk, but we saw upside movement in the transition from
14	FAST (phonetic) to IIJA. We could most certainly see whatever
15	the next long-term authorization brings us. We could we
16	could see increased we could potentially see increased
17	funding for infrastructure. Like I said, predicting Congress,
18	not my specialty. With regards to well, actually, I think
19	that does that answer your question?
20	VICE CHAIRMAN MAXWELL: That does. It brings up
21	the point that we obviously have to get engaged on the advocacy
22	for the contin hopefully not the continuation, but a new
23	long-term transportation funding bill from Congress. So it's
24	kind of just a call out to anybody listening that we can't just
25	assume good things will happen, but there is potential that they

1	could if we finally get Congress to do the job and fund it not
2	through a continuing continuing resolution or continuing use
3	of (inaudible), because FAST was very rarely do they make the
4	change right when it expires. It takes several years for us to
5	get them to approve something (inaudible).
6	The other question I have, I don't know if it's
7	as much for you, but maybe it would be for Director Toth. We've
8	got a lot of legislation going on, including \$450 million
9	(inaudible) to ADOT for rural projects. None of that's been
10	considered in any of those numbers either; is that correct?
11	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: That's correct.
12	MS. WARD: I didn't hear the question. I'm
13	sorry.
14	MR. ROEHRICH: That is correct.
15	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible) the yeah.
16	MR. ROEHRICH: Yeah.
17	MS. WARD: Oh, yes
18	MR. ROEHRICH: Pending legislation on projects at
19	this point
20	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yes.
21	MR. ROEHRICH: has not been included until we
22	actually have the bill passed.
23	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Right.
24	MS. WARD: Absolutely. So Mr Madam Chair,
25	Mr. Maxwell, when we put these numbers together, we assume the

1	law that is in place.
2	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yeah.
3	MS. WARD: We do not project based on thoughts
4	about law. Until it's until it's enacted, huh-huh. We don't
5	go there.
6	VICE CHAIRMAN MAXWELL: Agree. So that gets to
7	my follow-up question, which may be for the director, is has any
8	of the people in anybody in the Legislature reached out to
9	ADOT at all about the impact of there's several, including
10	one bill that's going to put some more money into it, to the
11	reservations, which would be great, but again, that gets into
12	the BIA and ADOT responsibility. Has there been any outreach
13	from the Legislature or from ADOT to the Legislature?
14	DIRECTOR TOTH: So, Mr Madam Chair,
15	Mr. Maxwell, yes. I mean, we're in constant communication with
16	the Legislature. Amy does a great job of being over there and
17	answering questions and getting us information to look at and
18	analyze and be able to provide input, and so we continue that
19	process. We'll have a full briefing at the board meeting on the
20	21st where Amy can get into more specifics associated with those
21	particular bills.
22	VICE CHAIRMAN MAXWELL: Thank you, Director, and
23	appreciate the breakdown of finances. It's always good to
24	hear good to hear generally.
25	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you, Board Member

1 Maxwell. And I might make a suggestion. Your second-to-last 2 slide, instead of saying risks to the forecast, we might want to 3 change that to say potential impacts to the forecast, just because some could be positive, some could be negative, and risk 4 5 insinuates something negative. 6 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Negative. Yeah. 7 MS. WARD: Absolutely, Madam Chair. That is a --8 I will take that back. That is a really good word choice. I 9 will switch that out. 10 CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: We would like to be 11 optimistic (inaudible) is the word. 12 MS. WARD: Yes, ma'am. 13 CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: (Inaudible.) Mr. Elters? 14 15 MR. ELTERS: Thank you. Thank you, Madam Chair. 16 Kristine -- excuse me. I'm like you, Madam 17 Chair. I was fine until I started talking, and then my voice is going bad. 18 19 It was an excellent presentation, really 20 valuable. So I wish to go back to the slide that has a header 21 of Revenue Categories as a Percentage of HURF. 22 MS. WARD: Oh, that's the --23 MR. ELTERS: And I wish to make -- wish to make a 24 couple points there. And, Madam Chair, and Board Members, 25 colleagues and everyone else, looking at this slide and looking

1	at 1991, the two largest components of the HURF fund are in the
2	blue, which is the gas tax, and the green, the light green,
3	which was the vehicle license tax. Forgive me. I'm looking at
4	1991, the darker blue, which is the gas tax, and the light blue,
5	which is the all other all other revenue adding up to 66
6	percent I'm just adding 44 and 22, which is two-thirds of
7	revenue funds.
8	And then I looked at 2024, the last year
9	reported, with the dark blue being the gas tax broken down to 31
10	percent, and the light blue, which is the all other revenues,
11	broken down to 6 percent, and when you add those two numbers up,
12	they don't even get the 40, compared to the 66 percent back in
13	1991 and 1992 when the gas tax was last increased.
14	You know, my (indiscernible) this is we wonder
15	why we're far behind on keeping up with our needs, and this
16	chart tells an excellent story of where we have been and where
17	we're going to be going. The simply just simple math.
18	If you look at 1992, the last year the gas tax
19	was increased, which is 46 percent of the funds, and you look at
20	'24, which is 31 percent, the difference just in this one
21	category is 15 percent, and when you apply 15 percent to the
22	1.8 billion that Kristine shared with us being the number
23	(inaudible) in '24, that's over 250 million difference just in
24	that one category of the HURF.
25	So I can't help but notice that and, you know,

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1	think about it, and really just probably tie it to the comments
2	that we heard from the presenters earlier, which is I
3	honestly, listening to every presenter and the compelling
4	stories of stories and perspectives that they've provided, I
5	would just encourage them to make the same presentation with the
6	same passion and tell the stories to the Legislature, because
7	that is where the decision-making process lies.
8	I appreciate the opportunity to share those
9	thoughts with you. Thank you very much.
10	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you, Mr. Elters.
11	Anything from Board Member Searle or Board Member
12	Peshlakai?
13	MR. SEARLE: Nothing here. Thank you.
14	Madam Chair, can I ask one follow-up?
15	(Inaudible.)
16	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Please.
17	VICE CHAIRMAN MAXWELL: It's something I had not
18	noticed on that slide. It's an incredibly good, compelling
19	story slide, is the significant reduction in other revenue.
20	Kristine, can you give us a little insight? What were those
21	revenues, and why have they they've shrunk almost by 75
22	percent. What were those other revenues, and are they no longer
23	in place, or are they no longer (inaudible)?
24	MS. WARD: Madam Chair, Mr. Maxwell, there
25	were we tried to normalize, normalize this chart for all the

1	statutory changes over time, but there were statutory changes
2	back in those early years, '91 through, like, the '96 where
3	there was a transition between between the and, I think it
4	was associated with weight, distance taxes. And so they
5	transitioned from revenues transitioned from one category to
6	another, and so that's what you're seeing in that transition
7	between and it rolls between the other and use and
8	registration. I can get you the specifics on it, but they are
9	not in my brain at this moment.
10	VICE CHAIRMAN MAXWELL: So is it clear to say
11	that we're still collecting those other revenues, we've just
12	categorized them?
13	MS. WARD: Correct.
14	VICE CHAIRMAN MAXWELL: Okay. Thank you. That
15	answers that question. I appreciate it. Thank you, Madam
16	Chair.
17	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you, Board Member
18	Maxwell.
19	Board Member Peshlakai, did you want to add
20	anything to today's discussion on the financials? I know we
21	have another presentation as well.
22	Okay. We will move on then. Thank you,
23	Kristine, again, for that information, and we'll keep all that
24	in mind as we look to the prioritization of the five-year plan.
25	MS. WARD: Thank you.

1 CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: We're going now to 2 Mr. Hossain? Floyd? MR. ROEHRICH: Yes, ma'am. I'm just getting the 3 presentation set up. So --4 5 CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Okay. (Inaudible.) 6 MR. ROEHRICH: -- I think we're ready to go, 7 Iqbal, when you are. 8 MR. HOSSAIN: Thank you, Floyd. 9 So good morning, Madam Chair, and the members of 10 the Board. I hope you are all doing well this morning. My name 11 is Iqbal Hossain, the deputy director of the Multimodal Planning 12 Division. 13 Today, I'll be providing an overview of the 14 tentative 2026 to 2030 five-year program. 15 Next slide, please. 16 We'll start with a quick reminder of where we are 17 in the process of developing the five-year program. The five-18 year program takes 15 months. Before the Board has even 19 approved the 2026 to 2030 program, we will have already started 20 on the 2027 to 2031 program. At this point, the Board is 21 reviewing the tentative program, and we are hopeful it will be 22 approved later in this month's meeting so that it can be released for public comment. 23 As we discussed, the 2026 to 2030 tentative 24 program today, please note that while the Board and the public 25

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1	are reviewing the projects, the design activities continue to
2	progress. In addition, the changes in material costs, economic
3	conditions, or other factors may impact budgets and schedule.
4	As you are aware that this year we are programming a high dollar
5	value, but project costs have increased significantly compared
6	to previous years due to rising material cost, inflation,
7	economic conditions, or available funding accomplishes less than
8	before.
9	Next slide, please.
10	The next few slides help to establish the context
11	in which the five-year program is developed. I will begin with
12	an overview of the Long Range Long Range Transportation Plan
13	and how it impacts the five-year program.
14	You may recall the Long Range Transportation Plan
15	included a recommended investment choice, which the Board
16	adopted in October 2023. The recommended investment choice, or
17	rate, established a goal to invest 78 percent of the available
18	funding in preservation, 15 percent in modernization, and 7
19	percent in expansion. The goals are factored into the planning
20	to programming process, which we use to identify projects to
21	improve in the five-year program.
22	Next slide, please, Floyd.
23	Next, as we do every year, we will review the
24	condition of our bridges and pavements, each weighted as good,
25	fair and poor. On the left side of the slide, you can see the

1	bridge rate definitions: Good, fair, poor. And bridges rated
2	as poor does not mean these bridges are unsafe. ADOT closes any
3	unsafe bridges. On the right side, we have the definitions of
4	the pavement rating.
5	Next slide, please.
6	We have combined all of the charts we used to
7	show you individually in a single slide, because it allows you
8	to see the impact of the overall system at once. This is all
9	2023 data, which is the most recent available.
10	Let's start with chart number one in the upper
11	left corner is our bridge condition. As you can see, our
12	bridges are doing pretty well, with 66 percent in good
13	condition. This is actually a 1 percent improvement over last
14	year. 34 percent in fair condition, and only less than 1
15	percent are in poor condition.
16	Over to chart number two, looking at the
17	interstates, 53.3 percent of our interstate pavement is in good
18	condition, an increase of 1.9 percent over last year. 44
19	percent is in fair condition, and 2.3 percent in poor. The poor
20	condition pavement increased by .8 percent over last year.
21	In chart three, in the upper right corner, it
22	shows the non-interstate routes on the National Highway System,
23	which include US and the more significant state routes. 32
24	percent in good condition, an increase of .5 percent over last
25	year. 61.9 percent are in fair condition, and 6.1 percent in

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1	poor, an increase of 1.6 percent over last year. The trend here
2	shows a significantly steeper decline compared to the
3	interstates.
4	Finally, chart number four in the lower right
5	corner shows the routes of the National Highway System. We are
6	seeing a sharper drop in condition, with just 16.1 percent rated
7	as good, which is 1.1 percent lower than last year. 73.8
8	percent are fair, and 10.1 percent are poor, a 1.2 percent
9	over a 1.2 percent increase over last year. Between these
10	two assets, pavement condition is clearly our top priority.
11	I would like to explain the declines shown in
12	chart two through four in 2017. The data collection methodology
13	changed that year at the federal level, prompting ADOT to also
14	change our processes. The new process is more accurate and also
15	covers the entire state highway system, as opposed to the
16	representative sampling used prior to 2017.
17	Next slide, please.
18	Moving now to the funding available for the 2026
19	to 2035 year program. The chart left in the left shows the
20	total amount available by year for the five-year program, with
21	the large numbers, the top of each column, a total of 7.68
22	billion available over the first over the five years. Most
23	of the funding is used on the ADOT system, with the exception of
24	about \$100 million annually used for local and other competitive
25	programs, which we will see in a future slide.

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1	The pie chart on the right side shows the
2	regional allocation of this funding. 50 percent is allocated
3	for Greater Arizona and is programmed by Board, as shown in the
4	blue and both blue on both charts. The total allocated to
5	Greater Arizona over the five years is 4.47 billion. In the
6	green we see another 37 percent is allocated to Maricopa County
7	and is programmed primarily by MAG. The five-year total is
8	\$2.38 billion. Finally, 13 percent is allocated to Pima County,
9	as shown in orange, and is programmed primarily by PAC. The
10	Pima allocation is \$831 million over the five years. Please
11	keep in mind that these funds do not account for legislative
12	appropriations, federal earmarks, grants, or other funding from
13	external sources.
14	Next slide, please, Floyd.
15	Then we'll take a look at each region, starting
16	with the Greater Arizona. As noted earlier, the total 50
17	percent allocation for the period 2026 through 2030 is
18	\$4.47 billion. These funds are programmed by the Board and are
19	primarily dedicated to the 13 counties outside of Maricopa and
20	Pima Counties. The uses of these funds cover two systems.
21	Number one is projects on the state highway system, and number
22	two is competitively awarded projects on local and other
23	systems.
24	For clarification, while the statutory
25	prioritization of construction projects is required, it does not

1	appear in the tentative program. It will be included in the
2	final version approved by the Board in June after public
3	comments have been received and the program has been finalized.
4	Next slide, please, Floyd.
5	This slide shows how the 4.47 billion for Greater
6	Arizona breaks down by year, by primary RIC category,
7	recommended investment choice category, and by the system on
8	which the funding is used.
9	Chart number one in the upper left corner shows
10	the breakout of the total 4.47 billion between preservation,
11	expansion, modernization, and planning and project development.
12	Chart number two in the middle shows the breakout
13	of 4.47 billion based on the RIC categories of expansion,
14	modernization, and preservation.
15	Chart number three, the upper right corner,
16	compares the RIC of 78 percent preservation, 15 percent
17	modernization, and 7 percent expansion, with the last year and
18	this year tentative programs.
19	We'll move on to chart number four in the lower
20	left shows the funding used on the state highway system. The
21	red line designates the amount of funding dedicated to
22	preservation, which is 466 million annually. This consists of
23	\$390 million for pavement rehabilitation, 16 million for
24	pavement preservation, and 60 million for bridges.
25	Finally, chart number five, it shows the amounts

1	used for local and other systems from competitive subprograms
2	such as off-system bridges, transportation alternatives, and
3	Highway Safety Improvement Program.
4	Next slide, please, Floyd.
5	This slide shows the expansion projects which
6	will begin or be underway in 2026 totaling \$334 million. Of
7	this amount, 800 \$182 million I repeat, on this amount,
8	\$182 million is coming from the Greater Arizona 50 percent
9	allocation, and the rest from federal grants, private
10	developers, appropriations or other sources.
11	To highlight a few of the 2026 expansion
12	projects, Lion Springs on SR-260, \$110 million over a three-year
13	period, 2026 being the first year. Vista Royale on US-93,
14	\$68 million, with a \$26 million INFRA grant. And the Colorado
15	Bridge replacement on I-10 at the California border.
16	Next slide, please, Floyd.
17	In 2027, expansion projects total \$190 million,
18	of which 187 million is funded by the 50 percent allocation, and
19	remainder from a legislative appropriation.
20	To highlight a few of the 2027 projects, first
21	one is the second year of construction on Lion Springs on 260,
22	the Big Jim Wash widening projects on project on US-93, two
23	projects on I-17. Design will begin for the number one grant
24	expansion project this year, which is widening I-17 from Sunset
25	Point to SR-69. We also have another \$52 million for the road

1	and facility projects related to the new Douglas port of entry.
2	Next slide, please. Thank you.
3	Moving on to 2028, there are three expansion
4	projects. We anticipate finishing construction of the SR-260,
5	Lion Springs and Big Jim Wash projects, and will begin design on
6	the northbound widening, I-17 from Milepost 298 to 314. This is
7	number two ranked expansion project in the P2P list.
8	Next slide, please.
9	In 2029, there are two expansion projects. We'll
10	begin design on the number three grant expansion project, which
11	is a widening on I-40, from I-17 to Country Club. And this year
12	of the first year of construction on I-17, widening from
13	Sunset Point to SR-69. This one ranked number one in P2P
14	expansion list, as I mentioned earlier.
15	Next slide. Thank you.
16	Finally, in 2030, there are also two projects.
17	First one, the completion of the widening on I-17, and the next
18	one is design on the number four grant project, which is the
19	southbound widening on I-17 from Milepost 298 to 314.
20	Next slide. Thank you, Floyd.
21	Now we will take a look, a quick look at each
22	board district. Before I begin, I would like to draw your
23	attention to the revised summary page for which district each
24	district that Floyd sent you earlier this week, due to some
25	coding issue that we recently fixed in our system, we the

1	investment category of some of the projects have changed, but
2	the projects and the program amount did not change.
3	This slide shows the distribution of the projects
4	programmed from the 50 percent allocation in the 2026 to 2030
5	program. As you can see from the pie chart, a small amount of
6	funding is programmed in Maricopa and Pima Counties. The 37
7	percent Maricopa and 13 percent Pima allocations are not
8	included in this data. The Maricopa and Pima County sections of
9	the tentative program contains these projects.
10	The table the table on the bottom, shows the
11	amount programmed by year in each district. The large
12	percent percentages in Districts 5 and 6 are related to
13	multiple widening, bridge and pavement rehab projects.
14	Next slide, please, Floyd.
15	Before we go over the projects by district, I
16	would like to remind you that we have created a tentative
17	program map dashboard to help the Board. You can filter it by
18	county, board district or other geographic options. It displays
19	the project maps, descriptions, and details of the of the
20	years, funding amounts and funding types.
21	This slide and the next couple of slides
22	summarize funding and projects by district, yearly breakdown,
23	funding by year, project categories such as preservation,
24	modernization, and expansion. Tables at the bottom shows
25	project distribution and funding allocations.

1	In District 1, you can see there are 16 projects
2	total over the five-year period, totaling \$123 million. Most of
3	the funding in District 1 is programmed for preservation
4	projects, including US-60, from 85th Avenue to I-10, and a
5	bridge replacement project on I-8.
6	In modernization, there are numerous projects in
7	District 1. Namely, a truck parking project at the Burnt Well
8	Rest Area on I-10, some ITS projects on US-60 and I-10, and also
9	several ramp metering projects.
10	For the expansion category, there are two
11	projects. The I-10 widening from the Gila River Bridge to Gas
12	Plant Road and SR-85 widening from Maricopa Road to northeast of
13	Gila Bend.
14	Next slide, please, Floyd.
15	In District 2, you can see there are also 16
16	projects total over the five-year period, totaling \$47 million.
17	There are several preservation projects programmed a at a
18	total \$32 million, and include SR-85 and two off-system bridge
19	preservation projects.
20	Modernization projects total \$14 million and
21	include 11 safety projects in the city of Tucson and two safety
22	projects in Pima County.
23	Expansion projects in District 2 are also shown
24	in Pima County section of the program, which we'll review in a
25	later slide.
1	Next slide, please, Floyd.
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2	In District 3, there are 27 total projects
3	programmed for \$209 million. This includes 20 preservation
4	projects for \$135 million on I-19, B, I-10 SR-82, five bridge
5	rehab projects, and the replacement of the San Pedro River
6	Bridge.
7	There are three modernization projects that are
8	both related to the new Douglas port of entry, including \$42.5
9	million for the facility and \$20 million for the construction of
10	the new connector road between US Border and SR-60.
11	Next slide, please, Floyd.
12	District 4 has 20 projects totaling \$229 million.
13	Out of this, there are ten pavement preservation projects
14	covering US-60, US-70, and SR-347. There are several bridge
15	rehab projects for the district as well.
16	There are a number of modernization projects,
17	including passing lane construction on SR-79 and US-191, roadway
18	lighting installation on US-70, and two local safety projects in
19	Pinal County and Casa Grande.
20	The only expansion project in this district is
21	the Lion Springs widening on SR-260, expanding it to four lanes
22	from Milepost 256 to Milepost 261.
23	MR. ROEHRICH: Iqbal, can you hold up a second?
24	Madam Chair, I see that Mr. Searle has raised his
25	hand. Mr. Searle, are you wanting to make a state a comment

1 or something at this point? 2 MR. SEARLE: My question, Ms. Daniels, is when would you like to take questions and comments on our specific 3 districts? Do you want to wait until after the presentation or 4 do you want to do it during? 5 CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: I think we should wait until 6 7 the end, if that's okay. (Inaudible.) 8 MR. SEARLE: Just a clarification. Thank you. 9 CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Appreciate it. 10 MR. HOSSAIN: Floyd, next slide, please. 11 Moving on to District 5, there are 53 projects programmed, for a total of \$654 million. 566 million of this 12 13 comes in the form of 34 pavement preservation projects, which 14 include four pavement rehab projects on I-40. These projects 15 will include a total of 38 miles on I-40. Other projects on 16 US-160 and SR-260, these are -- there are 13 bridge rehab and 17 replacement projects in District 5. 18 There are 50 modernization projects, including 19 truck parking at the Meteor Crater rest area on I-40, scales at Page and Sanders port of entry, ITS projects on SR-260 and I-40. 20 21 There are three design projects totaling \$57 22 million, all related to the north and southbound expansion of 23 I-17 and I-40. 24 Next slide, please, Floyd. 25 CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: I think we have a glitch.

1	Can we go back to District 5 and restate it? Anybody else feel
2	the glitch or just me?
3	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible.)
4	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Okay. Yeah. Let's go back
5	to 5.
6	MR. HOSSAIN: 5?
7	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: District 5. If you could
8	just reiterate. I think everybody broke up for a minute.
9	MR. HOSSAIN: Oh, sorry. Okay. Sure.
10	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: You're okay.
11	MR. HOSSAIN: Sure.
12	So about District 5, there are 53 projects
13	programmed for a total of \$654 million. 566 million of this
14	comes in the form of 34 preservation projects, which include
15	four pavement rehab projects on I-40. These projects will
16	improve a total of 38 miles on I-40. Other projects on US-160
17	and SR-260. There are also 13 bridge rehab or replacement
18	projects in District 5.
19	There are 15 modernization projects, including,
20	truck parking at the Meteor Crater rest area on I-40, scales at
21	the Page and Sanders port of entry, ITS, intelligent
22	transportation system, projects on SR-260 and I-40. And also,
23	there are three design projects, 57 \$57 million all related
24	to the north and southbound expansion of I-17 and I-40.
25	Next slide, please, Floyd.

1	Move on to District 6, last but not the least.
2	In District 6, there are a total of 55 projects programmed, for
3	a total of \$981 million. To highlight some of the preservation
4	projects, which include projects on I 40, I-10 and US-93. Also
5	includes several pavement rehab projects in La Paz County,
6	Mohave, Yavapai and Yuma Counties.
7	There are five bridge rehab or replacement
8	projects in District 6, including the Colorado River bridge we
9	have on (inaudible) and Santa Maria River bridge on 96.
10	There are 27 there are 27 modernization
11	projects in District 5, including scales and inspection place
12	projects at the (inaudible) and Yuma port of entry, several
13	safety projects on Routes 8, 89, 89A, 93 and 95 for signs and
14	other safety improvements.
15	There are also 13 local safety projects,
16	including the signals, bike and pedestrian, and intersection
17	improvements project. The expansion projects are primarily on
18	the widenings on I-17 and US-93, including \$190 million project
19	on I-17, from Sunset Point to SR-69, Big Jim Wash and Vista
20	Royale on US-93 totaling \$178 million.
21	Next slide, please, Floyd.
22	As I mentioned earlier, we have developed a
23	tentative program map dashboard to assist the Board in reviewing
24	the projects. This dashboard can be filtered by county, board
25	district or other geographical options. It includes project

1	maps and descriptions and shows the years, amounts and type of
2	funding anticipated to be used for each project. We'll also
3	make this available to the public during the public comment
4	period.
5	Next slide, please, Floyd.
6	Moving on to Maricopa County. The 37 percent
7	funding allocated to Maricopa County, which is programmed
8	primarily by MAG. Over the five years, Maricopa County will
9	receive \$2.3 billion to program on ADOT routes. With the
10	passage of Proposition 479, MAG is now working through updating
11	project schedules and costs. We have not included any projects
12	in this presentation, except the status of I-10 widening on the
13	next slide. We expect to have better information later this
14	summer on these projects.
15	Thank you.
16	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (inaudible), please.
17	MR. HOSSAIN: Yes. Thank you.
18	Okay. This slide highlights four active projects
19	related to the I-10 widening in Maricopa and Pinal Counties.
20	The first one is Loop 202 to Gila River Bridge. The procurement
21	activities are ongoing. Number two, Gila River Bridge
22	construction is underway, with completion expected by summer
23	2026. Number the number three project is Gila River Bridge
24	to Gas Line Road project. The bid advertisement is planned for
25	March 2026. And finally, the fourth project is Gas Line Road to

1	SR-387, scheduled for bid advertisement in early April this
2	year.
3	Next slide, please.
4	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (inaudible), please.
5	MR. HOSSAIN: Thank you.
6	The next is Pima County. The 13 percent
7	allocated to Pima County and is programmed primarily by PAG.
8	Over the five years, Pima County will receive \$831 million for
9	ADOT routes. Pima County also has a dedicated tax for
10	transportation projects. The projects in the next slide include
11	both the 13 percent allocation plus other funding.
12	Next slide, please, Floyd.
13	MR. ROEHRICH: Is that the right slide?
14	MR. HOSSAIN: Got it. Yeah.
15	MR. ROEHRICH: Okay.
16	MR. HOSSAIN: Thank you.
17	And we'll start with the widening of I-10 from
18	Country Club to Kino. As you know, at \$600 million, this is the
19	largest project we have undertaken in southern Arizona. In
20	addition to widening three miles of the interstate, we are
21	reconstructing the Kino TI, adding a new TI at Country Club, and
22	making other improvements. The project will be under
23	construction from 2025 through 2028.
24	Next slide, please, Floyd.
25	This map shows the locations of additional PAG

1	projects currently programmed. In addition to the widening from
2	Country Club to Kino, there are three more projects on I-10,
3	such as Alvernon Way, Park Avenue TI, and Sixth Avenue TI.
4	Also, there are two projects on I-19, such as Valencia to I-10
5	and Irvington TI. Finally, a new wildlife crossing will be
6	constructed on SR-86.
7	Next slide, please, Floyd.
8	Moving on to the airport program. We are
9	anticipating \$135 million over the five-year period. The
10	projects have not yet the projects have yet to be identified,
11	as the Federal Aviation Administration does this work in April
12	each year. As a result, the projects will appear in our final
13	program after these were received from the Federal Aviation.
14	Next slide.
15	As part of our Airport Capital Improvement
16	Program, this slide displays the five programs and associated
17	programmed amount. First, we have the FAA match program. This
18	program provides half of the sponsored share for an FAA Airport
19	Improvement Program grant.
20	The next is the State-Funded Development Grant
21	Program. This grant supports a wide range of initiatives,
22	including design, construction, safety improvements, capacity
23	enhancements, construction, safety improvements, and land
24	minor land acquisitions.
25	Then we come no, the previous slide. Thank

1	you.
2	Then we come to Airport Pavement Maintenance
3	Systems Program. Under this program, ADOT aeronautics manages
4	the construction administration for major pavement maintenance
5	projects, while the sponsor is responsible only 10 percent of
6	the construction cost.
7	Following that, the Grand Canyon National Park
8	Airport Program provides grants specifically for that facility,
9	operating as a component of the State-Funded Development
10	Program.
11	Lastly, we have ADOT Airport Development Funding,
12	which is dedicated to conducting statewide system studies and
13	executing various projects.
14	Next.
15	Now I would like to transition our focus to
16	SR-347. We know the Board and the public are interested in this
17	project, so we have prepared some information for the Board.
18	The table on this slide shows the top nine
19	ranking projects from 2024 P2P process. The projects are in
20	order by ranking as shown in their 2024 stated statewide rank
21	column. Generally, the highest-ranking projects are programmed
22	to the extent funding is available. The green highlighted
23	indicates the projects proposed in the tentative. As you can
24	see, the 347 project ranked number nine, and the total
25	construction estimate is \$235 million, comprising the Maricopa

1	segment, 90 million, plus Pinal segment, \$145 million.
2	Next slide, please, Floyd.
3	The 347 project involves two counties and two
4	programs. The Maricopa segment is currently programmed for
5	90 \$90 million in MAG's 2031 to 2035 program. The Pima
6	County section is currently estimated at 145 million, and
7	funding has not been identified. The earliest the project will
8	be ready is in 2027.
9	The amount available in expansion funding after
10	the green highlighted projects on the previous slide where
11	funded is \$103 million. This \$103 million is available over the
12	entire five-year period. Usually, this funding would be
13	reserved to fund cost increases for already programmed expansion
14	projects.
15	Now, at 145 million, the Pinal County segment
16	needs an additional \$42 million to complete its design and
17	construction.
18	Now, this is the funding situation of the SR-347
19	widening project. As you know, the State Transportation Board
20	has ultimate authority to select projects from programming in
21	the five-year program after considering public input. The Board
22	has the authority to amend the five-year program at any time.
23	Next slide, please. Floyd.
24	The next step. After two days of study session
25	on the tentative program, the next step is on February 21st,

	55
1	2025, the Board expected to approve tentative program to be
2	released for public comment. March 3rd through May 23rd, public
3	comment, we'll be receiving. May 16, public hearing. June 5th,
4	Board study session on final program. And finally, June 20th,
5	Board expected to approve the final program.
6	The next slide.
7	Discussion. This concludes my presentation.
8	I'll be happy to answer any questions you may have. Thank you.
9	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you. I'm sure there
10	are a lot of questions from board members, so maybe we go in
11	opposite order. Maybe Board Member Searle, we'll have you go
12	first.
13	MR. SEARLE: Well, I appreciate it. You can go
14	by district, if you want to, District 1, 2, 3. I'm sure we all
15	have comments.
16	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: I'll start with you, Board
17	Member Searle. I'll save District 1 for last.
18	MR. SEARLE: Okay. Well, Iqbal, if you'd like to
19	go back to your slide on District 3, if you would, please.
20	First of all, I would like to comment on the
21	James Ranch Road/US border project, which is the connector road.
22	Right now it's scheduled for right-of-way in fiscal year '26 and
23	construction
24	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Board Member Searle,
25	reference the page number for the book.

1	MR. SEARLE: It's page 81.
2	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you.
3	MR. SEARLE: And I guess the comment I'd like to
4	make is the right-of-way on that, the County and the City are
5	prepared to (inaudible) the right-of-way the minute the DCR is
6	complete, which I believe is next month, and since it's going to
7	be local funds, I don't know that it's critical, but what
8	year that it's shown in. The question that we've got,
9	construction in 2027 for the road. We still don't have it 100
10	percent funded. There's some issues. So I am going to ask that
11	we delay the US-91 Cochise railroad overpass project, which is
12	in the plan to be done this year, in 2025. I would like to
13	delay that to 2027, so if any funding shortfall from the James
14	Ranch Road project is needed that we can possibly use some of
15	that Cochise overpass funding.
16	The overpass is structurally sound. The problem
17	with it is its width. We really haven't had any accidents on
18	that, and as a priority, I believe the James Ranch Road
19	connector road should be a higher priority than the overpass.
20	If we could delay the overpass to 2027 just to be able to use
21	that as a cushion, if necessary, for the connector road would be
22	a request that I have.
23	The a question on the truck inspection
24	facility that is scheduled to go in at the new port. I see
25	that's scheduled for 10 million for the next fiscal year, and 30

1	million for 2027. My question is: What are we going to do with
2	the truck facility that is currently at 191 and Highway 80?
3	Because we're going to have (inaudible) duplicate facilities
4	there, if I'm not mistaken.
5	MR. ROEHRICH: So, Madam Chair, Mr. Searle, this
6	is Floyd. What we're doing with the second need is we're trying
7	to capture the international traffic that comes over, which will
8	be separate from the local traffic. So there will still need
9	be a need for the existing port in order to capture that local
10	traffic. Otherwise, we have to route everybody through a
11	congested area. So with the expected volume and the
12	infrastructure going in, their second port was the second
13	inspection station was needed in order for operations.
14	MR. SEARLE: Understood, Floyd, but what you're
15	going to have when you open up that second port, 90 percent of
16	the commercial traffic is going to be coming up to this from
17	the to the new port, through that new facility. I just I
18	was just wondering if discussion or the analysis of the need of
19	that other one at the 191 and 80 is going to be needed.
20	MR. ROEHRICH: So, Madam Chair, Mr. Searle, yes.
21	Our enforcement folks have looked at that, and that's why they
22	had recommended that option. We can ask them to put together a
23	little summary of the reasoning and justification.
24	MR. SEARLE: All right. Sounds good. And
25	just just a comment. I appreciate the three projects on

1	I-10. I would like to I'm disappointed that we don't have
2	more in there, because that second project that I believe goes
3	to well, let me get this it would be, Ms. Daniels,
4	page 29.
5	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you.
6	MR. SEARLE: Where that project ends at
7	Milemarker 356, they're really (inaudible) all the way to the
8	community of Bowie, I'm a little disappointed that it's not in
9	the plan to continue, but I am glad that we do have the three
10	segments.
11	And, Mr. Maxwell, you don't need any help, but I
12	will I will throw the issue that I-10 between (inaudible)
13	Road and State Highway 83 really needs to be done in District 1
14	and District 2 as well. That condition is rapidly going down
15	there. Those are my comments.
16	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you, Board Member
17	Searle.
18	What I'm hearing from Board Member Searle, that
19	he's interested in seeing some different prioritization and
20	maybe consolidation of some projects. Who from the ADOT team
21	will be getting back to Board Member Searle on whether that's a
22	possibility or not?
23	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (Inaudible.)
24	DIRECTOR TOTH: Yeah. Chairman Daniels, we'll
25	take a look at it, and generally what we do is we move forward

1	with the tentative program, and as the public comments come in,	
2	then we'll present all, you know, the options at the board study	
3	session in June so that you can make those decisions	
4	accordingly, but we can provide some additional analysis	
5	specifically to Board Member Searle.	
6	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Yeah. I like the fact that	
7	they're willing to come to the table with other projects to	
8	reprioritize from our funding standpoint. He didn't just get on	
9	here and say	
10	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Right.	
11	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: I just want more money or	
12	more projects in my district, so I appreciate that. So yeah,	
13	whatever we can do between now and then to study it and then	
14	(inaudible). Thank you.	
15	Board Member Peshlakai, would you like to weigh	
16	in on any of the projects in your district?	
17	MR. ROEHRICH: Ms. Peshla	
18	MS. PESHLAKAI: I have nothing to add or no	
19	questions. Thank you.	
20	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you so much.	
21	All right. Board Member Elters?	
22	MR. ELTERS: Thank you, Madam Chair.	
23	I have just a couple of questions. The first one	
24	pertains to US-95 (inaudible), and I don't really intend	
25	(inaudible). I just have a question on that pertaining to the	

1	(inaudible) this corridor has been under studies and (inaudible)
2	but it's not complete, and there is (inaudible) for on that
3	plan, one segment known as Imperial Dam Road to Aberdeen Road.
4	This project is slated to be delivered through a
5	design-build construction method. The budget the need for
6	the project cost of the project is about six 76, and
7	there's currently about half that amount committed, and the
8	majority of it, which is about 33 million, is legislative
9	appropriation, but there is a gap between what's available,
10	which is 37, and what's needed, which is 76 million.
11	So my question is, what is the plan for this, and
12	is there a limitation (inaudible) amount? Is there a risk of
13	that being lost? If this project does not move forward, what
14	opportunities do we have to move it forward? That would be my
15	first question, and I have one other question (inaudible).
16	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Director Toth, (inaudible)?
17	DIRECTOR TOTH: Chairman Daniels, for specifics
18	on those projects, I'm going to have to get back to Mr. Elters,
19	because we don't have the I don't specifically have the
20	details on that particular project.
21	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Okay.
22	MR. HOSSAIN: So on this, yes, I will get back to
23	Board Member Searle and
24	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Board Member Elters, are you
25	referencing a certain page within our booklet?

1	MR. ELTERS: No. Madam Chair, I do not see it in	
2	the book. That's why I did not reference the page.	
3	(Inaudible.)	
4	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Okay. (Inaudible.)	
5	And your next follow-up question?	
6	MR. ELTERS: And yeah. That's (inaudible)	
7	Director Toth and staff will have to follow up, and that's fine.	
8	Thank you.	
9	I have a question related to again, related to	
10	the I-17 corridor within District 6, (inaudible) the book, but	
11	(inaudible) related to I-17, specifically from the Sunset Point	
12	rest area to the junction of I-17 and SR-69. What I did see	
13	were a pavement preservation project for that segment and	
14	(inaudible) funding and design had a third lane and discretion	
15	for that segment.	
16	But I guess my question may be even more	
17	operational than otherwise, but I'll ask it anyway. Is there	
18	what is the thought process behind that? Does the pavement	
19	condition require that? Does the pavement preservation happen	
20	before the widening or can those be combined to recognize some	
21	savings by combining (inaudible). That's really my other	
22	question. Thank you, Madam Chair.	
23	DIRECTOR TOTH: Mr. Elters, you may recall Iqbal	
24	mentioned some coding errors, and that is one of them that is an	
25	expansion project, as opposed to (inaudible).	

1	MR. ELTERS: Fair enough. I trust at some point	
2	between now and the between now and June when they when	
3	their recommendation for the final are presented, we'll probably	
4	have that corrected, and we will see. So thank you.	
5	That's all I have, Madam Chair. Thank you.	
6	DIRECTOR TOTH: Yes, sir. It's actually already	
7	been corrected, and the version that goes out of the	
8	tentative that goes out for public comment will have the	
9	correct coding on it.	
10	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Do you know what page we're	
11	on for that project?	
12	DIRECTOR TOTH: It's page 33, Madam Chair.	
13	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: I can't decide if it would	
14	be better to have these organized by district.	
15	DIRECTOR TOTH: In case there are any members	
16	that are not aware, the five-year program is ordered is in	
17	the order of routes.	
18	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Right.	
19	MR. SEARLE: And just for the record, it took me	
20	three years to figure that one out.	
21	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: It's not intuitive at first,	
22	until you're flipping through fast, and then it's like one of	
23	those (inaudible).	
24	DIRECTOR TOTH: Indeed. That's why we actually	
25	put it in the executive summary, because it stumped a lot of	

1	people.	
2	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: All right. Board Member	
3	Maxwell.	
4	VICE CHAIRMAN MAXWELL: Thank you, Madam Chair.	
5	And I appreciate Member Searle's support. I fully agree. I-10	
6	is always an issue through all of District 2 (inaudible) needs	
7	to continue, because it impacts the other districts around it.	
8	Just a general comment. I think it's real	
9	critical as we look forward to executing the I-10 between	
10	Phoenix and Tucson construction projects, because they're all	
11	starting to bunch up, and looks like we're going to have two or	
12	three at one time going on. That will definitely change the	
13	traffic flow.	
14	I don't know if we've ever thought about, you	
15	know, showing these individual (inaudible) you don't need to go	
16	to the (inaudible) the District 2 slide there shows no	
17	expansion. Obviously, there's expansion going on (inaudible).	
18	I think sometimes the importance of regional funding, especially	
19	for other districts to consider, and I know it's hard because	
20	it's multiple counties, but it does have a big thing, and	
21	there's no expansion if you go to the projects that are actually	
22	being done, there is some expansion being done in District 2.	
23	But the slide I'd like to talk about today is, is	
24	the one that you showed in priorities (inaudible) P2P	
25	(inaudible) showed there, 347 down there, number nine. And I	

1	guess the reason I'd like to go to it is because there's no cost
2	associated with the with the even the design (inaudible)
3	scoping, is that to say those are complete? (inaudible) it's
4	just a matter of getting the funding for construction on SR 347,
5	or does the total design and scoping cost estimates, because
6	it's just not high enough on the list, you haven't put
7	(inaudible)?
8	DIRECTOR TOTH: So Chairman and Chairwoman
9	Madam Chair sorry (inaudible) and Board Member Maxwell,
10	that's correct. So the project is currently under design, and
11	as we as Iqbal had indicated, the earliest that it would be
12	available for construction would be in the 2027 time frame.
13	VICE CHAIRMAN MAXWELL: And, Director, is that
14	due to the design process, it's not able to be ready until 2026?
15	DIRECTOR TOTH: Correct. It's in design and
16	clearance processes right now.
17	VICE CHAIRMAN MAXWELL: All right. That thing
18	would be something I'd like to learn more about as well, if
19	you've got some designs on projects like that going, how it gets
20	down there as number nine versus some of the other ranks, and
21	I'm sure there's multiple things that play into that. It would
22	be good to learn even more of those issues, but other than that,
23	I have no other comments. Thank you, Madam Chair.
24	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Thank you, Vice Chair
25	Maxwell.

1 I -- just tacking onto this, and I have a couple 2 of questions as well. One of the things that has ever -- always been frustrating for me with government, period, is that when 3 our process is not clearly outlined, as far as what gives points 4 to priority, that's specific. We do this in RFPs. We do this 5 in all sorts of things. We must have a very clear process to 6 7 success when it comes to prioritization. 8 So I would love it at our Surprise board meeting

9 on the 21st if we could please have a presentation on what goes 10 in specific factors and points for you, because what we want to 11 make sure people understand is that this is objective and not 12 necessarily subjective processes, and we can't just say we put 13 it all in a black box and then (inaudible) priorities. We've 14 got to get really specific about what they are and how we get 15 Do you see any challenges with doing that, Director there. 16 Toth?

DIRECTOR TOTH: Madam Chair, no. We know. In fact, I was -- had written that down already from Board Member Maxwell's comments that we will definitely provide that information. We do that periodically with the Board. So that's a good gap update.

CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: I agree and very muchappreciate that.

The other -- you know, we've heard loud and clear that State Route 347 needs to be a priority in our state based

1 on our citizen participation, and that's, I think, really 2 important to all of us at the Board. I love the fact that the City of Maricopa is exploring creative ideas and ways for them 3 to contribute funding. One of the ways that I -- one of the 4 things I want us to be careful of, and I've thought a little bit 5 6 about this since my initial conversations with the City of 7 Maricopa, is we don't want to create a scenario where we have 8 haves and have nots based on bonding capacity within our 9 municipalities.

10 So as much as I appreciate the creativity, and I 11 want to encourage it, and I think it's a great help, and we have 12 to factor that into prioritization, I don't think it can be the 13 key priority or key metric to prioritization, because what we'll 14 end up inadvertently doing is small municipalities and/or 15 counties that don't have the same leverage or bonding capacity 16 would be left behind if that becomes one of the critical 17 factors. So I want to acknowledge it, and I would love to have 18 it factored in, but I don't have the answer as to how we do that 19 or how much weight that can carry through the process.

This is -- as we get to the -- and District 1, as the region is actually continuing to expand, we're getting into what we some have at one point called the outskirts of the region or the county, and that means that we're now overlapping with other counties, and there's additional coordination and funding mechanisms that need to come into play. And so I think we're going to run into this more and more as -- over the next probably ten years, as areas like Buckeye continue to explode, as areas like Queen Creek and Maricopa and other communities that have historically been sort of on the fringes of the county or the region and now are becoming population centers in and of themselves, or in many cases, already have become population centers.

8 So just something that I would like to just flag 9 and just have us be aware of as we continue to prioritize 10 different projects. I'm very, very supportive of State 11 Route 347 becoming more of a priority, particularly from the 12 safety standpoint, but again, until we get the presentation, I 13 think, from our staff at ADOT on how these priorities are 14 ranked, I'd like us to make sure that we're factoring things 15 competitively.

One other thing I wanted to just bring up on the Maricopa County (inaudible). The slide isn't numbered, but it's the Maricopa County non-interstate projects slide.

19MR. ROEHRICH: We didn't present those.

DIRECTOR TOTH: Yeah.

20

MR. ROEHRICH: Yeah.

DIRECTOR TOTH: Madam Chair, at MAG's request, since they are building their program now, it was our intent to hide those slides. I apologize that they got included in the materials that were provided to you, but we're happy to answer

1 any questions you have offline. 2 CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: So my question actually is just actually how we're describing these. Some of these say 3 303 L, the Loop 303. Some of them say SR-30. Some of them just 4 5 say 30. Is the intention -- like, is that -- is that on 6 purpose? 7 DIRECTOR TOTH: It is a function of how they are 8 described, either in MAG's TIP or in our STIP, and we will be 9 happy to conform all of those. 10 CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Okay. Thank you. I just 11 wanted to make sure I wasn't missing maybe a nuance between a 12 segment of SR-30 versus 30 or something. DIRECTOR TOTH: We do use different conventions 13 14 between the two entities. 15 CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Uh-huh. 16 DIRECTOR TOTH: So it can lead to things getting 17 a little misaligned there. 18 CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS. Yeah. Anything you can do 19 to streamline that, because I would imagine the general public, 20 when they review the materials, may have some of the same 21 questions, although they may not. 22 I think for right now, that's the extent of my 23 questions. I want us to continue to get -- and I know Board 24 Member Howard asked at our last board meeting if we could have a 25 presentation, a full presentation on 347 in the coming weeks,

1	and I assured her that I would continue to ask for that or	
2	ensure that it ends up on our agenda for the 21st. Is that	
3	possible as well, Director Toth?	
4	DIRECTOR TOTH: Madam Chair, yes. We can do	
5	that.	
6	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Okay. Thank you.	
7	And is there any other additional sort of deep	
8	dive that our board members would like to have on any	
9	additional projects that could be identified individually for	
10	a presentation?	
11	MR. ELTERS: Madam Chair.	
12	CHAIRWOMAN DANIELS: Yes.	
13	MR. ELTERS: If just a quick question, and	
14	just to piggyback off of the other comments regarding SR-347	
15	and other comments from other board members. The way I	
16	understood the presentation specific to 347 today was that it	
17	is in two counties, with the overall need being 235 million,	
18	and I'm reflecting on what the City of Maricopa is thinking in	
19	the way of (inaudible) approach and, you know, outside the box	
20	and trying to understand what is needed.	
21	So what I understood from the presentation is	
22	235 need, and then there's a certain amount Maricopa	
23	(inaudible) and when it's all said and done, it leaves a gap of	
24	\$42 million. Am I understanding it correctly that that is the	
25	(inaudible) 235 million minutes the 42 is now (inaudible) Pinal,	

1	and that is \$42 million?
2	DIRECTOR TOTH: Madam Chair, Mr. Elters, you

And the longer 11 I've been involved in transportation, both from a practical 12 standpoint and then from a philosophical policy standpoint, 13 the more it feels like that game of "Concentration" that was 14 popular when I was a kid, where you have that board, and you 15 have all those little pieces that you have to fit, and the 16 clock is ticking, and you just feel like if you don't get them 17 all in the right place at the right time, the whole board will 18 explode again, and then you have to try again.

So I don't know if that gives a visual for the republic as far as what the ADOT staff is working with here, but we're all under a pretty strict timeline and trying to get all those pieces to fit in at just the right place and at just the right time to ensure that the system continues to advance. So thank you for all the work that you all are doing and for fielding all of our questions today.

Every six to ten years, Clarkdale's roads and streets receive crack, chip, and fog seal treatments at a cost of \$10.50 per square yard, funded through Highway User Revenue Funds. Complementing this long-term strategy, the Town conducts semi-annual street sweeping and brush control efforts, ensuring the continued safety and aesthetics of Town roads and streets, which are supported by Vehicle License Tax funds.

Northern Arizona Council of Governments (NACOG) is pleased to inform you that the *Luke Lane Dirt to Pavement Project with Broadway Street Pedestrian Connectivity* project will be included in the 2024 Regional Priority Projects List (RPPL). NACOG's Transportation Technical Subcommittee (TSC) voted to approve the 2024 RPPL at their August 7th meeting and Regional Council voted to approve the list at their August 22nd meeting.

The 2024 RPPL includes most of the projects that were listed in the 2023 RPPL, along with some new additions from the 2024 Call for Projects. All jurisdictions have updated their project cost estimates for 2024 to reflect current costs and trends, while NACOG made minor updates to project titles and descriptions to better frame the projects as widely beneficial to northern Arizona.

In October and November, NACOG will arrange meetings with the legislative delegations (senators and representatives) from Districts 1, 6 and 7, which encompass the four-county region. Through these meetings, NACOG will further educate legislators about each of the projects in their district and seek input and insights from the legislators on how we can most successfully advocate for project funding in 2025.

State legislators have asked for confirmation that local jurisdictions are prepared to follow through on both the implementation and local match commitment for their projects. In response, NACOG is once again using the enclosed Commitment Form for **authorization by jurisdiction management (town, city or county manager) or top elected official (chair of board or mayor) to demonstrate firm commitment to the project and local match.**

Any discussion of edits/changes to project titles, local match amounts, or schedule should be discussed with the NACOG planning team prior to signing and returning this form. Signed return of this form indicates that project details are agreed upon as written. The completed Commitment Form is **due on Friday, September 13th, 2024.**

Project Narrative

Project Description and Timeline – Improvements

Nature of the Highway or Roadway Improvements: The City is requesting funding in the amount of \$345,240.00 for the construction of a new asphalt-paved road that will provide critical access to undeveloped sites near Interstate 8 and Avenue 4E. The roadway improvements are designed to enhance accessibility to these previously underutilized areas, unlocking significant economic development opportunities. The roadway will connect directly to the City's existing arterial roadway system, ensuring seamless access to major transportation routes, and facilitating the movement of goods and services to and from the region.

Anticipated Economic Development Benefit: This infrastructure project is expected to play a vital role in spurring local economic growth. The newly constructed road will serve as a primary access point for a proposed "demonstration-scale" biomass processing facility, which will generate approximately 40 new jobs, with an average base wage of \$82,500 per year. Additionally, the project is projected to attract \$113 million in capital investment to the region. The improved infrastructure will also enhance the area's potential for future investment by making it more accessible and attractive to other businesses. The overall economic impact includes job creation, increased tax revenue, and the stimulation of local industries, particularly in the renewable energy and manufacturing sectors.

Party or Parties Performing the Construction or Reconstruction: The roadway construction will be managed by the **City of Yuma**, with extensive experience in infrastructure projects of this scale. The City of Yuma will oversee all aspects of the project, including site preparation, road paving, and the installation of necessary signage and safety features. Local subcontractors specializing in utilities, drainage systems, and environmental compliance will also be involved in the execution of the furthering project after the city completes the road pavement.

Intended Uses of ESP Funds: The **ESP funds** will be used specifically to support the construction of the **asphalt-paved road**, which is integral to facilitating access to the proposed biomass processing facility and surrounding development sites. Funds will cover costs for removal and disposal of AC and concrete, finish and install 3" AC over 10" ABC, furnish and install 1-" sewer line and manholes, F&I 12" WL and components per plan and a border curb.

Specific Information Required Under Section 1.4: Under **Section 1.4**, The project will adhere to the **[local, state, or federal] transportation and safety standards** to ensure a safe and efficient roadway for all users, including provisions for future expansion or modifications as needed.

Timeline for Completion of the Improvements: The construction of the roadway is expected to be completed within **3 months**.

Amount of Cash Match Contribution: The City of Yuma will provide a cash match of \$38,360.00, which will go towards eligible ESP project costs. This contribution will meet the required 10% cash match for the project, ensuring that the total contribution is well within the necessary guidelines for the ESP grant. The cash match will be drawn from the City's General Fund, a stable and secure funding source that is already earmarked for this specific purpose.

Timing of the Cash Match: The \$38,360.00 cash match will be provided throughout the grant reimbursement process as required.

Intended Use of the Cash Match: The cash match will be specifically used for the eligible ESP project costs, which covers the costs associated with grading and paving, wet utilities installation and border curbing.

Sources of the Cash Match: The City of Yuma is the sole entity responsible for providing the entire \$38,360.00 cash match. The contribution will come directly from the City's General Fund, which has been designated for infrastructure projects such as this one. No other external sources are contributing to this match.

Nature of the Commitment: The City of Yuma is fully committed to providing the \$38,360.00 cash match, and this commitment is formalized through an internal resolution that guarantees the funds will be allocated for this project. The match commitment is binding in all circumstances, and the funds are available immediately upon approval of the grant application. The city has demonstrated its ongoing dedication to this infrastructure project and is prepared to move forward regardless of the outcome of other funding opportunities.

Impact of ESP Funding on Project Timeline and Effectiveness: Without the support of the **ESP funding**, the proposed project would face significant delays or may not proceed at all due to lack of available resources. The City's **General Fund** can only support the design phase of the project, and without the grant, the construction phase would be unable to begin. Efforts to obtain funding from other sources, such as private investors and federal infrastructure programs, have been pursued but have not yet been successful or sufficient to fully fund the construction phase. The ESP funding is essential to ensuring the timely completion of the roadway improvements and the biomass facility, which will significantly advance the objectives of economic development, job creation, and sustainable infrastructure in the region.

The proposed project is a **demonstration-scale biomass processing facility** that will utilize innovative, sustainable technology for the production of **natural non-wood pulp fiber** and **natural liquid plant extract products**. The facility will focus on utilizing **renewable plant materials** sourced from nearby locations in the Southwest. The goal of the project is to establish a model for sustainable and environmentally friendly production methods, making a significant impact on the local economy and the global shift towards more sustainable industries.

Development Plans and Impact

- **Types of Businesses Benefited**: The proposed facility will directly benefit businesses involved in **biomass processing**, **renewable energy**, and **sustainable agriculture**. These businesses will experience improved access to the facility for transportation of raw materials and products, leading to reduced shipping times and costs. Indirectly, businesses in sectors such as **manufacturing**, **logistics**, and **construction** will benefit from the infrastructure improvements associated with the project.
- Base Industry Consideration: As the facility will produce biomass pulp fiber and liquid plant extract products, it represents a base industry, particularly in the renewable materials sector. These products will be sold to various industries that rely on natural, sustainable raw materials, such as textiles, packaging, and other environmentally conscious manufacturing sectors.

Capital Investment and Job Creation/Retention

- Capital Investment Projections:
 - One-Year Projection: The initial phase of the facility's construction and equipment installation will require significant investment. This will include the construction of a 45,000 sq ft building, installation of processing equipment, storage tanks, and outdoor transformers, and establishment of boilers, air handling systems, and laboratories. Based on current estimates, the anticipated capital investment in the first year is expected to be in the range of \$37 million.
 - **Three-Year Projection**: By the third year, after full establishment and ramp-up of operations, additional investments will be made in expanding the facility's capabilities, particularly with the potential addition of a **dryer facility**. The anticipated investment over this period is expected to be **\$113 million**. The continued development and scaling up of operations will create further value and opportunities in the region.
- Job Creation and Retention:
 - One-Year Job Projection: Upon completion of the facility, the project is expected to create 23 direct jobs within the first year. This will include positions in operations, research and development, administration, and maintenance. Jobs will be offered with competitive wages in line with industry standards for these roles. Estimated wages are \$82,500 per year.
 - Three-Year Job Projection: By year three, with the ramp-up in production and potential for expansion, 17 additional jobs will be created in areas such as **production management, technical support, and sales**. The total number of jobs created or retained will be 40 by the third year. These positions will be expected to provide healthcare benefits, retirement plans, and other standard employee benefits.

Uncertainties and Projections

Since specific businesses have not been finalized at the time of the application, the capital investment and job creation figures provided above are based on industry averages and assumptions derived from similar-scale biomass facilities. The anticipated investments are based on expert estimates in the **renewable energy** and **biomass processing** sectors.

Certifications and Basis for Projections

Although specific businesses that will directly benefit from the facility are not yet identified, the **capital investment** and **job creation** projections are based on consultations with industry experts, local economic development agencies, and the business plan provided by the project's owners. The **job creation and capital investment projections** will be validated and updated once concrete agreements with specific companies are made.

Job Retention for Economic Stability

Although the primary focus of this project is job creation, it is important to note that the facility will also contribute to the **retention of existing jobs** in industries like **agriculture**, **renewable energy**, and **logistics**. By improving the region's access to transportation networks and providing a facility that supports sustainable practices, the project aims to strengthen the local economy and prevent the loss of jobs in these key sectors.

Timeline for Project and Development

- Year 1: Groundbreaking and construction of the **45,000 sq ft facility**. Installation of process equipment, storage tanks, and outdoor transformers.
- Year 2: Completion of internal operations, including laboratories, office spaces, and workshops. Initial production operations begin.
- Year 3: Full-scale production begins. Expansion of operations, potentially adding a dryer facility. Continued scaling and potential for further job creation and investment.

Conclusion

This biomass processing facility represents a unique opportunity to foster sustainable development in the region. With significant capital investment and job creation projected, this facility will not only serve as a model for future projects but also provide long-term benefits to the local economy, helping to strengthen key industries in renewable energy, agriculture, and manufacturing.
